President's Message: Thank You


As my term as your president comes to an end effective June 30th, I want to thank all who have worked so hard to assist me in my role.



Others are virtual only.



This was in no small part due to our Gift Shop which had to be flexible enough to overcome limited hours and fewer shoppers. Wow! Your Gift Can Last Forever

Is it crucial to have a vibrant, inclusive Jewish community in Sarasota? Is it important for current and future generations to develop a strong Jewish Identity? What would you like your Legacy to be?

These worthwhile objectives are consistent with the mission and values of Temple Emanu-El. Guiding questions may help you clarify your philanthropic purpose.

Would you like your gift to last forever?

An Endowment Gift to Temple Emanu-El today provides a brighter picture for our future. When you donate to our endowment, you give a gift with both immediate and long-term benefits. Endowment donations are invested. A portion of the annual income from the investment is available if the Temple has a specific need. The remaining funds are reinvested to ensure indefinite support. There are a variety of potential methods to support the Temple Emanu-El Endowment Fund.

What donations can be accepted?

Virtually any asset can be used including cash, stocks, and bonds.

Are there any special programs worth pursuing?

There is one special opportunity for those Age 70 ½ and older. You can give any amount (up to a maximum of \$100,000) per year directly from your IRA to a qualified charity such as Temple Emanu-El Endowment Fund without having to pay income taxes on the money. This popular gift option is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD for short.

How do I contribute via the Life & Legacy Program?

There are two primary methods to contribute to the TEE Endowment and be part of the Life & Legacy Society. First, no matter your age, you can designate TEE Endowment as the beneficiary of a percentage, or all your IRA and it will pass tax-free after your lifetime. It's simple. You need to contact your IRA Administrator for the appropriate form. It's essential to let us know of your gift because many popular retirement plan administrators assume no obligation to notify the charity of your designation. Second, if you have a current will, the addition of a few additional sentences with specific instructions is enough to create a Life & Legacy gift. Ideally, this would be prepared by the same legal representation who drafted





your will.

It is incumbent for all of us at TEE to protect and continue to support the congregation that has supported our Jewish community for the last 65 years. Please consider a donation or Legacy gift to the Temple Emanu-El Endowment Fund so that we may prepare for the next 65 years.

Dream List 2022

Every year our board and rabbis come together to imagine what could be possible if we only had the finances. The result is the annual Dream List of potential projects in need of a benefactor. We are grateful that 14 of such dreams have been funded by generous angels in the past six years.

If you would like to make a special gift to the temple, here is an idea of what we need most right now.

Beautiful Outdoor Worship and Meeting Space: The pandemic has shown us the need for outdoor meetings and prayer services. We dream of enhancing the temple green with landscaping and pavers and comfortable seating under the canopy of trees or a shade structure.

Young Family Membership: Families with toddlers rarely join temples. Our new "Tot Shabbat Membership" encourages families with toddlers under 5 to join our temple for a rate of only \$108. We now have 20 families who are part of temple because of this new initiative. We seek a sponsor to underwrite this program to keep it going for \$25,000 each year.

Marketing and Website: We wish to create a part-time position to improve temple marketing and update our website and social media at a cost of \$18,000 per year.

Enhanced Security: In the wake of the Pittsburgh tragedy, we seek to add security guards at more temple gatherings, including religious school. This would cost several thousands of dollars per year.

Culture, Arts, and Music Program: Great performers come to Florida each winter to make swings along the state. Congregations and Federations from Naples to Miami to West Palm are able to book dates and delight their membership. We seek a lover of the arts to generously sponsor a cultural program at our temple for \$35,000 each year to fund 2-3 events. It would be sensational!

Program and Development Hire:

Create a new position at temple that would serve both as part-time program director and part-time development director. We estimate that it may cost \$30,000 per year for one person to fill both positions.

New Memorial Board in the Sanctuary: We need a new brass display for yahrzeit plaques on the back wall of the sanctuary. By sponsoring a Memorial Board for \$25,000, you can inscribe the large dedication plate at the bottom center of the board with the names of loved ones whom you wish to honor.

Commemorate Tisha b'Av at Temple Emanu-El

The significance of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem, twice built and twice destroyed, is beyond measure for the Jewish people. It is this Temple which we have recalled for thousands of years on the sacred day of Tisha b'Av.

Tisha b'Av –the ninth day of the Hebrew month of Av – is the saddest and most mournful day on the Jewish calendar. It marks the traditional date on which both Temples fell (in 586 BCE to the Babylonians, and in 70 CE to Rome), and is also identified with too many other tragic days for our people. Traditionally, Tisha b'Av is observed with the rituals associated with mourning a death, fasting – and the reading of Eicha, the biblical Book of Lamentations, at nightfall. In Jerusalem today, Jews throng the plaza of the Western Wall to participate in this ceremony and to raise their voices in grief as they recall the ancient Temple.

This year, Tisha b'Av begins on Saturday, August 6, at sundown. Rabbi Michael Shefrin and Rabbi Mimi Weisel will conduct a Tisha b'Av observance at Temple Emanu-El. The evening will begin at 8 p.m. and will include traditional readings from the Book of Lamentations – one of the most poignant, tragic, beautiful, and affecting works not only of the Bible but of world literature. That night, we will join the millions of Jews and the hundreds of generations - from before the Common Era until today – who have marked Tisha b'Av by recalling the destruction of the Temple, the fall of Jerusalem, and the suffering of our people throughout the ages. The holiday of Tisha b'Av, while sad, is also deeply meaningful, and will infuse you with a sense of what it means to be part of the ancient yet timeless and holy community of Israel.

The Temple Emanu-El family is warmly invited to be a part of this observance, and to mark Tisha b'Av in our sacred space.

It also included elaborate costumes for Seder leaders, and an experiential retelling – and reliving – of the Exodus story.

"The absolute joy felt throughout the room was palpable," reported Associate Rabbi Michael Shefrin. "Many new memories were made to add to the Passover story. The food, the crafts projects, the singing all made it a holiday to remember."

"It gave people of all ages the opportunity to celebrate Passover with community and experience the richness and joy of our heritage," added Director of Education Morah Sabrina Silverberg, MARE.

The highlight of the evening was an opportunity for children to take on the roles of Moses, Miriam, and the Israelites, demanding that Pharaoh release his slaves. "The kids were chasing Pharaoh and shouting 'Let my people go,' and Pharaoh was replying, 'No! No! No!" Morah Sabrina recalled. What might have seemed a light, fun moment was also a fulfillment of the goal of the Seder: for each person to experience the evening as if they themselves had gone forth out of Egypt.

Abundant thanks were offered to Senior Rabbi Brenner Glickman, Rabbi Shefrin, and Morah Sabrina for leading the Seder, as well as Michael Lauber, Lynne Pewterbaugh, Fatima Soriano, and Kim Sheintal. 

2022 marks the 50th anniversary of the ordination of Sally J. Priesand, the first woman publicly ordained as a rabbi. She opened the door for subsequent generations of women who were inspired by her to pursue careers in the rabbinate.
