Rabbi's Message: Preparing

As September begins the Jewish month of Elul will have already arrived. Elul is the month leading to Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

It is a time of special rituals serving a grand purpose, our spiritual preparation for the holiest days on the Jewish calendar. Introspection, reflection, and cultivation of self-awareness are key to the process. Here are some rituals associated with Elul that I encourage:

- *Cheshbon hanefesh*, a spiritual inventory. Reflect on this past year. What were your blessings? What felt like a curse? Where did you miss the mark? Were you your best self? And then set goals for the coming year asking how you will "choose life"?
- Sound the shofar each morning (or come by the temple and ask a rabbi). The sound should help to wake us from any complacency and inspire us to action.
- Recite Psalm 27. Its words hold themes of the season, protection, and forgiveness.
- Attend the beautiful Selichot service on the evening of September 17th.
- Visit the graves of loved ones. This honors them and helps us reflect on our lives.

The rituals to help us prepare are diverse. No matter which you engage in the result will be the same, a more ready you will be entering the Days of Awe.

You can also create your own rituals.

One year, each day of Elul, I cleaned out a drawer in my apartment and made a donation I should have made earlier in the year. This year, I will use a deck of T'shuvah Cards purchased online. Each card has a painting to meditate on and a kabbalistic teaching appropriate for Elul.

What ritual will you take on to help you prepare?

Elul is a time for recommitting to relationships with our tradition, our God, and ourselves. It can be most meaningful if we do the work. If we do, when the New Year arrives, we can show up to High Holiday services not just in our holiday best, but as our holiday best.

Shanah Tovah u'Metukah. May you have a good and sweet 5783.

President's Message: We've Come a Long Way

"You've come a long way, baby!"

Some of you may remember that slogan used by the Phillip Morris Company in 1968 to sell Virginia Slims, a new brand of cigarettes targeted for women. Smoking was equated with a set of traits meant to capture the essence of women in a new era of equality – independence, slimness, glamour, and liberation. The intent was to show how much progress women had made in the 60s.

I could say "You've come a long way, baby" when I look back at my years associated with Temple Emanu-El. There are the obvious changes visible to many of us. The sanctuary and social hall were renovated. A new and larger office wing was built. Membership doubled, and we hired an associate rabbi. Our building is more secure.

We have had a lot of progress in the past two and a half years since the beginning of the pandemic. Our rabbis, our staff, our committees, and our congregants all responded in a remarkable fashion. Sure, we had been Livestreaming services for a while - a great benefit for those who could not attend services in person. But Livestreaming became the norm of the way people worshipped. Who had heard of Zoom before COVID? Yet, several people became Zoomies - people who could run sessions and assist others along the way. Zoom allowed temple business to continue as usual and programs continued to be offered to keep our congregants engaged. Torah study became a weekly activity. Lectures and other educational programs took place. Fun activities were held - concerts, play performances, trivia contests.

And who could forget Shabbat-to-go dinners? In talking with friends and colleagues, I'm guessing all temples met the challenges in some fashion that the pandemic created. But Temple Emanu-El thrived. We were at the forefront in meeting people's needs in our ability to flex and adapt.

I'm writing this article a month before you are reading it. What can change in a month? Before the pandemic, probably not much. Now things might be the same in four weeks, or they could be radically different. I'm happy to say that, at this time, High Holiday services have reverted to "the old way" – single offerings of each service with livestream available. At least that's how it is today as I write this article. I certainly hope it stays that way.

Regardless of how you plan to celebrate the holidays, my wife, Susan, and I wish all of you a sweet, happy, and above all, healthy New Year.

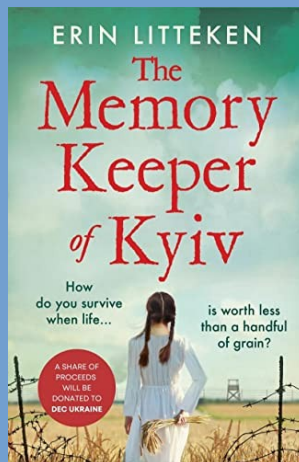

What do you find most meaningful about being a Jewish educator?

TEE Starfish Seventh Year: Continuing, New, and International Volunteer Opportunities!

This year, the *Temple Emanu-El Starfish Initiative* is continuing with favorite programs plus a new international opportunity! Starfish needs *Rockin' Reader* volunteers to read aloud on campus weekly 1:1 with a student, gift four books throughout the year as a *Book Buddy* to a student based on their themed drawings, join the *Starfish Food Pantry* volunteers to serve food-insecure families, help tend the *Starfish Sensory Garden*, provide funding to advance Starfish programs, and/or lead a project based on your own talent or skill.

Also, we are seeking a team to prepare individual student art kits for the *Starfish Literacy-Linked Art Experiences* program. Gather your friends around a table once a month to enjoy camaraderie assembling kits linked to the seven *TEE Starfish Dramatic Storytelling* books. The team prepares already designed kits using provided materials. No artistic skills are required.

In addition, *Starfish* is expanding to connect volunteers to students and teachers in Israel. Those uncomfortable/unable to be on a school campus can interact with students and/or teachers "in person" via Zoom sessions, helping students and English-language teachers with their English fluency! Since 1979, the Israeli-based ESRA (English Speaking Residents Association <https://www.esra.org.il/about.html>) has provided services to English-speaking immigrants to Israel and opportunities for those immigrants to volunteer throughout the entire country. Temple Emanu-El members Ken Marsh and Dr. Tanice Knopp, who made Aliyah in 2021, will be volunteering during this school year in *ESRA's English Tutoring Program* (ETP), which has two parts for volunteers via Zoom:

1. Chat Away - Offers students the opportunity to practice their spoken English, after school hours, by engaging in friendly conversation with English-speaking tutors, on pre-selected topics.

2. Teacher Chat - A tutoring program for non-native English teachers who want to enhance their oral English proficiency through a friendly interaction with a volunteer as their personal native English tutor. No experience or teaching credentials are required.

ETP has over 900 volunteers throughout Israel and around the world via Zoom. A short training session is coming up soon. Assignments begin after the High Holidays. Ken will provide support to volunteers throughout the year as the program coordinator through the *TEE Starfish Initiative*.

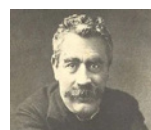

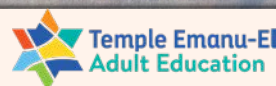

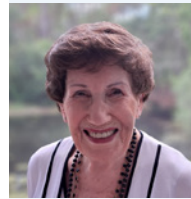

Opher Library: Book Reviews and Other News

Co-President of Sisterhood Harriette Krasnoff was the inspiration for this article. Last year she came to our library looking for prayers written by women that she could read at Sisterhood meetings. That triggered a memory of my grandmother having a prayerbook with some prayers in Yiddish. I asked Rabbi Mimi Weisel about it. She suggested I look for Tkhines. Tkhines are prayers written for Jewish Women in Yiddish.

Why Yiddish? Most Ashkenazic Jewish women were not educated enough to read and translate Hebrew. In the early 1600's there was a great messianic fervor because of the Black Plague, pogroms and other problems. The thought was that everyone, even women, needed to pray to bring the Messiah. Since most women and some men couldn't understand Hebrew, Tkhines came into being.

The first book I found was Voices of The Matriarchs by Chava Weissler. This book gives an in-depth look at the history of Tkhines along with examples of them.

The second book I read was Seyder Tkhines The forgotten Book of Common Prayer for Jewish Women by Devra Kay. This book is divided into two parts. The first gives the history of Tkhines, These prayers were made possible and profitable by the advent of the printing press. The second part of the book is Tkhines translated into English.

Warning! In both books there are parts in which feminists may take umbrage. Blame it all on Eve because these are examples of the way our ancestors did think.

Temple Emanu-El Celebrates Return of Mitzvah Day

After a two-year hiatus due to covid, Temple Emanu-El celebrated the return of our signature Mitzvah Day – an amazing afternoon of hands-on community service projects and donation drives – on Sunday, May 1.

Over 400 members gathered to wrap new books for children at a Title 1 elementary school; prepare and deliver meals to the homeless; assemble care bags for patients undergoing chemotherapy and gift bags for vulnerable women and girls; sort hygiene supplies for homeless veterans; knit blankets for babies in need; assist local nonprofits with clerical projects; make toys and treats for dogs and cats awaiting adoption in local shelters; decorate cookies for firefighters; wash cars to raise money for charity and collect items to support community health and wellness centers. Participants also hosted a blood drive, a garden party for foster children, an afternoon of music and refreshments at a local senior center, and a family picnic in north Sarasota; assisted at animal shelters, the Special Olympics stable, and All Faiths Food Bank; and painted stakes to mark sea turtle nests through Mote Marine. Supplies were also collected for organizations including Second Chance Last Opportunity (diapers and wipes), Mothers Helping Mothers (new socks and underwear for children and teens), Jewish Family & Children's Services of the Suncoast (sports equipment), SPARCC (toiletries), homeless veterans (towels and hygiene supplies), local pet shelters (pet food and toys), and CAN Community Health (dental items), with members responding with incredible eagerness and generosity.

“This was our first in-person Mitzvah Day since 2019!” Mitzvah Day chair Rabbi Elaine Rose Glickman exclaimed. “We were not sure

what to expect in terms of support and attendance. We feared that the energy and enthusiasm that has built up over the years might have dissipated, and that this would be a year of rebuilding.

“But we were gratified and thrilled that our members were more committed to Mitzvah Day than ever before,” she added. “It was a blessing to be part of a special day devoted to helping those in need and making a difference in our community!”

Abundant thanks were offered to Mitzvah Day Committee members.

For the fourth year in a row, The Deanne and Arnold Kaplan Foundation provided a transformative gift by underwriting the children's book drive in order to provide a new book, selected personally for them by a teacher, to every first-, second-, and third-grader at Tuttle Elementary School. Marking the 50th Anniversary of Ordination of Women Rabbis with Study and Celebration

This past summer marked a milestone anniversary – the celebration of 50 years since the ordination of Rabbi Sally Priesand, the first female rabbi in America. Our Temple Emanu-El family observed the important occasion with two special events.

The festivities began on June 2, as Morah Sabrina Silverberg, MARE, facilitated an adult education class on “Women in the Rabbinate.” In addition to her own expertise and wonderful teaching style, Morah Sabrina used materials from “Scouts, Trailblazers, Pathfinders, and Explorers” – a groundbreaking curriculum created for the occasion by the Women’s Rabbinic Network. The informative and inspiring session was enjoyed by all!

On Saturday evening, June 4, our annual Tikkun Leil Shavuot – the Night of Jewish Learning – also celebrated this milestone. Senior Rabbi Brenner Glickman, Associate Rabbi Michael Shefrin, Rabbi Elaine, and Rabbi Mimi Weisel all devoted their study sessions to an aspect of women in Judaism.

“Because Shavuot is traditionally recognized as the anniversary of God’s revelation at Mount Sinai, it is customary to celebrate the holiday with Jewish study,” Rabbi Elaine explained. “The fact that the date coincided almost precisely with the date that Rabbi Priesand was ordained, motivated us to focus our study on the power and strength of Jewish women.

“Although the study of Jewish women, and the impact of women in every area of Judaism, is often overlooked, it would have been impossible for Judaism to survive and endure and thrive and develop without us,” Rabbi Glickman continued. “Having people of all genders come together to learn about power of women throughout the generations was deeply meaningful!”

Have you participated in Temple Emanu-El's wonderful Tashlich ceremony? If so, you already know not to miss this special gathering – but you will want to learn about new elements that we are introducing this year. And if you are new to Tashlich, please also continue reading and plan to be a part of this beautiful High Holy Day tradition!

Tashlich is the symbolic casting away of sins – a very brief service that culminates in throwing crumbs of bread into a body of water. As participants watch the crumbs float away or sink (or occasionally be gobbled by fish!) they imagine the cleansing of soul and spirit that takes place during the High Holy Day season.

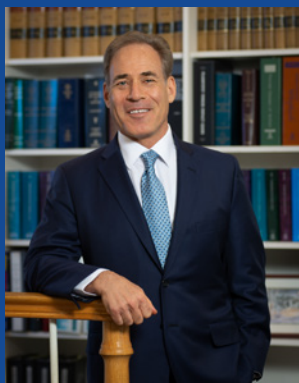
