This distribution was required to be completed before Erev Pesach of the fourth and seventh years of the Shemittah-sabbatical year cycle. This year is the seventh-Shemittah year. In Nissan our forefathers were redeemed from slavery in Egypt, so too we will experience the ultimate redemption in the month of Nissan. Our Haftarah identifies Eliyhau Hanavi who will visit our Sedarim as the advance messenger of the yom hagadol- the great day, on which the Mashiach will arrive.

AIPAC Israel Update

Moon Landing by Israel's Beresheet Spacecraft Appears to End in Crash

A small spacecraft that has captured the imagination and excitement of people in Israel and around the world appears to have crashed on the moon, The New York Times reported. "We have a failure of the spacecraft," said Opher Doron, the general manager of Israel Aerospace Industries' space division, which collaborated on building the spacecraft. The mood at the control center was somber but still celebratory. "Well we didn't make it, but we definitely tried," said Morris Kahn, an Israeli telecommunications entrepreneur and president of SpacEL, the nonprofit that undertook the mission. "I think we can be proud." Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu of Israel, who attended the event at the mission's command center in Yehud, Israel, said, "If at first you don't succeed, you try again." If it had succeeded, the robotic lander, named Beresheet, which means "Genesis" or "in the beginning" in Hebrew, would have been the first on the moon by a private organization, and it would have added Israel to just three nations — the United States, the former Soviet Union, and China — to have accomplished that feat. Beresheet reached the launchpad and was headed to space aboard a SpaceX rocket in February. It orbited the moon, by itself a major accomplishment.
