PARASHA OUTLINE BY CANTOR VOGEL

1. The laws of purity and impurity stemming from childbirth.
2. The laws of purity and impurity from zara'at and other skin diseases and conditions.
3. The purification procedures for a person afflicted with zara'at.
4. The laws of purity and impurity from zara'at that appears on the walls of house.
5. The laws of purity and impurity from the flow of bodily fluids, including niddah and the laws of tahart hamishpacha=family purity.

Haftorah Connection

The Haftorah relates the incident when Elisha the Navi cures Na'aman the commander of the Syrian army of tzara'at. Na'aman after first rejecting the suggested remedy bathes in the Jordan River and is cured. He is so taken by this that he accepts the divinity of Hashem in place of his idol worship. Today's parsha focuses on the disease and laws concerning zara'at. The haftorah tells of four individuals who were afflicted with zara'at and therefore were sent out of the city until cured. Seeking food, they entered the military camp of the attacking Arameans only to find the camp deserted. They reported their find to the King of Israel and brought salvation to Israel. To their credit they did not seek to profit from the spoils of the camp before reporting their find.

AIPAC Israel Update

The U.S. Intelligence Community Releases 2021 Annual Threat Assessment, Includes Full Section on Iran
 On April 13, the U.S. Intelligence Community released its 2021 Annual Threat Assessment, outlining "the most direct, serious threats to the United States during the next year." The report highlights the comprehensive threat posed by Iran—ranging from its regional aggression and support for terrorism, to its ballistic missiles, cyberattacks and potential nuclear breakout. America needs a comprehensive policy—closely coordinated with our regional allies—to permanently prevent Iran from acquiring a nuclear weapon and address the regime's ballistic missile program, terrorism, and regional aggression. U.S. sanctions increase our diplomatic leverage and hold Iran accountable for its actions. Trading an economic lifeline for temporary nuclear restrictions is a good deal for Iran's cash-strapped regime but will deprive us of the leverage we need for a "longer and stronger" deal.
