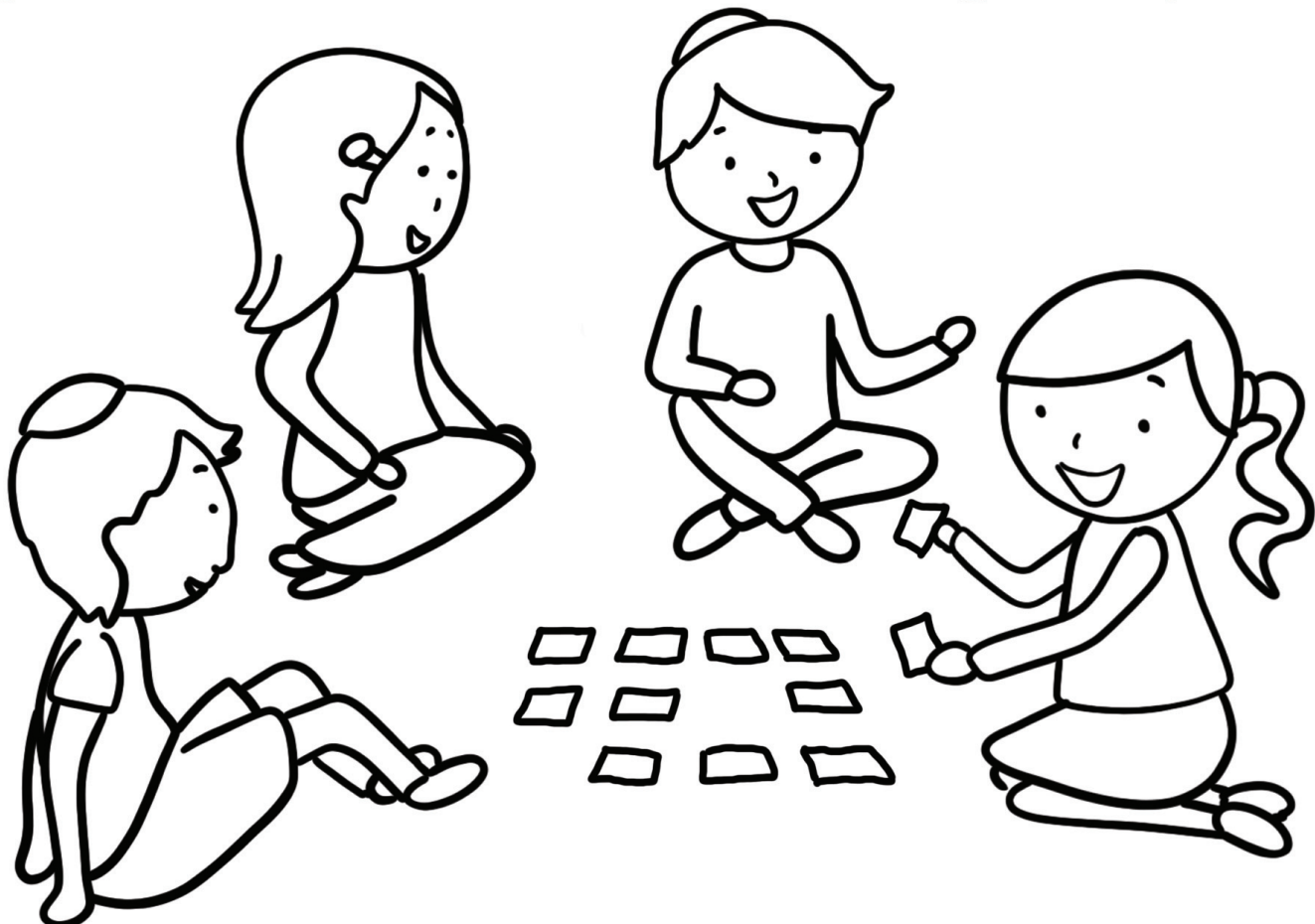

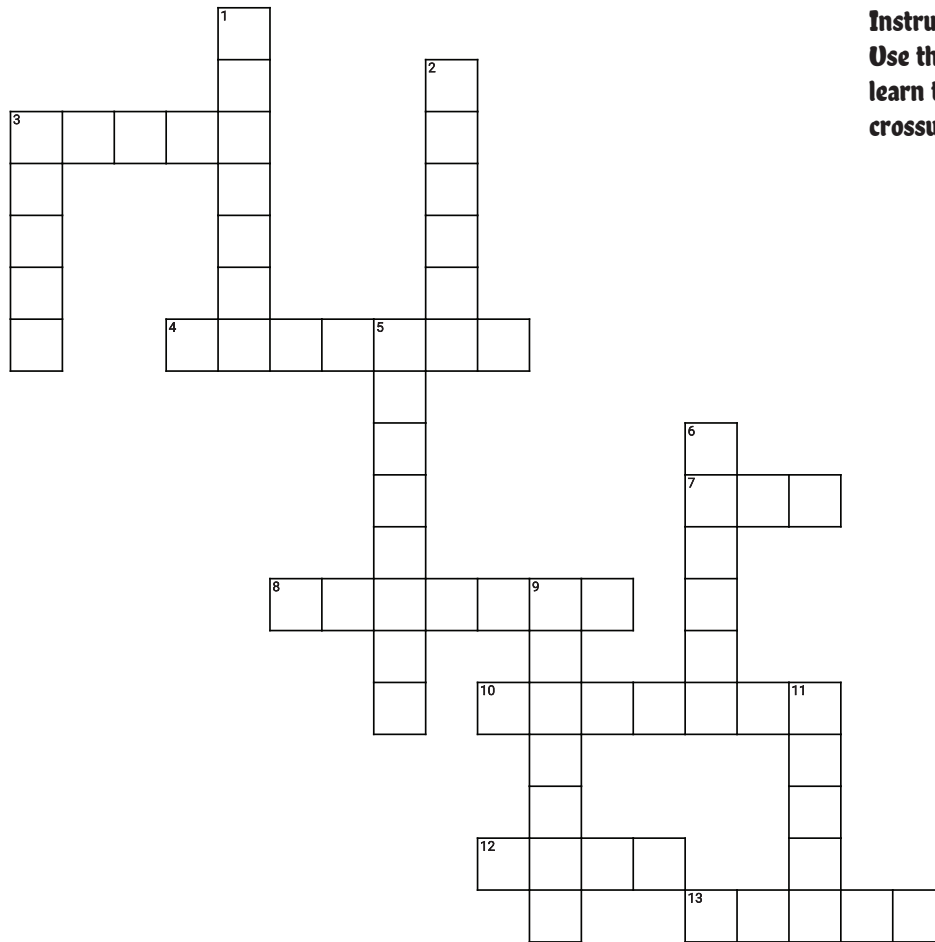

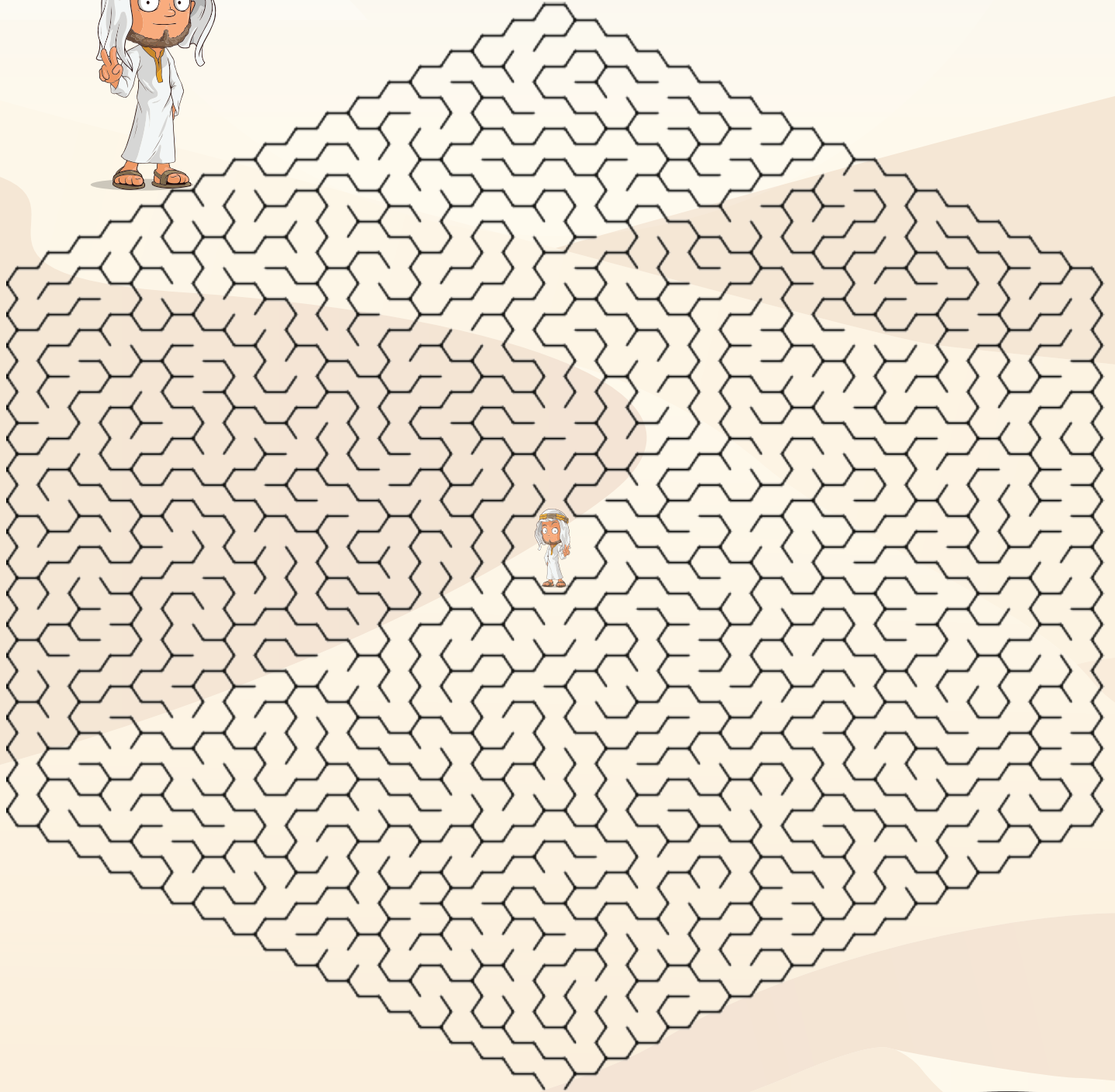

What you'll need:

2 Gallon ziploc bags

1/2 Teaspoon vanilla

2 sandwich bags

1 Tablespoon sugar

1 Cup milk

1/3 cup salt

Ice cubes

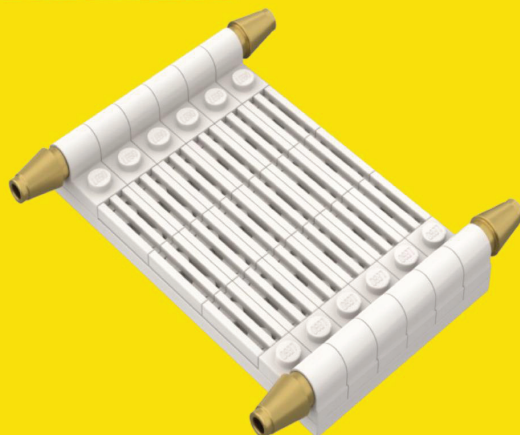
1. In the small sandwich ziplock bag, combine milk, sugar, and vanilla. Push out excess air and seal. Place small sandwich bag into your 2nd sandwich bag (so you don't have any leaks).
2. In the large Gallon bag, combine ice and salt and place it into your extra gallon ziplock bag (so you don't have any leaks)
3. Place your small sandwich bag inside the gallon bag and shake 10- 20 minutes, until ice cream has hardened.
4. Remove small bag from gallon bag, rinse off and enjoy with your favorite ice cream toppings.

No Bake Cheesecake

Recipe taken from

Ingredients:

Crust

- 1/2 cup butter melted
- 1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 tsp kosher salt

Cheesecake

- 2 cups cold heavy whipping cream
- 3 8oz packages cream cheese, room tem
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract

Lightly coat a 9-inch springform pan with nonstick spray. Set aside. In a large bowl evenly combine the butter, graham cracker crumbs, sugar, and salt. Press the mixture firmly into the bottom and up the sides of the prepared pan. Place in the freezer while you prepare the filling.

In the bowl of your stand mixer fitted with the whisk attachment, beat the heavy cream on medium-high speed until stiff peaks form. Remove the whipped cream from the mixing bowl and set aside. In the same mixing bowl, replace the whisk attachment with the paddle attachment. Mix the cream cheese, powdered sugar, and vanilla extract together on medium speed for 2 minutes, or until smooth and creamy, scraping the sides of the bowl as needed. Remove the bowl from the mixer and using a rubber spatula, fold in the whipped cream evenly, making sure to scrape the sides and bottom of the bowl completely. Spread the cheesecake filling into the chilled crust and smooth with an off-set spatula. Cover and chill for 4 hours or overnight.

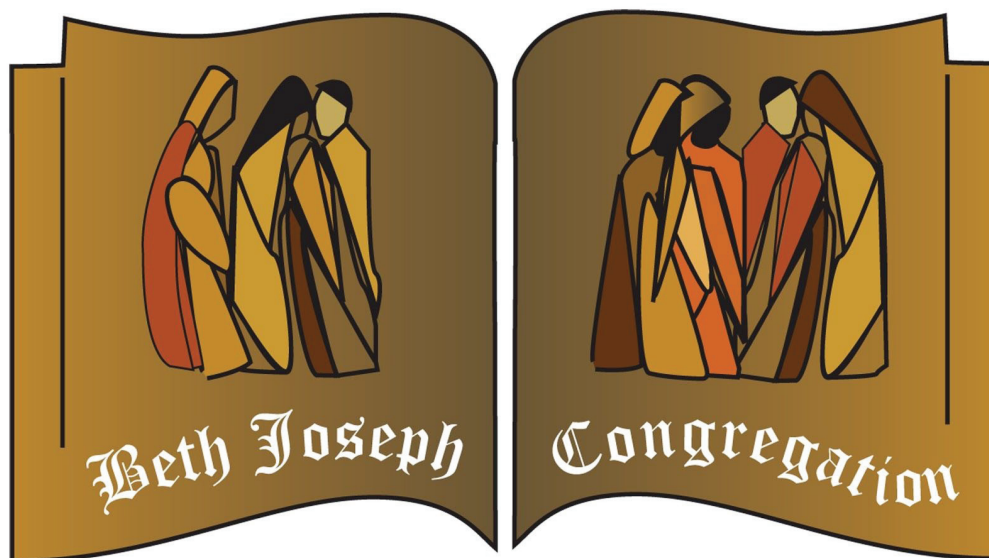

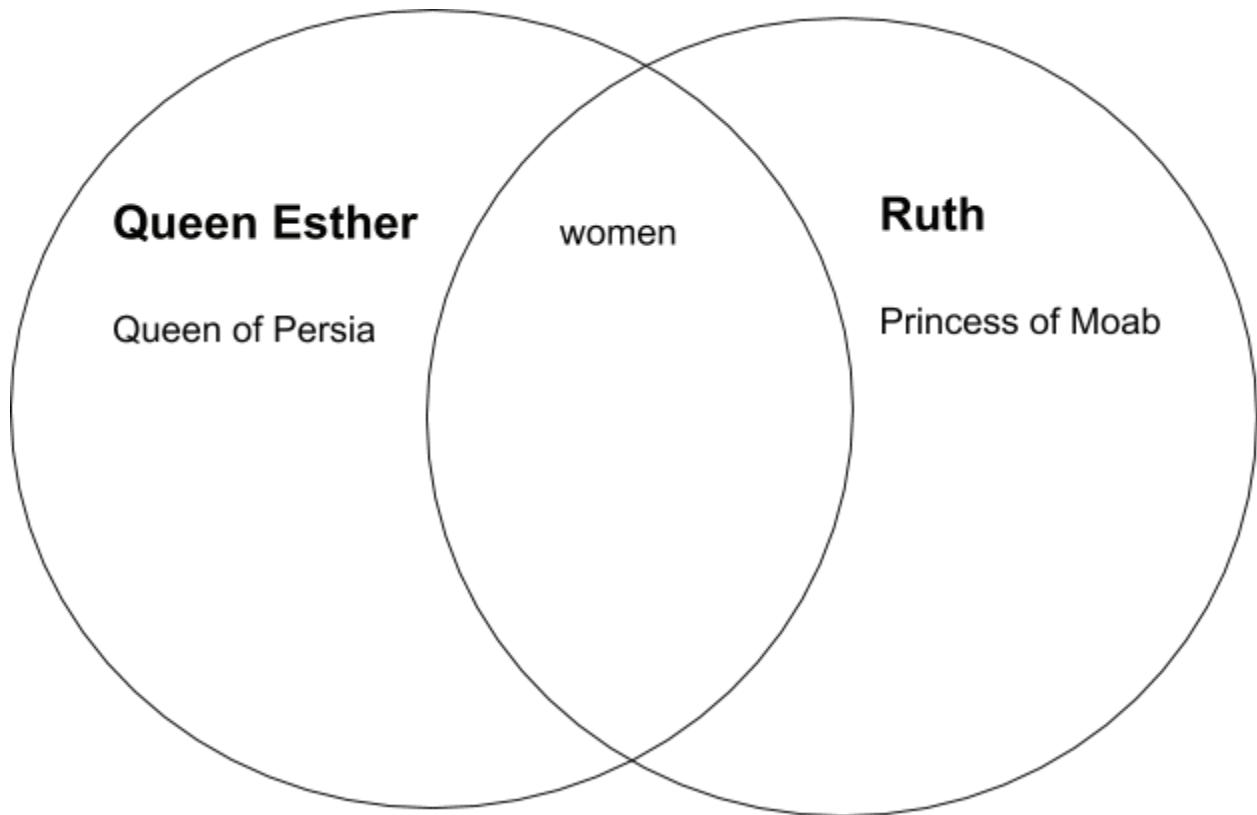

Parents, for those children who are too young to write, perhaps they can draw a picture of Queen Esther and Ruth or something about their stories and dictate to you what they drew or they can attempt to spell, by themselves, some words that describe their picture. (Example: Esther or Ruth, crown, chair, sun)

For the adults in the audience, you can try this exercise for yourselves. It helps plan and organize your thoughts when you have to write something.

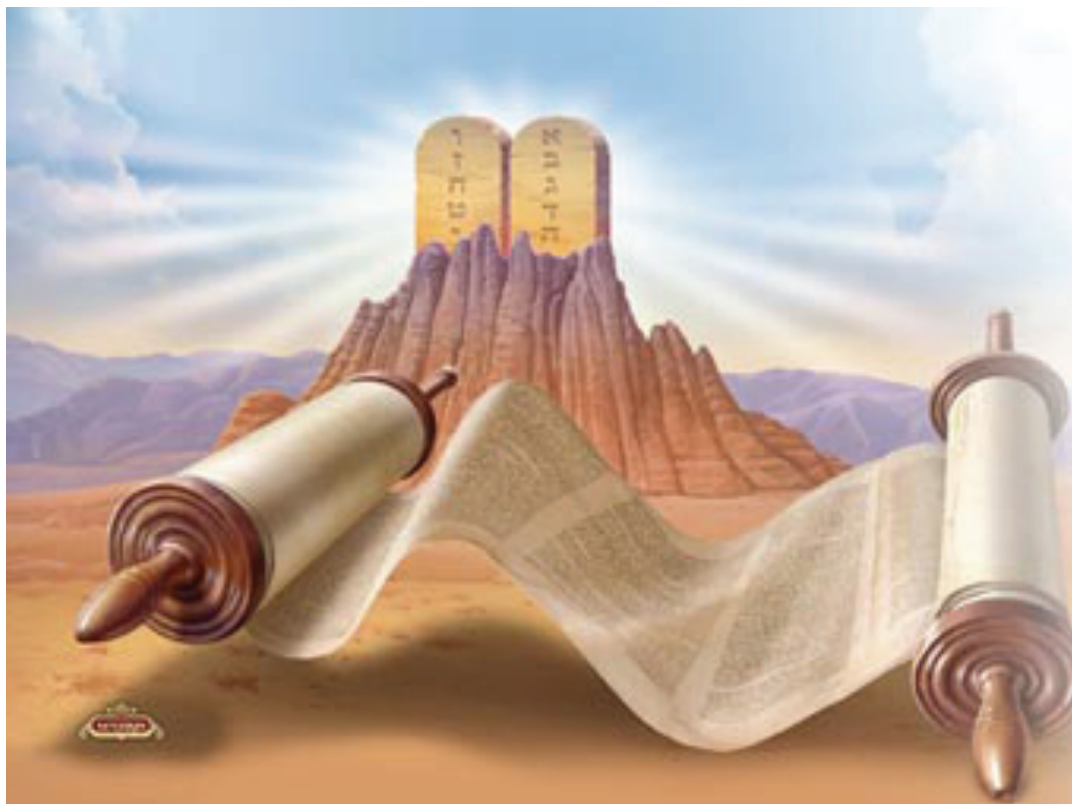

The story of Ruth is the story of kindness and our Torah is a Torah of kindness. Ruth was a convert that accepted the Torah and on Shavuot we all accept the Torah.

2

Ruth the Moabite lived in the time of the Judges before there was a king in Israel. Ruth also means quenched in Hebrew and our sages tell us David quenched G-d's desire for songs and praises.

3

King David (Ruth's great-grandson) was born and died on Shavuot. The story of Ruth also takes place during the wheat harvest which is also the time of Shavuot.

When we reap our harvest and forget an "omer", which is a sheaf of grain, we may not go back to fetch it. We must leave it for the needy.

What is the connection with Shavuot?

Dvar Torah for Kids:

The story is told of Novardok, the great 19th century European yeshiva, where the students were known for their great humility. To reach such levels, they would sit for 30 minutes each morning in the study hall,

rocking back and forth, chanting the mantra, "I am nothing, I am nothing, I am nothing."

One morning, a new student arrived at the yeshiva, and upon entering the study hall, was surprised to find hundreds of students muttering, "I am nothing." He checked the sign outside the door to make sure he had the right place, then figured he might as well join them. After finding an empty seat, he began rocking back and forth, chanting, "I am nothing, I am nothing, I am nothing." Suddenly the student seated next to him turns and says: "The nerve of you! I was here an entire year before I was nothing!"

The Midrash says that when God was preparing to give the Torah, all the mountains stepped forward and declared why they

thought the Torah should be given on them. "I am the highest mountain," said one. "No," said another, "I am the steepest mountain and therefore the Torah should be given on me."

One by one, they all stated their claims. One mountain was prettiest, another was widest. In the end, God chose Mount Sinai - not because it was the tallest or the grandest (it's not, as anyone who's toured the Sinai Desert will attest), but because, says the Midrash, it was the most humble.

We should be humble like Mt Sinai and the students of Novardok, realizing that pride and arrogance stop us from achieving true greatness. Chag Sameach!

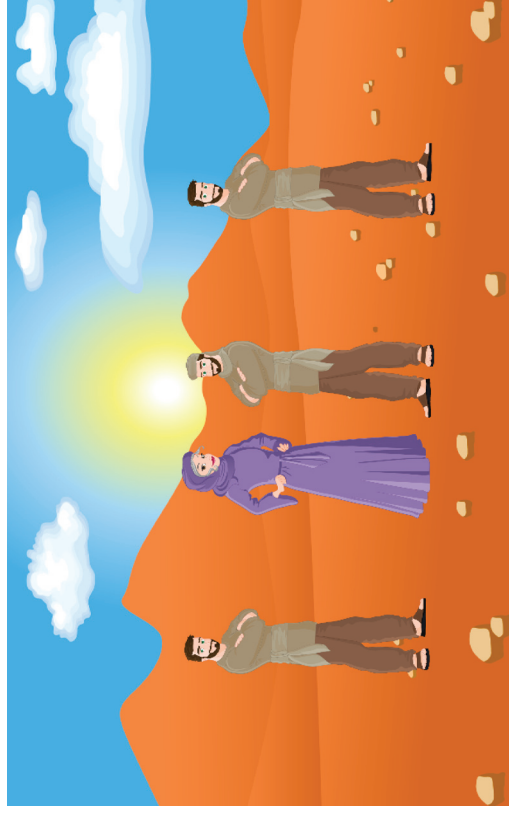

Elimelech felt overwhelmed by the amount of poor people asking him for help so he moved his family to a neighboring country called Moav.



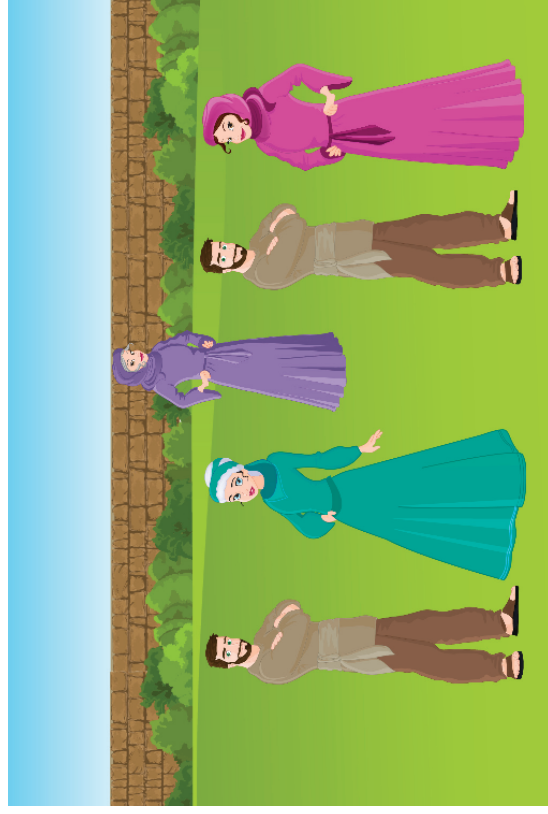

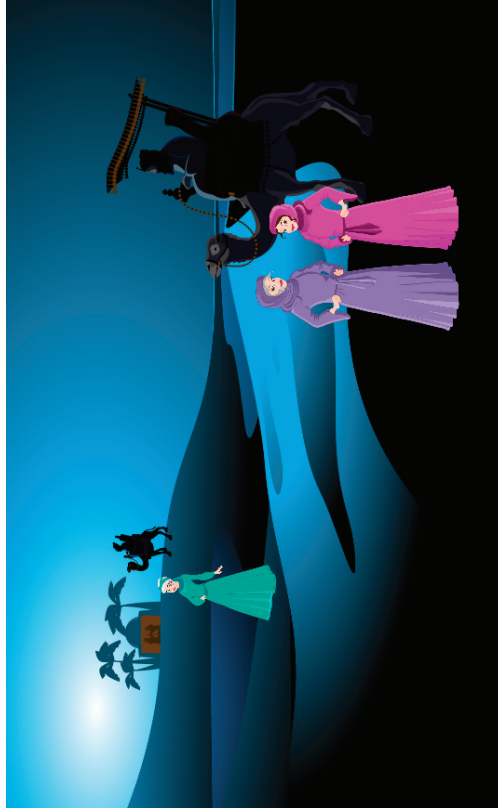

They arrived during Pesach time when farmers were first cutting the barley harvest in the fields. When they got there, the people were amazed to see how lonely and poor Naomi had become.

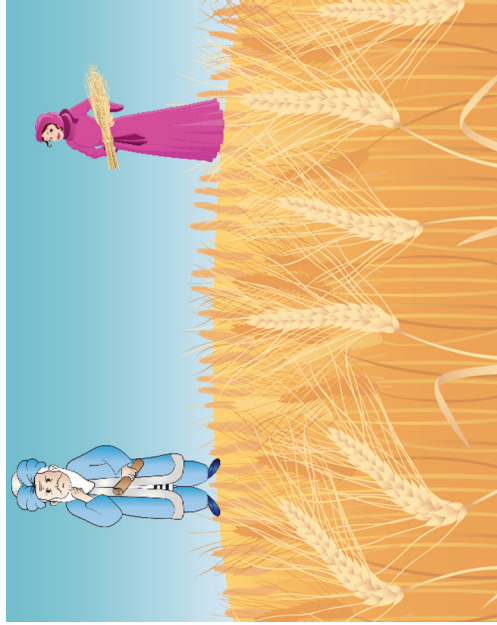

Game Setup: Teams are comprised of two players each, with a minimum of two teams necessary to play. Teammates sit across from each other, and the members of the various teams sit next to each other, all facing their respective teammates.

Please note: You must cut out the Taboo cards **BEFORE** יום טוב!

The cards are put in one large deck. One member from Team A begins by drawing a card from the deck; he will be the 'clue-giver' for this round. Each card has a 'clue-word' on the top of the card, with the taboo words listed below. Clue-givers work to have their teammate say the clue-word without using any of the taboo words. When a teammate successfully guesses the clue-word, that team gets to keep the card. If the clue-giver for Team A accidentally uses a Taboo word, then Team A is penalized and that Taboo card goes to Team B's pile. The same is true if any of the rules listed below are violated.

Gameplay and Scoring: Each clue-giver has 30 seconds per round to get as many cards as possible. Teammates alternate being the clue-giver. Team A begins with their clue-giver, then Team B gets a turn at clue giving, and then back to Team A for the 2nd players turn. At the end of the 30 seconds, the card being used is discarded from play. Each card is worth 1 point, and the team with the most cards when the pile runs out wins.

RULES:

1. Clue-givers may not use any of the taboo words listed on the card, including abbreviations and any part of the taboo word.
2. Clue-givers may not use sound effects or use gestures to indicate the clue word.
3. Clue-givers may pass on any card at any time, but the card is then placed in the awarded to the other team.

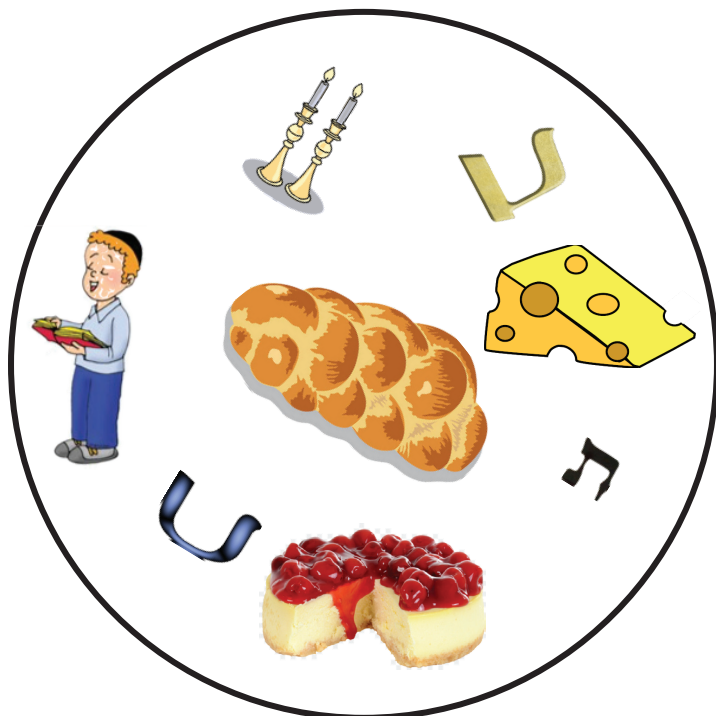
