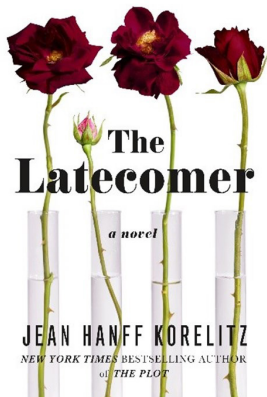

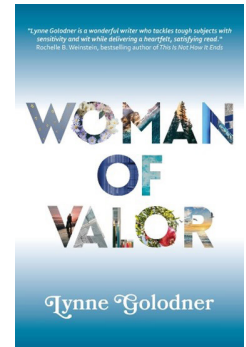
**Celebration of Beth Ahmer Lynne Golodner's new novel,

A note about candle lighting on the 2nd day of a holiday: Jewish tradition says that while we are not permitted to light a fire on a yontuv, we are permitted to transfer a fire on yontuv. This is important for candle lighting on the 2nd day of a holiday (2nd night of Rosh Hashana, 2nd night of Sukkot and Simhat Torah). Prior to the beginning of the 1st day of a holiday, you should light a yahrzeit candle so that after dark on the 2nd night of a holiday, you can light your yontuv candles from the yahrzeit candle.

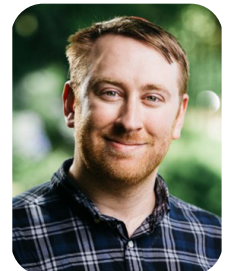

Message from the Rabbi



Everything Everywhere All At Once

I'm not really one for far out movies; most people aren't...that's what makes them far out. But I've kept some of the ideas from last year's *Everything Everywhere All At Once* close to me since I watched it earlier this year. Not that you will necessarily rush to watch it upon seeing this article, but be forewarned – some people love this movie and others, well, very much do not love it. It did win the Oscar for Best Picture, but that doesn't mean it was universally loved.

I'll leave it to you to read reviews or a synopsis to get a broader sense of the story line, but I'll just say that I believe the movie boils down to a few questions:

- Do we have the ability to see the beauty in our sometimes-frustrating lives?
- Can we persevere?
- Should we believe that our decisions make a difference in the world around us, or should we take a more nihilistic view of the world, largely giving up on the future?
- How has our life experience shaped us?
- Are we being thoughtful in the way we are passing down the values we have learned to the next generation?

These and other worthy questions play out over the course of a movie full of lots of action and time-travel through a variety of dimensions. But ultimately, the movie focuses on Evelyn, a Chinese immigrant to the United States and her unlikely role as the one person who can save the universe. Even with this grandiose premise, the movie shines a light on something relatively narrow - the relationship between Evelyn and her angst-laden teenage daughter Joy (a name clearly meant to be ironic).

Evelyn's love for her daughter exists side-by-side with her vocal disappointment in Joy. Evelyn's internal struggle between her traditional upbringing and her American context (and American daughter) comes out in her relationship with Joy and provides us with the relatable, inter-personal drama in *Everything*. It is this relationship that allows us to see ourselves in this film. As I watched, I wondered about Evelyn and her struggles with her sense of self, her disappointments with her life, and the tension in all her close relationships. If you strip away the sci-fi background, *Everything* is a movie about our hopes, both realized and abandoned and how we live a meaningful and full life – recognizing and appreciating the love that is given to us and the possibility that we have more love to give than we realized.

As we prepare for a New Year, we evaluate our lives, our choices, our relationships. The High Holy Days allow a few moments to focus in our otherwise busy day-to-day lives. That can be exciting, for short bursts. But, for a bit of peace, contemplation and prayer, the drama should be within. I hope you find that in the upcoming holidays.

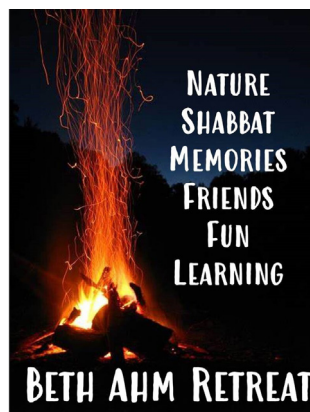

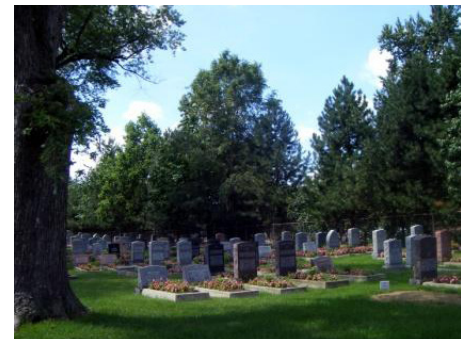
