Speaking of the kids, I would be remiss if I didn't mention specifically how fun the youth of CBY is. Really, if you think Friday night services are a party, you should check out Friday morning services with the Day school (next year, though. Remember it's June.) It has been my not-so-secret goal to transform davening experiences in both our religious and day schools into times that students consider highlights, and we are making serious headway. Our kids are slowly learning to master the art of "communal vibing" and how to bring their happiness and joy to the spiritual potluck that is community prayer. And let me also make this very clear: they NAIL their choreography.

As Rabbi Strauss and I prepare to go to Israel and bring a bit of our *communal vibing* into the Holy Land, I could not be more excited that this is the community I get to co-lead. I cannot wait to see what new melodies and teachings we get to bring back to Houston and share with everyone. So, thank you Beth Yeshurun for bringing the party. Let's keep it up!

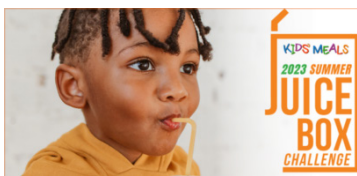

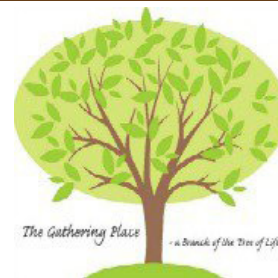
