## RABBI STEVEN MORGEN

Cantor Goldman has introduced a number of new melodies into our Friday night services. One of them is a very lively setting for the last verse in Psalm 99: “*Romemu Adonai Elohenu, v’hishtakhavu l’har kodsho.*” In English, it could be translated as “Elevate Adonai our God and bow toward God’s mountain” (referring to the Temple Mount, of course).

As a song of praise – and especially on Friday nights as we usher in the Sabbath with its promise of rest and restoration – it is fitting that we sing this verse joyfully.

But most of the Psalms are really complex poems, often filled with contradictory emotions, and phrases that are loaded with meaning.

An earlier verse in Psalm 99 notes that Moses, Aaron and the Prophet Samuel each cried out to God, and God answered them. What was on their mind when they each cried out to God? And in what way did God answer them? I hardly paid attention to this verse before. But in thinking about it, I realized that this Psalm may not be so simple. What do we know about the lives of Moses, Aaron and Samuel? Quite a bit, actually, from the Bible. What moments in their lives did the Psalmist have in mind when he wrote this verse?

How does our understanding of this verse affect how we understand the last verse which directs us to “elevate God”? And what does it mean to “elevate God”?

I am delighted that we are bringing back to Beth Yeshurun one of my teachers from JTS this month to help us explore these verses and more. Dr. Robert (“Robbie”) Harris will be joining us for the Shabbat of February 17-18. Dr. Harris is a Bible professor and on Friday night at our services he will look at these verses from Psalm 99.

On Saturday at lunch time, Rabbi Harris will explore the fractured world in which the Prophet Jeremiah lived. It was a time of mortal danger for the Jewish people. A powerful enemy – the Babylonian Empire – threatened our destruction. And the Judeans themselves were caught in a bitter struggle between competing political factions. Can Jeremiah’s message give us a vision for faith and hope for a better future?

That Saturday night, Daniel and Karol Musher will host an informal gathering with Rabbi Harris at their home.

This should be an engaging, uplifting and enlightening weekend.

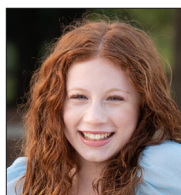
