for the holidays. At this year's holidays, we all saw new silver ornaments sparkle in dazzling brightness.

Friends, I am delighted to announce that the culmination of our three-year dream will be celebrated on October 1. On that night we will dedicate four new Torah covers to be used throughout the year. This has a been a collaborative effort. Members of our Ritual Committee and Beautification Committee came together to select the artist and commission the works. Four temple members generously underwrote the costs of the project. You can read more about this gift inside these pages.

Come celebrate with us! We will dedicate the new covers and silver at our Simchat Torah celebration on Friday night, October 1, at 7:15. Please attend in person or on livestream. We will also dedicate new Torah books (chumashim) in the pews that night. And we will also announce a surprise



Temple Emanu-El's 65th Birthday

This article is part of a series in recognition of Temple Emanu-El's 65th Birthday. We are delighted that our long-time member, Gloria Weed, a past president, shares a memory to make us smile.

"When my family and I moved to Sarasota in 1985, joining a temple was a top priority. Seeking to make new friends, one of the key attractions to Temple Emanu-El was TE-SAC. The Temple Emanu-El Social and Athletic

Club was an integral part of the temple along with Brotherhood and Sisterhood. TESAC was a terrific way for my family to transition to our new home, and meet people in a friendly, relaxed setting. The group's membership included singles and members of all ages. Most members were couples with children, but all members were "young at heart".

Our temple social club held monthly events. Some favorites were our annual car rally scavenger hunt and an evening at Tampa Bay Jai-Alai, as well as an annual Halloween party and our mystery dinner train ride in Ft. Myers. We regularly held weekend events for families with children such as canoe trips down the Little Manatee River or a weekend at a dude ranch.

The most memorable activity was a very successful annual fundraiser for the temple held at the Sarasota Medieval Fair, then held on the grounds of the Ringling Museum. It took a whole day to set up our hot dog and pickle booth. We had a rotating crew of TESAC volunteers

to sell hot dogs and pickles while dressed in medieval costumes. This singular activity built long-lasting friendships.

The other TESAC fundraiser was our annual rummage sale. We used the Religious School auditorium and a large tent outside to sell donated items. Like the Medieval Fair event, there was tremendous camaraderie among the volunteers.

Back then, there wasn't a Jewish Community Center. The Jewish Federation did not have a large presence in Sarasota. Temple Beth Shalom and Temple Emanu-El were the only places for the Jewish community to gather and socialize.

Within six months of moving here, the TESAC events and activities helped us transition to our new life in Florida and planted the seeds of lasting friendships that have grown across the decades.

Temple Emanu-El's Social and Athletic Club disbanded in the '90s. The temple's programs and activities have evolved over the years. Temple Emanu-El continues to attract new families now as it did when I joined in 1985. The constant and key to our continued growth is our commitment to a warm, caring, and inclusive congregation.

The bimah, sanctuary, and ark are now shining brighter thanks to the kind gift of \$6,000 by Louise Bick in honor of her beloved husband, Norty Bick. Louise and Norty joined Temple Emanu-El in 2002. Sadly, Norty passed away in 2018. He was truly loved by the congregation and is greatly missed.

Norty was a longtime leader at Temple Emanu-El. For many years, Norty was the chair of the Ritual Committee, oversaw shabbat and holiday services, was the adult b'nai mitzvah coordinator, and taught Hebrew. Norty's faith was extremely important to him. He was born and raised in Germany.

On Kristallnacht, he watched as his synagogue burned down. Everything was lost, including the Torah scrolls. Norty's wimple was inside the ark of the synagogue. The wimple was given to him at birth and was used to tie a Torah scroll. We are proud at Temple Emanu-El that inside our ark is a special dedication to Norty. We have a Holocaust scroll that was saved from Czechoslovakia. The scroll is bounded by a decorative wimple. The wimple has a small placard that says, "Norty Bick."

Thank you, Louise, for honoring Norty with this special gift and for making the temple's sacred space brighter for all to enjoy.

Temple Emanu-El Receives \$100,000 Security Grant from Department of Homeland Security

Temple Emanu-El treasures our members; their security and well-being are the congregation's top priorities. Over the last several years, TEE has made significant improvements to increase campus safety, including replacing all doors and windows to be impact-resistant. These upgrades were underwritten by proceeds from the 2020 gala honoring Randy and Susan Mallitz.

However, security is an ongoing need requiring ongoing funding. In March 2021, we applied for the Non-profit Security Grant Program, a federal program created by the US Department of Homeland Security. It involves an extensive application process that must be approved by the State of Florida before reaching the federal level.

We are thrilled to learn that our request for \$100,000 was approved. These funds will help provide enhanced security resources around the campus, including additional cameras, a motion detection system, removeable bollards, hiring of armed guards, and additional lighting.

Stated Executive Director Christine Elliott, who managed the grant application with support from Rose Chapman and Temple Emanu-El's Security Committee and leadership: "The grant process was challenging but well worth it. Having simple grant-writing and project-management skills helped me put together all the pieces of the grant; however, this grant was a team effort. I was impressed by the level of support from Jewish and federal organizations, locally and nationally.

"I even managed to meet new friends during this process!" she added. "I greatly appreciate that security director Jeffrey Solomon completed a Threat, Vulnerability & Risk Assessment on our campus. This a valuable tool and was required for the grant."

December 16, 10:30 am: Rabbi Brenner Glickman-Jewish Dietary Laws — Where do they come from and why? What Jews eat distinguishes us from other people and distinguishes us from other Jews. But where do these laws and customs derive? Why does the Torah prohibit shrimp? Why does the Talmud demand we separate milk and meat entirely? Why did the earliest American Jews see these laws as an impediment to being a fully actualized Jew? We will address all these questions and more in a stimulating discussion featuring primary source material from the Torah, Talmud, and medieval scholars, including passages from Orthodox and Reform sources. Ritual Committee: New Torah Covers

At the heart of every synagogue, you will find a Torah scroll with the ancient words of our people inscribed on its parchment. Each sacred scroll is lovingly covered, both to keep it safe from harm and as a reminder of the beauty the Torah's teachings bring to our lives.

Here at Temple Emanu El, we are blessed to have four Torahs, including a Holocaust Torah. After many years of use, their covers had become discolored and frayed and this was the reason why the rabbis and the Ritual Committee decided to replace the covers with new ones.

We are fortunate to have members who were willing to help us keep our Torahs safe and beautiful for many years to come. We also are verry grateful to our donors, Don and Barbara Bernstein and Marvin Cohen for their generosity, enabling the temple to purchase new covers.

To select an artist for creating the new covers, Marian Raupp assembled a committee from the Ritual Committee and the Beautification Committee that consisted of Eleanor Wachs, Larry Barnet, Judilee Sterne, Judy Fleischer and Gloria Weed. Each person brought a unique perspective to the committee, and everyone worked together to make

the decisions that led to the beautiful new Torah covers. We hope you will agree that the result is stunning and perfect for the Temple Emanu-El.

Jeanette Kuvin Oren, who created the Torah covers especially for our temple, is an American contemporary artist specializing in Judaic art and best known for her one-of-akind Torah covers. The committee selected her to design the covers based on samples of the work that she has done for more than 350 synagogues, community centers, and schools across the United States, Canada, South America, and the Caribbean.

After discussing themes and colors with the artist, the committee agreed on a theme and color scheme to compliment the style and colors in our sanctuary. When you see the covers, you will notice that their design echoes the style and color pallet of our stained-glass windows. Each cover reflects a Jewish theme that is important to Temple Emanu-El. In addition to the new covers, each Torah will also be dressed with new silver rimonim to add yet more beauty to our Torah scrolls.














Tot Shabbat "New Years (Shofar) Blowout"


