
Congregation Beth Ahm


Silver Stars Havurah: Our social group meets each month to explore, share, visit, discuss, view, eat...

Message from the Rabbi



Dedicated

Pete Davis' book Dedicated: The Case for Commitment in an Age of Infinite Browsing presents us with a contemporary dilemma: In a world which presents us with so many options, what is the benefit of dedicating yourself to anything for the long-term. Why not choose this today, something else tomorrow?

While recognizing how great it feels to have many options and the access we have to so many things in the modern world, Davis asks the reader to consider the challenges to living a life of 'infinite browsing'. One challenge is what Barry Schwartz points out in his book The Paradox of Choice - at a certain point, 'choice no longer liberates, but debilitates.' I think that everyone envisions a different spot where the wide range of choices seem like just too much: For some it is searching for just the right item on Amazon, for others it is Starbucks. It is easy for us to get caught up losing an hour scrolling through 8 second videos.

However, Pete Davis isn't trying to make us feel bad for our technology habits. Instead, he speaks about the meaning that we get from committing to something over the long-haul. Dedicated is full of examples of people who have made a difference in their neighborhood, in their town, or with a cause. And what unites all these

endeavors is that it takes a long time and great commitment to make a difference. It takes someone paying attention over the course of time so that they can see the solutions, imagine what comes next.

Davis also talks about commitment to community, to friends, and to civic and religious organizations. While it has been noted for several decades by now that membership in lodges, churches and civic groups has declined over the past generation, Davis points to a counterculture which recognizes the power of friendship that stays over time.

In many ways, Dedicated is right up my alley. After all, I am very much connected to the idea of commitment and long-term ideas and institutions. I'm a rabbi for a synagogue community; I am dedicated to the Jewish project that has been going on for millenia. Torah study as a life-long commitment is built into Jewish life. Even the tefillin I wear each weekday are a reminder of our commitments to God and Torah that we each have.

So, reading Pete Davis' book certainly resonated with me. But I don't take the challenges he presents lightly. While Jewish life is countercultural within Davis' framework (after all, we are invited to take a whole day off each week from browsing, choosing, shopping, etc...), I feel the pull of the many ways I can tailor my life through all the choices presented to me. Davis recognizes that we intuitively like browsing because it seems to give us power and the ability to be authentically 'me' (and no one else). But he also helps us see the sometimes-hidden downside of browsing when compared to the long-term commitments we make and keep over the course of a lifetime.

Message from the President



A few weeks ago, the gray clouds and light mist matched the somber mood as Karen, Hannah and I stared at the Shoes on the River Danube Memorial. Over a few months beginning in December 1944, the Hungarian Arrow Cross police marched 20,000 Jews to the edge of the Danube River, had them remove their shoes and shot them as they fell into the river.

With so many similar stories in so many European cities, we are only left with a painful void. Many questions that stir our souls can never be answered. Certain the carefully scripted recording on our prior evening Daube River cruise would provide no insight - as the cruise failed to mention this stirring memorial, the ghetto, or even the Great Synagogue.



Later that afternoon, we met with our Hungarian Jewish tour guide who grew up on the same street as the Great Synagogue. She joyfully shared the momentum established in Rumbach Street Synagogue. The restored synagogue serves as a critical community gathering space with programming for all ages. There is nothing that will ever replace the souls lost in the slaughter that took place, but the drive to continue being all that is Jewish - via all forms of engagement struck me as a promising response.

I feel proud to be a part of the response half a world away, at Beth Ahm, where we offer countless forms of engagement. This bulletin offers many of them - classes, spiritual experiences, social programs, and more. I hope you will take advantage of them and engage with us. I'll look forward to seeing you at shul.
