THE LAST PILGRIMAGE BY RABBI SARAH FORT

Who doesn't love a good mnemonic? To celebrate the holiday of Shavuot, the holiday of the giving of the Torah, one need only remember Acharit (אחרית), which means "last" in Hebrew, Shavuot being the last of the pilgrimage holidays.

First is the alef, which stands for אקדמות, of Akdamut. This is a beautiful piyyut, written in the 11th century by Rabbi Meir bar Yitzchak, a German rabbi and cantor. Ashkenazi Jews started reading it on

Shavuot in the 15th century. It is a luscious poem, 90 verses long written in Aramaic, describing the majesty of God and the natural world we are blessed with. Truly, it admits to the indescribability of it all. "Were all the skies parchment, and all the reeds pens, and all the oceans ink," the poet sings, "and all who dwell on earth scribes, God's grandeur could not be told."

Next is chet, of \$\pi\n\$, or milk/dairy. We traditionally eat dairy products on Shavuot, though the reasoning is murky. Some say that we refrain from meat as the Torah had not been given yet so rather than chance eating non-kosher meat, we stick to dairy. Others say it is because the Torah describes Israel as a land "flowing with milk and honey." Whatever your reasoning, at the Community Shavuot celebration, hosted this year at Beth Yeshurun, we'll be offering up a tasty cheesecake buffet!

The resh is for תות, Ruth, as we read the book of Ruth at second day Shavuot services. Ruth is the ancestor of King David, whose yahrzeit is traditionally observed on Shavuot. And it's a great story!

For the yud we have ירק, yerek or greenery. We decorate our homes, and sometimes synagogues too, with greenery and flowers. Why? Depends who you ask! The Ashkenazim say it is because Mt. Sinai "sprouted with flowers" in anticipation of the giving of the Torah. Some Eastern Sephardi communities see the Torah as the ketubah between God and the people of Israel, and so decorate a la chuppah. Persian Jews actually refer to Shavuot as , "Moed [Holiday] of Flowers!" Either way, a good excuse to buy yourself a beautiful bouquet or donate to your favorite environmental charity!

Finally there is the most important, the tav of תורה, Torah. We stay up all night (or close enough!) studying Torah and other Jewish subjects, in order to prepare ourselves for the giving of Torah on Shavuot. When I lived in Jerusalem, local yeshivot and learning institutions would be open until dawn. We learned from so many scholars! When morning broke, we walked to the kotel to daven shacharit (pray the morning prayers). It was quite an experience!

All are welcome to join in the Community Shavuot program on Thursday, May 25th from 7:00-11:30_{PM}, hosted this year here at Beth Yeshurun. You'll have an opportunity to learn from so many Houston clergy all in one night, plus enjoy a delicious cheesecake buffet that Moses would be proud of! There's a special track for Young Professionals, as well as a Young Family track for those with smaller children to have their own Shavuot celebration at a more family-friendly time 5:00-6:30_{PM}. Part of the observance for Shavuot, which occurs at the end of May this year, is the celebration of the giving of the Torah to the Israelites. This Torah on display in our Museum is one of the smallest sefer Torahs known to exist; the scroll itself is only 3.5 inches in height. It is a kosher scroll, hand written with a quill pen on parchment, in excellent condition, 19th century.

The Museum is open 10:00am-2:00pm Monday through Thursday; guided tours by appointment. The collection is open to congregants whenever the building is open. For non-members an appointment is required. Various groups, both Jewish and non-Jewish, take advantage of the opportunity to visit the collection each year, and docents can be arranged for groups that wish to use them.


