## PARASHA OUTLINE BY CANTOR VOGEL

1. The mitzva and procedure for bringing bikkurim-first fruits to the Beit Hamikdash-Temple.
2. The procedure for clearing ma'aser-tithes out of the house during the third and sixth years of the Shemittah-sabbatical cycle and distributing it.
3. A detailed description of the ceremony of blessings and curses to take place on Mts. Gerizim and Eyal in the land of Canaan.
4. The blessings and rewards that accrue to those who observe the Torah and mitzvot.
5. The curses that will befall those who don't observe the Torah (and from which we still suffer in exile today).
6. A review of the kindnesses and miracles God has done for the Jewish people in the desert for forty years.

### Haftorah Note

Today's haftorah is the sixth of the seven Haftorah of Consolation. In this haftorah, God who in the curses in the parsha threatened to take the Jewish people into exile in Egypt by boat, promises to return the people to Israel by boat after the punishment is ended. After all the curses in this parsha come to pass the prophet foresees a rebirth of Jewish people, the final redemption and the ingathering of the exiles that we pray for on a daily basis.

### AIPAC Israel Update

#### Nearly 70% of Israelis Vote in Unprecedented Election

On Sept. 17, Israeli voters returned to the polls across the country to decide the newest members of Israel's parliament, the Knesset. These unprecedented follow-up elections, the first in the country's history, were triggered by the Knesset's dissolution vote in May after Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu was unable to form a new government. To encourage voter participation, Israel's election day is a national holiday. President Reuven Rivlin called it the "festival of Democracy." Parents were encouraged to bring their children to the polls and public transportation was free. Turnout in the race was 69.4 percent, higher than the previous election and notably higher than that of U.S. elections. Arab turnout was also up from the previous election. The President of Israel must now choose a member of Knesset to form the next coalition. The strength of the U.S.-Israel relationship is rooted in both countries' shared values and common interests. Regardless of the composition of the new government, which has yet to be determined, the U.S.-Israel relationship must remain strong and continue to transcend partisan politics, for the benefit of both nations.
