
Celebration of Beth Ahmer Lynne Golodner's new novel, Woman of Valor Saturday, December 9 at noon

What's involved in writing a book? Beth Ahmer, Lynne Golodner, will answer this question as we celebrate


the publication of her new book, *Woman of Valor*.

When the Cohens lose their wealth and are forced to move to Barcelona and start anew, Rebecca fashions a life and self from what comes her way - a failed marriage, the need to earn a living, but also passion, pleasure and motherhood. Moving from Spain to Cuba to New York for an arranged second marriage, she faces her greatest challenge - her disabled stepdaughter, Luna, whose feistiness equals her own and whose challenges pit new family against old.





Message from the Rabbi



Together With Israel

What is being asked of us as American Jews at this moment? It seems to me that we have been asking ourselves this question since Hamas' attack on Israel on October 7th. We have asked and answered this question repeatedly over the past six weeks.

As individuals and as a community we responded. We raised funds. We reached out to our family and friends in Israel. We gathered as a community to comfort and be comforted. We called elected officials. We demanded the release of Israeli hostages. We spoke with our kids, our teens, and our college students. And just this week, the American Jewish community gathered in Washington, DC, nearly 300,000 of us, to rally for Israel and for the world to demand the release of 240 hostages - babies, children, young adults, adults, seniors...

Weeks ago already, we knew that this would not end soon. And as days turn to weeks to a month and beyond, we wonder what is being asked of us now.

I have spoken to many in our community. Here's what I'm hearing from you. Many continue to feel under siege. We are spending a great deal of time every day following the news from Israel. And many are spending a good deal of time on social media pushing against an avalanche of criticism of Israel. Where do we find additional reserves of strength when we are feeling this pressure, tension, and worry?

For me, I remind myself of my friends in Israel and what they are doing right now. And if you don't have family or friends in Israel, you can think about all you have read and heard about our family, The Jewish People in Israel, now and what they are enduring. The strength of Israelis right now is mesmerizing. With hundreds of thousands of reserves called up for military service, with so many Israelis internally displaced due to rocket fire in the North, Israelis just aren't living a normal life in any way. Work is disrupted; school is disrupted; parents are away from their kids; and kids are missing their parents. And through it all, they are doing what needs to be done. They are caring for their soldiers by bringing them extra supplies. They are caring for kids who need extra attention and care because mom or dad are serving in the IDF. They are going to farms that are missing workers because the workers are serving, and they are picking crops rather than letting them rot in the fields.

So, what's our job right now? Our job, far from the front lines of war, is to remain steadfast with Israel; to make sure that the fate of the hostages isn't forgotten; to remind our elected officials to push for the release of the hostages. Our job is to continue to ask our brothers and sisters in Israel how we can help. Our job is to not move on with the news cycle but to maintain the link that we feel so strongly right now (for some, more strongly than ever).

In Israel today, the slogan is Yachad NeNatze'ah – Together We Will Win. Our job is to remember that we, here in the American Jewish community are Yachad, together with Israel.

Message from the President



In 2016 Rabbi Jonathan Sacks, explained, "Antisemitism means denying the right of Jews to exist collectively as Jews with the same rights as everyone else. It takes different forms in different ages. In the Middle Ages, Jews were hated because of their religion. In the nineteenth and early twentieth century they were hated because of their race. Today they are hated because of their nation state, the State of Israel. It takes different forms, but it remains the same thing: the view that Jews have no right to exist as free and equal human beings."

This was once again demonstrated as the limited empathy toward Israel and Jews quickly turned to criticism of Israel's actions to defend herself and seek justice. It brings into question how can we possibly understand this hatred or approach antisemites logically via enlightened dialogue, education, or documented evidence. As Rabbi Sacks also said, "Hate needs no logic. It is a sickness of the soul."

So, what actions can we take to address our anger, fear, disgust and anxiety now and in the future? The answer will vary by person; however, I hope you will consciously make your own list and hopefully it will include at least some of the following. *I will:*

- 1. Visibly, vocally and financially support Israel in her mission to defend herself.
- 2. Be a source of support for my daughter and others who are experiencing their own anger, fear, disgust and anxiety.
- 3. Resist my urge to turn inward.
- 4. Fight Jew haters by proudly and actively celebrating my Judaism at home, in synagogue and in the community.
- 5. Advocate for Jewish organizations including but not limited to Beth Ahm, Hillel Day School, FJA, Tamarack, Camp Ramah, Hillel on campus that all help our kids develop their Jewish identity in the face of antisemitism.
- 6. Plan to visit Israel.
- 7. Vote for politicians who fight antisemitism and support Israel.
- 8. Not celebrate innocent lives lost during this war forced upon Israel.
- 9. Not focus my energies on trying to address antisemites whether they try to disguise their hatred via their wokeness, academic credentials or myopic empathies.
- 10. Not support companies, restaurants, media, educational institutions, public figures and actors who have voiced their opposition to Israel.
- 11. Not be silent.

I forever, pray Israel achieves her objectives of ongoing peace and security. Am Yisrael Chai!
