## Rabbi's Message: Where Did Tu B'shvat Come From?

Judaism is so old it is silly. Some of our "newer" holidays, such as Chanukah, are over 2000 years old. Our people had been celebrating Passover for a thousand years before Judah Macabee was born. Reflect on that for a moment. Tu B'shvat is one of these "newer" holidays, and it is still in formation. Our beloved Festival of Trees began quite inauspiciously as a tax day, something akin to April 15 in America. The Talmud describes it as the end of the fiscal year for agricultural taxation; any tree that blossomed after this day would be tithed for the following year. That was not very spiritual, or fun.

It was not until the late Middle Ages that the event became a holiday celebrating trees, and nature, and God's generous act of creation that continues to provide for us. Among Ashkenazic Jews, the custom developed to eat 15 different species of

fruit on this day, especially species that grow in the land of Israel. Sephardic mystics attached even greater significance to the day, seeing the tree as a symbol of God's presence in our terrestrial realm. All Jews would recite Psalm 104 on this day, which exalts in God's formation of the natural world, including this verse:

How many are the things You have made, O Lord; You have made them all with wisdom; the earth is full of Your creations.

The early Zionists embraced Tu' B'shvat with special fervor. The holiday became a celebration of the kibbutz movement's "return to the earth" ethos of working the soil. It was the annual highlight of the Jewish National Fund's heroic afforestation efforts. Every photo montage of pre-state Palestine includes pictures of Jewish children planting trees on

Tu B'shvat. Those trees are now tall forests throughout the State of Israel.

The celebration continues at Temple Emanu-El. Our schoolchildren plant seeds every year to take home and nurture. All of us are invited to the natural wonderland that is the Weinberger's backyard on the evening of January 15 for Havdalah and socializing beside the community garden. And we are celebrating Shabbat outside for services Under the Stars on January 14, with special guests: trees! See upcoming emails for details.

This "new" holiday continues to flourish in each generation.

Thanks to Neil Klaber, Michael Lauber, Judy Dean, Howard Schapiro, and all those who joined us to make this a night to remember.


Speaking of nights to remember, if you attended our classical music concert last month, you were highly

## Temple Emanu-El's 65th Birthday

This article is part of a series in recognition of Temple Emanu-El's 65th Birthday.

Today the Temple Emanu-El Sanctuary is our sacred, spiritual space to celebrate all our Jewish life cycle events: baby naming, consecration, b'nai mitzvot, confirmation, marriage, and memorial services.

We gather weekly to celebrate Shabbat, our most important Jewish holiday, as well as festivals and holidays throughout our calendar year.

As one enters the sanctuary the focal point is the bimah adorned by the ark and the quote above from Psalm 16:8: "I place the Lord before me always."

Our Sanctuary began its journey in 1961. The December issue of our *Temple Times* has a photo of the empty lot on which the Temple would be constructed. The building was dedicated on April 23, 1961. It was one large all-purpose space for everything. Religious school portable classrooms were added 17 months later. In 1963, Rabbi Meyer Marx was installed as the first permanent rabbi.

By 1966, a rabbi's study, office, and bathrooms were added on to the space. Our membership continued to grow and ten years later the social hall and kitchen was completed. In 1976, the sanctuary became the exclusive sacred space it is today.

Anne and David Anchin retired to Sarasota from New Rochelle, NY in the late 1970's and became members of Temple Emanu-El. Anne (1905-1996) had attended the Artists Institute in New York and was an accomplished painter. She is responsible for the design of the doors of our Ark and the eternal lamp. The Anchin name graces the Anchin Assisted Living at Aviva (formerly the Anchin Pavilion named in Anne's memory).

Moving ahead to early 2011, the bimah was showing the signs of many years of use and was ready for a renovation. Temple member Ronald Klineman, assisted by Martin Arch, chaired a committee that raised the funds privately through the temple membership to cover the complete update. The project was finished in time for the High Holy Days of 2011.

The original design of the bimah was intentionally maintained. It included the replacement of the wood background, columns around the doors, and the original polished brass lettering was re-attached to the new doors. The lighted stained glass added to the effect of the flames.

The eternal lamp did not need renovation. It continues to hang now as it did then with a purpose and design meaningful to all of us. Mora Sabrina shares that "the Religious School students are surprised to learn that in our Sanctuary, the everlasting light never goes out, not even during a hurricane! [It is] God's everlasting presence and protection of the Jewish people."





#### A Glimpse into **Confirmation Class**

Temple Emanu-El's eighth through tenth graders continue to enjoy monthly Confirmation classes with Senior Rabbi Brenner Glickman and Associate Rabbi Michael Shefrin. The teens choose the subjects to be studied, encouraging meaningful, engaging, and uniquely relevant learning experiences. While some classes are challenging, rooted in classical sacred texts or focusing on topics like gender identity, abortion, and tattoos, others are more lighthearted and fun. According to Rabbi Glickman and Rabbi Shefrin, November's classes were the latter!

"I taught such a session this month called Rabbi Shefrin's Favorite Wacky and Obscure Texts – all random texts from Talmud," Rabbi Shefrin reported. "Once our teens realized that these were Torah texts, not ones I was going to send to them on their iPhones, the class became super energized. Our young scholars are filled with insight. Among other Talmudic texts, they were able to relate an ancient text confronting an unknown disease to the recent pandemic and their own experiences. It was comforting for our students to know that their life experiences weren't so different than the sages of old."

Added Rabbi Glickman, "The Confirmation students choose fun electives that augment the serious learning we do every session. This year they chose Jewish jokes, which of course delighted me. This past month, they received their first sampling of Jewish jokes, with an introduction to the genre: a priest, a minister, and a rabbi!"



There have been so many things to be thankful for this fall. Our students continue to bless us each day with their curiosity, love of life, and never-ending smiles! We are so thankful for our amazing teachers and their dedication to our students.

Our motto for this season has been "Never, ever underestimate the importance of having fun," a quote by Randy Pausch. The SSELC students have been learning through play with big smiles on their faces. The beautiful fall weather has given them plenty of time to enjoy the playgrounds to work on their large motor skills, balance, and sharing. Since the sandboxes were refilled with fresh sand, the children can build, dig, and use their imaginations.

The Threes and VPK class learned all about pumpkins, inside and out. Miss Michelle taught the students about the parts of the pumpkin. Then they cut one open to explore the inside.

Our Ones and Twos Classes have been working on their fine motor skills through lacing beads on pipe cleaners, putting stickers on paper, and using glue to make beautiful collages.

The annual Thanksgiving Celebration was held on Friday, November 12th. Our families gathered for a morning of Shabbat, Thanksgiving songs, fall crafts, and playground time. The students did an outstanding job learning their songs and sharing them with their parents. Our families mean so much to us and we are so glad we were able to celebrate with them this year.

We are also so thankful to have Sabrina Silverberg, Director of Education MARE, provide Hebrew Enrichment for all our SSELC students. She explains more about her program here: It's never too early to begin learning a language. It is fun. It also promotes healthy development, and the many cognitive and social benefits that last a lifetime. Research shows that learning a second language boosts problem-solving, critical-thinking, and listening skills, in addition to improving memory, concentration, and the ability to multitask. Children proficient in other languages also show signs of enhanced creativity and mental flexibility.

Every Monday at 10:45 am SSELC children engage in spoken Hebrew lessons with Morah Sabrina Silverberg. The tots learn to introduce themselves in Hebrew, to practice counting in Hebrew and to identify their colors. Through Hebrew with movement and dancing, they learn action words such as walking, running, and jumping. Each lesson ends with "Hashafan hakatan" an Israeli childhood song about a little rabbit who caught a cold.

The SSELC children enjoy their time at Hebrew class and parents



appreciate the enrichment that the SSELC is providing. As Emma Hudson, a parent of a two-year-old said, "My son Blake absorbs everything he sees and hears during Hebrew and Shabbat. When we are at home, he is excited, and all the learning comes out! I also appreciate that the Hebrew words and activities are sent home so parents can practice." 

Several of their books will be available for purchase and signing at the event.


