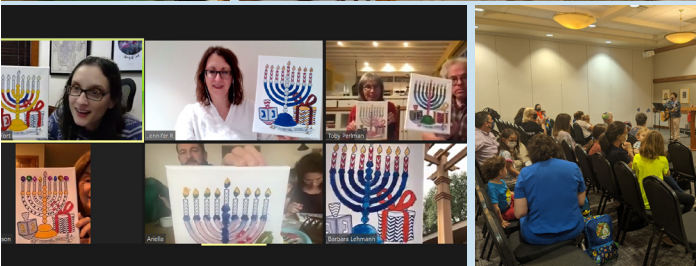

**MESSAGE FROM JENNIFER ROSENZWEIG,
PROGRAM DIRECTOR**

Most of our congregation is aware of our Executive Committee and Board of Trustees and the roles that they play in our synagogue operations. For many, our committee system is more of a mystery: What committees are there? Who can be on a committee? What kind of commitment do they require? What do they actually do?

There are two types of committees and both offer the opportunity for congregants to get involved in their areas of interest and expertise. The first type of committee is the Standing Committee. These committees are defined by the by-laws of the synagogue; led by a member of the Board; and report regularly at Board meetings. Some examples are Budget, Security, and Investment. Ad hoc committees are formed as needed and may meet on an ongoing basis or for a specific purpose. They do not necessary report to the Board. Many of these are focused on a specific area of programming, such as the YES Group or Gathering Place.

As we begin the new calendar year, we want to open up the opportunity for more congregants to participate in our committees, especially the Ad Hoc ones. We are creating several new committees that will focus on programming for specific constituencies - 100 Jewish Men, Baby Boomers, Young Professionals, and Young Families - as well as committees for Adult Education, Chesed (*Senior Outreach*), and COFI (*Congregants of First Impression*). For these committees we envision meeting a few times a year to brainstorm programming ideas and strategize outreach to both members and non-members. The feedback from these committees will become an integral part of the programs and volunteer opportunities that we plan for the coming year.

On our website we have given you an overview of what committees we currently have and each of their missions. On that page you can complete a quick form to show your interest in one of our committees. We hope that you will consider getting involved, sharing your expertise and ideas, and being part of Beth Yeshurun's leadership.

The city has made a permanent change in Allen Parkway that prevents turning left into the Beth Yeshurun Allen Parkway cemetery.

If you are driving east on Allen Parkway (toward downtown) continue on Allen Parkway past the cemetery and exit Allen Parkway to the right at Waugh Drive. Just before you reach the light at Waugh Drive, make a U-turn to get onto the lanes of Allen Parkway going west. When you reach the entrance to the cemetery turn right into the cemetery.

Another approach would be to drive east (toward downtown) on Memorial Drive. Take the Waugh Drive exit from Memorial and turn right at Waugh Drive and go over Buffalo Bayou and immediately turn right onto Allen Parkway. From there turn right into the cemetery.

The Post Oak and Allen Parkway cemeteries are open Sunday through Friday from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm. They are closed every Saturday in addition to the following Jewish holidays:

2K22 MLK Grande Parade

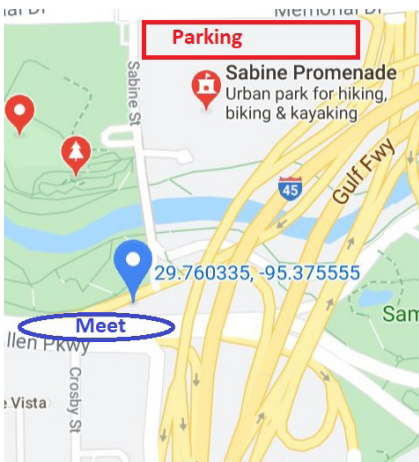

IMPORTANT NOTES for getting into the parade staging area



1. In order to assure you'll be allowed into the staging area arrive between 8:30 and 9:00AM, but no later the 9:15AM. Earlier is better. Staging area is on Allen Pkwy between Sabine and Taft.

2. Look for the Israel flag. Our group number will be shared once available.

3. Carpooling is strongly encouraged.

4. Dress appropriate for weather - wearing blue and white if possible.

Parallel Stories in the Bible with Gabi Gelman a 4-Part series beginning Monday, January 3rd at 7:00PM



What do the stories of Noah and Jonah have in common? What about Joseph and Esther? Hannah and Ruth? Join us for a 4-part series exploring how some stories in the bible seem to echo earlier stories and discuss what these parallels teach can teach us.

The Other Ellis Island: Jewish Immigration Through Galveston, 1907-1914 with Dr. Josh Furman Sunday, January 9th at 11:00AM



In the years before World War I, almost 10,000 Jewish immigrants came to the United States through the port at Galveston, rather than Ellis Island. From there, they fanned out across Texas and dozens of cities towns in the South and Midwest. This presentation will explore the history of the Galveston Movement, the goals of the organizers, and the legacy of the project. We will also get to read (in translation) the advertising pamphlet that was used to recruit Yiddish-speaking Jews to make the trip to Texas in 1907!



SCHOLAR-IN-RESIDENCE - JOSHUA KULP - FEBRUARY 18-20, 2022

Joshua Kulp is the Rosh Yeshiva at the Conservative Yeshiva in Jerusalem. Josh was born in New York City, grew up in Margate, New Jersey and attended college at the University of Michigan. In 1994 he moved to Israel and in 1995 he founded the Conservative Yeshiva where he has been teaching ever since. He is the author of two books, The Schechter Haggadah and Reconstructing the Talmud. He is the author of the Mishnah Yomit English commentary on the entire Mishnah and the Daf Shevui commentary on the Talmud, which so far covers Sukkah, Megillah and the beginning of Ketubot. Josh lives with his wife and children in Modiin.
