President's Message: NO, You Haven't Been Dreaming...

...the reality was that fourteen months ago on March 13, 2020 all in-person events at Temple Emanu-El came to a screeching halt! We all have experienced and sacrificed individually from the fallout of this pandemic. Through this elongated period Rabbi Brenner, Michael, and Elaine have led and directed our High Holidays, two Passover Seders, two Purims, one Hanukkah, and numerous weekly Shabbat, Havdalah, and Torah Studies. Through their stewardship we continue to stay connected albeit virtually. With the recent vaccinations coming to many of our temple members more in-person outdoor events are being planned for our religious school students and temple members. I feel we are on the verge of a breakout. The Covid Response Team (CRT) meets bi-weekly to assess and monitor our position on activities held at the temple. The weekly temple e-blast and special reports from me, the Rabbi's and Executive Director will apprise you of all new developments.

Just recently, our Passover Seder held at the homes of Rabbi Glickman, and Rabbi Shefrin registered a record setting number of participants. Temple members and their families connected via livestream to enjoy the service and repeat the story of the exodus of our ancestors from Egypt.

Our Annual Congregational Meeting held on April 18th featured my state of the temple report. In addition, the temple membership approved our two new trustees, Joanne Haiby and Dennis Reens. Both will come on board effective July 1, 2021 for a two year term. At a future edition they will be featured with a bio and picture. Please join with me

to extend a hearty mazel tov to them.

During this pandemic year the temple membership and revenue have declined 2% from the previous year. Our current member units stand at 607, compared to 620 at this same time last year. Considering the headwinds we faced, I believe we have weathered the storm fairly well. As you remember, the budget passed by the board last year forecasted a sizable shortfall. The good news is that the temple membership responded to a call by Rabbi Glickman to help out. A High Holiday Days Support Fund was established, and the temple responded. Through the generous giving of our temple members to the fund, and the Yom Kippur Appeal, we raised a little over \$200,000 to meet our expenditures and the anticipated shortfall.

Looking forward to 2021-2022 we are forecasting a 1% decline in both membership and revenue thereby resulting in our need to fundraise to balance the budget. The budget will be heavily dependent on donations from the Yom Kippur Appeal and from the anticipated gala

to be held in February, 2022. The board voted this year not to increase the membership dues in light of the pandemic that has resulted in financial hardship for some of our temple families. Know that the temple leadership continues to monitor its expenses and works to be most efficient and fiscally responsible.

As the temple enters the last quarter of this fiscal year, we look forward to our next year starting on July 1st with renewed energy and optimism. The hope is for all of us to be together soon enjoying Temple Emanu-El, and all that it has to offer.

With some incredible game finishes and upsets, it was a challenge to determine bracket winners; but whether it was luck or science, two players emerged as our top tier winners (more drum rolls, please). In second place, Ken Simon and in third place, and just three points

lower than Ken was Joe Ross. Thank you to all contestants. We hoped you enjoyed playing.

With an eye toward the future, Brotherhood is reviewing our Board structure and rewriting Mission and Vision statements to reflect our desire to become more inclusive and offer more diverse programming. Consequently, we are reaching out to Temple members who have had experience at previous congregations with membership, events programming or finance. 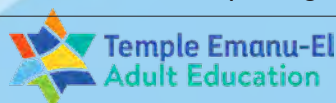

Executive Director's Message The Joy of Children

Some of the most consistent questions I receive when I am meeting with potential new members are related to the temple having younger members and opportunities for children to engage in Jewish education. Even if the potential member does not have young children of the age to attend an early learning center or religious school, it is important to them that schools are part of our temple. Having young people, families, and members in the work force speak to the youthfulness of our temple family and contribute to our vibrant, diverse community. Happily, I can share that we offer an array of amazing programming for children and families that is well steeped in the traditions and love of Judaism.

Starting with our very little ones, the **Parent & Me** and **ShaZoom** programs welcome children from 6 weeks to 2.5 years old to join in with

their parent or grandparent for songs and Shabbat fun. The **Susan Schwaid Early Learning Center** provides high quality, loving care for children from 15 months until children go to kindergarten. **Tot Shabbat** engages families with young children offering a ton of opportunities to gather, have fun, and connect Jewishly. **TEERS, Temple Emanu-El's Religious School**, is a top notch, experiential program that provides joyful Jewish learning for children in kindergarten through 7th grade and prepares children for their Bar/Bat Mitzvah. **Confirmation** class includes teens through 10th grade and **STEEMY**, our youth group, is fun for teens throughout high school. **Family Shabbat** services are monthly where children actively participate in the service. We also have a **College Committee** that sends care packages to young adults in college.

Temple members are invited to engage with our younger population. Sharing a small sample of ways this happens- Sisterhood partners with religious school to connect multiple

generations together. Members, including those in the Starfish Program, read to children at the Susan Schwaid Early Learning Center.

Recognition by All Faiths Food Bank & New Collections

Temple Emanu-El has been recognized as the top fundraiser for All Faiths Food Bank – winning this honor in 2020 for another successful High Holy Day Food Drive. Although the coronavirus pandemic meant that our usual collection of nonperishable foods had to be replaced by a drive for cash donations, our wonderful members responded as generously as ever – donating over \$45,000 during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

“Temple Emanu-El is proud to again be named the top fundraiser for 2020 for All Faiths Food Bank,” Social Action Committee co-chair Susan Rosebaum commented. “The need for support of the food bank has been exacerbated by the pandemic, resulting in many people in need of food for the first time in their lives.”

“We are honored to receive this award again, especially this year. I am proud of our temple members who recognized the crisis and responded with such generosity,” Senior Rabbi Brenner Glickman stated.

“I wish it were enough,” he added. “Hunger persists in our community. I hope we remain ever-vigilant to hear the cries of those in need.

“We are grateful to have All Faiths Food Bank here to provide food to the hungry in our community,” he concluded. “They make it easy for us to do our part.”
