BOWIE KALLAH: A DIFFERENT SHABBAT EXPERIENCEBY CANTOR RACHEL GOLDMAN

Before anyone walks into the Barg sanctuary for Shabbat services on March 3rd and thinks what in the Bon Jovi is going on here, let me share four things you should know about me. First, I will do just about anything I possibly can to get the words of our t'fillah on the lips of our children. It's a mitzvah. Second, I feel deeply that we come to the spaces of our sanctuaries to vibe. In seeking a bit of shalom from the craziness of our weeks, we breathe together, we hear each other, we listen to each other, we share

an energy. During Shabbat, I feel our services should always also exude a spirit of joy as part of this energy. Second, as we are all also on our own personal Jewish journeys, I fully encourage a *well-rounded* davening experience throughout everyone's lifetime. Third, I really love LOVE Purim. I especially love that it is a holiday that fully embraces completely turning everything upside-down. Also, it's centered around dressing according to a theme, so count me IN.

That being said, let me tell y'all a little bit about the adventure I'm about to take Congregation Beth Yeshurun on for an hour-ish. As a lead-in to the weekend of Purim, we decided to turn things upside down for Shabbat and really crank up the joy factor—and, most likely, the volume as well. Aside from a few standards that I kept off-limits (it will occasionally still feel 'normal'), almost all of the liturgy that Friday night will not be set to their usual melodies. Instead, they will be set to classic rock songs. Yes, I'm serious. Yes, I promise it will be fun. We are leaning hard into this musical genre for the night without deleting a single word of Hebrew. If you are expecting an inside-the-box prayer experience that Friday night in the main sanctuary service, I'm sorry to say that I will have blown up the box in the main sanctuary for one night. Our traditional minyanim are still available, don't worry...and the "box" will be re-assembled by the next morning, I give you all my word.

Though our final song selections are a secret, I can say this: there are good rock songs, there are great rock songs, and then there are iconic rock songs—the ones you can recognize from the first four notes. Since we are going for joy turned up, I aimed for all songs in the iconic category. This way, if the Hebrew words are already on your lips, you'll most likely be able to sing along with just a prayer book. I added some fun English words along the way too but promise you won't be lost in the service. Both our day school and religious school students have been practicing some select prayers with me for months now. This also means that, if you really want to know a few of the songs, you *might* be able to bribe it out of one of our students.

While various life lessons of adulting are learned through B'nai Mitzvah preparation, I tell all of my B'nai Mitzvah students that the best events during adulting will have dress codes (and then I usually lead into the standard-Bema-attire conversation being no different). Therefore, let's aim for this to be one of those amazing events with a dress code as well! Please feel free to dress with a bit of a rocker edge when you come pray with us that night. Bring out your band shirts, your leather pants and a seatbelt to buckle up, because we are going to have a prayer adventure together. I can't wait to see you there!





Professor Susannah Heschel is the Eli M. Black Distinguished Professor of Jewish Studies at Dartmouth College and Chair of the Jewish Studies Program. Her scholarship focuses on Jewish and Protestant thought during the 19th and 20th centuries, including the history of biblical scholarship, Jewish scholarship on Islam, and the history of anti-Semitism.

She has received four honorary doctorates from universities in the United States, Canada, and Germany. Currently she is a Guggenheim Fellow and is writing a book on the history of European Jewish scholarship on Islam. In 2015 she was elected a member of the American Society for the Study of Religion.

The author of over one hundred articles, she has also edited several books, including Muslims Responses to European Orientalism (with Umar Ryad); Moral Grandeur and Spiritual Audacity: Essays of Abraham Joshua Heschel; Betrayal: German Churches and the Holocaust (with Robert P. Ericksen); Insider/Outsider: American Jews and Multiculturalism (with David Biale and Michael Galchinsky). She serves on the academic advisory council of the Center for Jewish Studies in Berlin and on the Board of Trustees of Trinity College.




