WHY HAS ANTISEMITISM INCREASED ON COLLEGE CAMPUSES AND WHAT CAN WE DO ABOUT IT? BY RABBI BRIAN STRAUSS

In the aftermath of the tragic events on October 7th, why is antisemitism on the rise, especially on college campuses?

College campuses, traditionally seen as bastions of tolerance, are now grappling with an epidemic of Jew-hatred. Examples abound, from faculty at elite universities labeling Israel an apartheid state to the disturbing apathy of university administrators in the face of aggressive anti-Israel actions.

In a recent ADL survey, nearly three-quarters — 73% — of Jewish students and 44 percent of non-Jewish students said they had experienced or witnessed antisemitism since the start of this school year. In a 2021 survey, about a third of Jewish students reported experiencing antisemitism personally, and another third reported witnessing antisemitism not directed at them. Most Jewish students — 77% — and 67% of non-Jewish students felt their colleges were not doing enough to combat antisemitism.

The roots of this disturbing trend can be traced to a broader ideological shift on campuses, where a simplistic narrative of oppressors and oppressed has taken hold. Jews, perceived as part of the oppressor side, find themselves targeted and demonized. The Jewish presence in Israel is claimed to be “settler colonialism.” Jews become the worst of all villains. This distorted lens leads to the celebration of heinous acts such as the October 7th massacre.

What can you and I do to help? The recent rally in Washington, D.C., where 300,000 Jews and friends of Israel united, demonstrates the power of collective action. Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel’s words echo the sentiment, “The opposite of goodness is not evil. The opposite of goodness is silence.” The one choice that is not acceptable during this challenging time is to do nothing.

We can hold universities accountable for their actions or inactions, demand equal treatment for antisemitism, and consider sending our children to alternative institutions that actively combat Jew-hatred. We can also demand the defunding of campus groups that violate codes of conduct. We should also consider stopping any funding we give to universities that don’t do enough to protect pro-Israel students.

As we navigate these challenging times, it is crucial to recognize that an anti-Zionist is, indeed, an anti-Semite. I urge all of us to ensure our student’s safety, demand accountability, and take meaningful action against the rising tide of hatred. Silence is not an option, especially when it comes to our children. Each one of us has the power to make a difference.

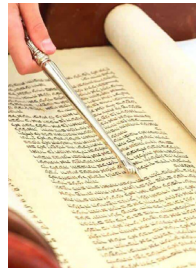

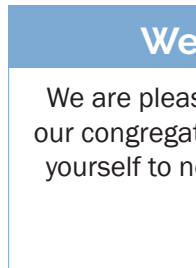

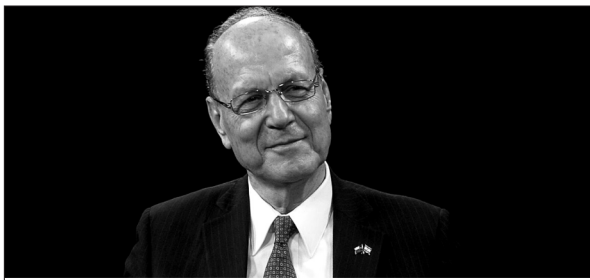

Voted one of the top 10 comedians in New York City by The Hollywood Reporter, Modi is one of the comedy circuit's most sought after performers. Featured on HBO, CBS, NBC, ABC, Comedy Central, Howard Stern, and E! Entertainment, Modi has received rave reviews in The New York Times, Time Out NY and The New York Post.

Born in Tel Aviv, Israel, Modi emigrated with his family to the United States at the age of seven and was raised on Long Island. After graduating from Boston University, he worked as an investment banker until his first open-mic night made him realize that stand-up was his true calling. Equipped with a sharp wit and a knack for reading an audience, Modi has gone on to become a successful fixture in New York's vibrant comedy scene, often doing bits that incorporate his heritage, and he is a hit with diverse Jewish audiences as well as fans of all backgrounds and beliefs.

Now a regular performer at the New York and Los Angeles comedy clubs, Modi also headlines around the country and across the globe. He is a co-founder of *The Chosen Comedy Festival*, a celebration of Jewish humor that was launched 2022. The festival features diverse comedy acts and has brought laughter to thousands of people in NYC, Miami, Los Angeles, and more.

Modi has played himself on HBO's *Crashing* and Netflix's *When Jews Were Funny*. He's also appeared in several feature films and played leading roles in two: *Waiting for Woody Allen*, which won the LA Film Festival, and *Stand Up*, a feature-length film. In 2018, Mayor Bill De Blasio declared June 26th 'Mordechi Modi Rosenfeld Day' in the city of New York for his accomplishments and contributions to the artistic community.
