PARASHA OUTLINE BY CANTOR VOGEL

1. Instructions for the ceremony of blessings and curses on Mts. Gerizim and Eival in the Land of Cana'an.
2. Laws: to eradicate idol worship from the land; bring korbanot-sacrifices only at the Temple; permitting the slaughter animals for meat (non-sacrificial); prohibiting the eating of blood.
3. Laws forbidding the copying of non-Jewish ways, customs, and practices.
4. Laws regarding false prophets, a person who seduces other to worship idols, and a perverse city—a city of Jews who have chosen to worship idols.
5. A review of the laws of kashrut: animals, fish, and fowl.
6. Laws for the Shemitta-sabbatical year for land and loans.
7. Laws of tzedakah.
8. A review of the laws regarding a Jewish slave and maidservant.
9. The sanctity of the first-born animal. The laws of the festivals.

Haftorah Note

Today's Haftorah is the third of the seven Haftarot of Consolation. The Haftarah opens with the report of the prophet to God: the city of Jerusalem will not accept the message of comfort as delivered by the prophet. The Haftarah reinforces the lesson of the parsha: A promise of blessings to those who keep the Torah and mitzvot. The moral influence of the Jewish people on the world will be so great that nations will come to study our ways and learn from us.

AIPAC Israel Update

Israel on High Alert Amid Dramatic Escalation

Iran is orchestrating terrorism throughout the Middle East, targeting Israeli and American interests. Over the weekend, Israel was forced to defend its citizens as it faced simultaneous security threats from Iranian-backed terrorism in Syria, Lebanon, Iraq and Gaza. On Saturday night, the Israeli Air Force—using fighter jets supplied by the United States—destroyed Iranian drones in Syria that were being armed with explosives for a “large scale” attack against Israel. The “kamikaze” attack drones required a “major operation effort” by Israel’s military to defend Israel and its citizens. Further, Iranian-backed Palestinian terrorists in the Gaza Strip fired more rockets at southern Israel over the weekend and into this week, sending thousands of Israeli families into bomb shelters. Palestinians also continued to engage in violent protests along the border between the Gaza Strip and Israel. On Friday, 8,500 Palestinians took part in some of the largest and most violent riots in recent months. Iranian attacks also threatened the United States. On Saturday, Iran threatened to take action against the Foundation for Defense of Democracies (FDD)—a D.C.-based think tank.
