A note about candle lighting on the 2nd day of a holiday:

Jewish tradition says that while we are not permitted to light a fire on a yontuv, we are permitted to transfer a fire on yontuv. This is important for candle lighting on the 2nd day of a holiday (2nd night of Rosh Hashana, 2nd night of Sukkot and Simhat Torah). Prior to the beginning of the 1st day of a holiday, you should light a yahrzeit candle so that after dark on the 2nd night of a holiday, you can light your yontuv candles from the yahrzeit candle. 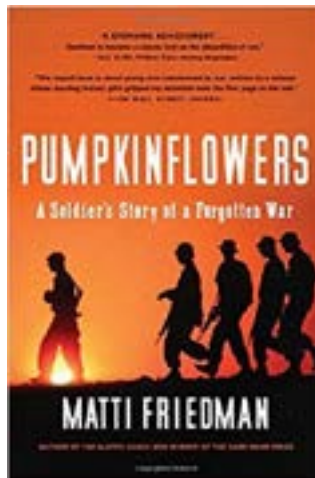

Join us in the Beth Ahm sukkah for snacks and conversation about Matti Friedman's *Pumpkinflowers: A Soldier's Story of a Forgotten War*.

It was one hilltop in a small, unnamed war in the 1990s, but it would send out ripples still felt worldwide today. The hill, in Lebanon, was called the Pumpkin; flowers was the military code word for 'casualties.' Award-winning writer Matti Friedman re-creates the harrowing experience of a band of young Israeli soldiers the author among them—charged with holding this remote outpost, a task that changed them forever and foreshadowed the unwinnable conflicts the United States would

soon confront in Iraq, Afghanistan, and elsewhere. Part memoir, part reportage, part military history, this powerful narrative captures the birth of today's chaotic Middle East and the rise of a twenty-first-century type of war.

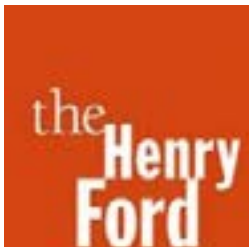

5 Tips for the High Holy Days

1. Prepare

We will gather for High Holy Day services very soon. There is so much to say about the themes, prayers, and spiritual preparation that go into the holidays. Take some time to prepare with the Beth Ahm High Holiday Resource page at cbahm.org/high-holiday-resources/

2. Sit Quietly

No, you don't have to sit quietly for the whole service. We are Jews after all! But give yourself the gift of sitting quietly in the beautiful space that is the Beth Ahm Sanctuary and Social Hall. That quiet can be filled with prayer, thought, clearing of the mind. The quiet can be time to think about the past year and the year ahead. Or the quiet can be not empty for at least a few moments until the details of our lives and our noisy minds take over again. On balance, our lives are more filled with noise than with silence. Make some time in shul to just sit quietly a bit.

3. Sing Loudly

You received a CD from Beth Ahm in the past few weeks. It includes music that you have been hearing over the holidays for some time and will hear again (along with the couple of new tunes that get introduced each year). Give the CD a listen and come ready to sing. And feel free to sing loudly with the congregation. The style of Beth Ahm music is congregational, not choral. Our music has been shaped with the congregation in mind. Now it is up to you.

4. Special Note for Kol Nidre - Stay until the end

While I'd love for you to stay until the services on Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur day, I am truly perplexed when people leave Kol Nidre services early. Where exactly are you going? A late dessert on this holy fast day? Sit, sing, think, and examine your life. While I know there may be an exception here and there, I'll address the whole congregation when I say, there is nowhere else that you need to be. Stick around.

5. Enjoy

Following the sweetness of Rosh Hashana and the release that comes with Yom Kippur, we have the opportunity to celebrate Sukkot. It always makes me laugh (or grimace) when people ask me the day after Yom Kippur if I'm glad that the holidays are over. First of all, no, I'm not glad Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur are over --- I love those holidays. Second of all, what about Sukkot?! A beautiful and fun festival that brings people together in their (and their friends') Sukkot, the holiday is not to be missed. In addition to services at Beth Ahm, there are other events planned for our Beth Ahm sukka that you'll find within this bulletin.

Minyan Matters

Dear Friends,

Beginning in February 2018, Joel Ungar, a member of another shul in the community, and his sister started coming daily to our morning minyan. What follows is a Facebook post that Joel made concerning his experience during that time.

"Wednesday, July 26, on the Hebrew calendar, was the 13th of AV. It is 11 months less one day from the day our father passed away (14th ELUL), the amount of time a child is to say Kaddish for a parent.

It has been a very different experience from when we said Kaddish for our mom. For her, I didn't miss a day, and there weren't many days when I missed either morning or the afternoon/evening service. This time around, I missed four days one month when I came down with the flu. I missed three weeks after my recent surgery. One day I just forgot to go. But between the three of us, someone was Kaddish every day.

Going everyday can be a rote experience, but there are certain days that stand out. One was the first time I met a certain gentleman at Beth Ahm. He was there to say Kaddish for his father. For his mother. For his siblings. For his entire town. All on the same day. He was the only one from his town who survived the Holocaust. That was very humbling.

Another time, on my brother's advice, I tried to focus, while saying Kaddish, on things that were important to my father. It took a few days, but one day a bowl of borscht appeared in my mind. I stopped trying that exercise because he was known to have some shrimp on occasion and I didn't want that image in my head.

The time has gone quickly. Saying Kaddish has been an active way of maintaining a connection to him. The challenge now is to find other ways as we won't be saying Kaddish every day."

I encourage you to join our minyan team as a regular attendee (e.g. one morning or evening a week) or as an on-call volunteer. Most morning minyanim run 35-40 minutes while evenings run 15-20 minutes. If you join us, you will not regret it. Just ask Joel Ungar. You will be doing a mitzvah, feel a sense of community and help to continue an important Jewish tradition. As an added bonus, there is the camaraderie associated with a minyan breakfast if you are able to be a morning participant.

To volunteer or for more information, please call or email me. Remember, it's not how often one comes to minyan, but that one makes the commitment.

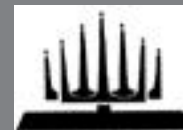

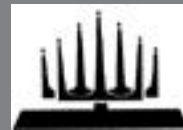
