The Message

Even the youngest Jewish child knows that Purim is the holiday of joy! Happiness! Celebration! We eat sweet foods, dress up in crazy costumes, throw parties, and (here at Beth Yeshurun at least) have an amazing, rocking carnival! It's no surprise to anybody that one of the actual commandments of Purim, coming from the Book of Esther itself, is to be joyful. "They were to observe [the holiday of Purim] as days of feasting and merrymaking" (Esther 9:22).

But it's a little odd, no? After all, the holiday of Purim is pretty dark! It's a commemoration of the plan of a genocidal maniac named Haman, to kill all the Jews in Iran because of his own outsized

ego. Not exactly sunny stuff! The only ones who stand in his way are a Jewish man named Mordechai and his niece Hadassah, who changes her name and hides her religion to become Queen Esther to that genocidal maniac's boss, King Ahasuerus. He's a nice king, if a little too freehanded when it comes to his favorite advisor.

And this is the holiday where we're commanded to be happy?

Yet it is. In fact, the entire month of Adar, during which Purim falls, is a season of joy and merrymaking. It's one of the few months of the Jewish calendar with its own saying: *mishenichnas Adar marbin b'simcha* "When the month of Adar arrives, we increase our joy!"

This time of commemorating such a dark period of Jewish history is in fact why we're commanded to be joyful. Joy does not come easy in dark times. Too easily we can become mired in our own despair, unable to see a way out. Even Esther, the heroine of the Purim story, struggles to see beyond her own despondency. When Mordechai urges her to go to King Ahasuerus to appeal Haman's evil decree, she replies, "If any person enters the king's presence without having been summoned, there is but one law for them—death! And I have not been summoned to visit the king for the last thirty days!" (Esther 4:11). Yet she fights her anguish, and saves the Jewish people.

It is an important lesson for us in modern times as well, when being Jewish is perhaps harder than many of us have faced during our lifetimes. Maybe this Adar, this Purim, doesn't feel especially joyful for you. But it is for precisely that reason that we *must* seek joy. Times to celebrate and make merry with friends and family, to be grateful for all the good that is possible in these troubled times. That is why we are commanded so, during Adar to borrow from a famous Hebrew saying: *Simcha*, *simcha tirdof* "Joy, joy shall you pursue." I hope this Adar and this Purim is one of much joy for you and yours, especially now.
