Minyan Matters

Dear Friends,

Beginning in September 2015 I became the coordinator of Beth Ahm's daily minyan. That came following five years as the Meal-on-Wheels program coordinator for the National Council of Jewish Women, Greater Detroit Section.

What I have learned about our daily minyan program during the last three-plus years follows.

- 1) We have many member and non-member regular attendees dedicated to our minyan. They have committed to coming to minyan at least one day a week, either in the morning or in the evening.
- 2) We have a group of "on call" people, some who are non-members, to contact to fill in when regulars aren't able to attend. When called upon, they are always eager to help.
- 3) We should be proud of our minyan program. It has a wonderful reputation in the community. That is demonstrated by the many non-members, including some area clergy, who have found their way to our minyan. As Rabbi Rubenstein once stated in a quarterly bulletin, "It (our minyan) is a gem within the gem which is our congregation".
- 4) There are benefits we can each enjoy by being involved in our minyan program. In addition to knowing that you will help ensure that someone is able to say Kaddish for a loved one, you will feel a sense of community, know that you are helping to continue an important tradition and have the opportunity to meet new people. As an added bonus, there is the camaraderie associated with the daily breakfast should you wish to be a morning attendee.
- 5) Coordinating the minyan is extremely time consuming. Some days it can take as many as 2-3 hours to find enough people to satisfy the requirement that we have at least ten people present. That requirement really means having more than ten in the event someone has a last minute issue and is unable to attend.

In summary, while our minyan program remains strong, we need the additional involvement of others. Consider coming one day a week, one day a month, or when you have yahrzeit for a loved one. The commitment is no more than thirty minutes most days. If you are able to come on a regular basis, it would be most helpful. However, it's not how often one comes to minyan, but that one makes the commitment.

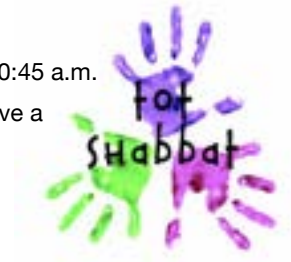

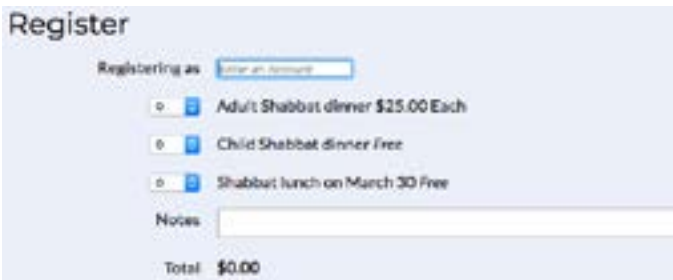
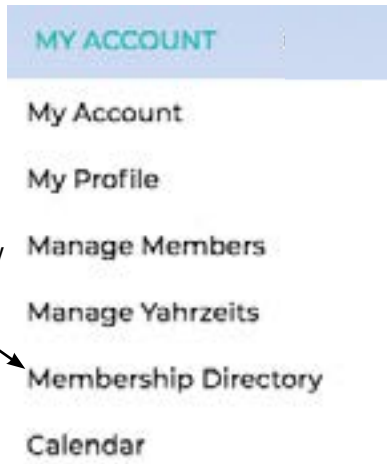
Visit Our New Website!

Message from the Rabbi

Join us for the Israel Book Club at Beth Ahm



The State of Israel celebrated its seventieth anniversary as a state in 2018. It is hard to fully express the role that Israel plays in the Jewish community today, as it is hard for those who weren't alive at the founding of the state to imagine a world without the State of Israel.

During Yom Kippur services I made a brief comment during the Israel Bond appeal that I return to now. While I wanted to add my voice in encouraging our congregation to purchase Israel Bonds (and to support the State of Israel financially in other ways as well), I mentioned that our relationship with Israel is a two-way street. This is true in a variety of ways, but I meant this in a specific way. Jews outside of Israel have been strong supporters of Israel since before the founding of the state. We send support across the ocean to Israel. However, we do, and should strive to, enjoy the cultural fruits of modern Israel that travel from Israel to us. Of course, the Jewish community of Metro Detroit is rich with opportunity over the course of the year to hear from Israelis who come to our community. With this article, I'd like to provide you with an on going opportunity in this spirit.

Over the course of 2019 we will have an Israel Book Club which will meet three times to discuss works of fiction (translated into English) written by Israelis. Fiction allows us a view of society that goes beneath the headlines and gives us access to the cultural issues that are in the collective consciousness. For those of us who love Israel but from the distance of Michigan, diving into these novels will provide us with the opportunity to expand our connection to Israel.

Our first novel will be **Three Floors Up** by Eshkol Nevo. Having already read the novel, I can tell you that the three inter-connected stories in this novel make you want to keep reading. Here is a description of the novel:

Set in an upper-middle-class Tel Aviv apartment building, this best-selling and warmly acclaimed Israeli novel examines the interconnected lives of its residents, whose turmoils, secrets, unreliable confessions, and problematic decisions reveal a society in the midst of an identity crisis.

Yizkor: A Moment to Remember

How do we keep alive the memory of those we have lost? Whenever a death occurs, we ask ourselves this question. Each of us answers in a different way. But, for the Jewish people, we also have a special way that we remember. Yizkor.

Each year, four times a year, we come together to recite the Yizkor prayers and to remember those people who have had an impact on our lives. The Yizkor service, with which people are most familiar, is the one recited on Yom Kippur. But, we also recite Yizkor on Shemini Atzeret (at the end of Sukkot), on Passover, and on Shavuot.

The recitation of Yizkor is one way that we keep faith with the memories of our loved ones. For many Jews, Yizkor helps them maintain a link with parents, grandparents, brothers and sisters, children, and friends. It also strengthens the connection between all who come to synagogue to recite Yizkor.

In addition to reciting the Yizkor prayers, we honor the memory of our relatives and friends by linking their lives to our own good deeds. That is why the days leading up to a festival are particularly appropriate times to give tzedakah.

I encourage you to mark your calendar for the Yizkor dates that will occur in the coming year.

April 27 – 8th Day of Pesah
June 10 – 2nd Day of Shavuot
October 9 – Yom Kippur
October 21 – Shemini Atzeret

An additional moment for us to remember those we have lost is the *yahrzeit* (anniversary of death). Prior to a *yahrzeit*, the Beth Ahm office will send you a reminder with information about services and other ways to honor your loved one's memory.

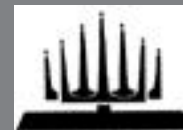

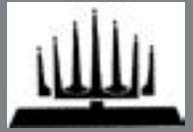
