Rabbi's Message:
Together for the
High Holidays

As I write this message in May, our vision for reopening is starting to crystallize. Our temple leaders have worked diligently to help us fulfill our mission while keeping our members and staff safe.

Some uncertainties remain. We cannot know for sure when Covid rates will fall or what variants will rise. But we do know much about our members. For one, they are overwhelmingly vaccinated. Two, they are growing accustomed to travel and being in public. Three, they value the High Holidays. While our members may not be ready to attend indoor events with regularity, they will prioritize Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

We have a plan in hand with broad support of our temple leaders and rabbis. My message here is not an official announcement. It is, instead, a statement of expectations and hopes. This is what we anticipate for the High Holidays.

We expect that the holiday services will be conducted primarily live, in-person, and in our sanctuary, with significant modifications and Covid protocols. All attendees will be masked, with seating staggered and limited to 40% capacity. Each service will be mildly abridged and duplicated. Our members will be divided into two seatings, early and late, with time in between to clear the air. We will produce a high-quality live

broadcast for those who remain at home or out of town.

As we finalize our plans, we will notify you. Some details we are still working out, including how we will conduct Family Services and how we will divide the temple into two seatings. But we have a plan and a consensus. The work begins now to make this vision a reality.

In the meantime, we will start holding services in the sanctuary this summer, likely in July. We anticipate that most of our members will continue to attend Shabbat services through the livestream, but we will broadcast from the bimah this summer and welcome members to attend with us.

Wherever we pray, God is with us. Our hope is that we can offer our prayers together in safety.

President's Message:


The Year to Remember When...





Before our summer break, I met Paula Hayden. A member for eight years, she is known best for working with Toale Brothers to bring about and maintain our new TEE Cemetery plots. That, however, is just the tip of the iceberg. Using her fashion industry and marketing skills, she chaired our Sisterhood Fashion Show, oversees the sales of our memorial Tree of Life and pew plaques, volunteers almost every Friday night at the gift shop after services, serves on the Israel committee and is now involved in the Path to Peace Wall project she saw in Israel. And she has said "yes" to many other requests to help our congregation that she doesn't even mention.

Born in the Bronx to Hugo and Beatrice Klein, Paula found herself in a community that did not include a large number of Jews. Her dad worked with his family in the printing business. Beatrice, her mom, was the daughter of a jeweler who ensured all his of his daughters had a Jewish star. Paula is still wearing her mom's Jewish star, that she sees as a memory of her family.

Her dad was a founder of the Massapequa Jewish Center Reformed Congregation. He became a fundraiser and created a Youth Group that was central to his desire to engage young people in positive activity. Beatrice was adventurous and a wonderful artist who taught her daughter how to have fun together. She was also active in all Temple activities. Paula never heard either of them say a prejudiced or mean word about anyone. Their other common trait was to call Paula "Eyes and Ears" which is self-explanatory!

They were not Temple attendees but did celebrate all holidays with family. Paula, 11 years old, learned Jewish values by watching her parents. On a trip to the South, she saw signs on bathrooms saying "White Only" and cried. Her father told her that in other states, the signs said, "No Jews or dogs." From this she became sensitized. She hit another student in school who called her a dirty Jew. Her father was proud of it.

Another impetus to work against racism and anti-Semitism was finding pictures her father had hidden from the liberation of a concentration camp when he served in WWII. These secret photos have stayed with her, all of her life. She understood why he was so involved with helping youth after all he had seen and made it her own mission to be a responsible Jewish person helping others for the rest of her life. Everything Paula does at TEE is to help others share in the joy of being Jewish.

Paula did not have any substantive Jewish education but lives as a woman who has the responsibility to live her life with honor and kindness, as her parents' heritage. She had never joined a temple until she came to Sarasota after the loss of her husband, Stuart. Rabbis Glickman and their family, represented, to her, the catalyst of joy and

Judaism. TEE allows one to observe in their own way and is a Jewish cultural center and Paula believes it is the best of what Judaism is about. She also describes a joy she did not have before joining TEE. The spirit of community and music in our sanctuary made it the right time for Paula's rebirth and continuing her Jewish life.

Paula's path to being our Spotlight is unique to her. How she got here, with us at TEE, is another reminder of what all of us bring to the table when we become a member. And another reminder to thank her for including us in her journey.


The Ninth and the Fifteenth of Av: Solemnity and Celebration

The Hebrew month of Av is one of the most significant on the Jewish calendar. Falling during the summer, it is the month of one of the saddest days of the Jewish year – and one of the happiest. Although these dates are not widely observed in the North American Jewish community, they are important and meaningful – and Temple Emanu-El will once again mark them with two special programs.

Tisha B'Av Observance: Saturday, July 17, at 8 p.m. via Zoom. The Talmud teaches, "Whoever has not seen Jerusalem in its splendor has never seen a city of beauty." Those privileged to visit Jerusalem know the truth of this teaching. But the Jerusalem to which our sages referred was actually ancient Jerusalem, the Jerusalem of the Holy Temple, twice built and twice destroyed. It is this Temple - and this Jerusalem - which our people have recalled for thousands of years on the sacred day of Tisha B'Av.

Tisha B'Av – literally, the ninth day of the Hebrew month of Av, ais the traditional date on which both Temples and the holy city of Jerusalem fell in blood and fire. On this night, the Temple Emanu-El family is invited to join the millions of Jews and the hundreds of generations who have marked Tisha B'Av by recalling these tragedies, and the suffering of our people throughout the ages. Observing Tisha B'Av is deeply meaningful, and will infuse us with a renewed sense of what it means to be part of the ancient yet timeless community of Israel.

Our observance will begin with a

brief Havdalah ceremony, separating the joy of Shabbat from the solemnity of Tisha B'Av, and continued with an interactive reading of the biblical Book of Lamentations – including the traditional chanting of the opening chapter by Director of Education Sabrina Silverberg, MARE. Through questions, discussion, and teaching, Rabbi Michael Shefrin, Rabbi Elaine Rose Glickman, and Morah Sabrina will explore the traditional components of Tisha B'Av and why they

remain relevant and inspiring 2500 years later.

Tu B'Av RomCom Movie Night: Saturday, July 24, at 7 p.m. Just one week later, the sadness of Av will give way to happiness with the arrival of Tu B'Av. Literally meaning the fifteenth day of Av, Tu B'Av is a day to celebrate love and affection, and to thank God for the blessing of companionship. Tu B'Av at Temple Emanu-El is a fun, lighthearted day playfully marked by our annual

"RomCom Movie Night" – as members and guests gather for socializing and snacks, a brief talk about the significance of Tu B'Av, and a screening of a classic romantic comedy with Jewish elements. Join your Temple family and feel the spirit of Tu B'Av, and the sweetness of friendship and love.

"When our temple engages with these two historic dates on the Jewish calendar, it helps us to live out what can be so vibrant and dynamic about Jewish life," Rabbi Shefrin commented. "Commemorating the grand devastation of loss alongside the hopeful beauty of romantic love will bring attendees through a whole range of emotions."



TEE STARFISH INITIATIVE



The Best Day Ever!

The 2020-21 school year has been challenging for schools, teachers, and students, to say the least! If you've followed our articles throughout this year, you have read about how the Starfish volunteers have pivoted to identify creative ways to continue support to the Kindergarten and PreK students at Wilkinson Elementary School during a time that volunteers were not permitted

in the schools. Through the generosity of TEE members, their family and friends, and one particular anonymous donor, we provided individualized STEAM Learning & Literacy Kits to each child. In doing so, teachers were able to provide students with experiential, hands-on learning opportunities.

In addition to the varied adaptive methods of learning in schools, the pandemic affected the students we serve outside of the classroom as many families became food insecure. Knowing that hungry students find it difficult to focus on learning, Larry Barnet shifted his efforts to

organize and lead a team of temple and community volunteers to run the TEE Starfish Food Pantry at Wilkinson Elementary School supported by All Faiths Food Bank throughout last summer and the current school year.

Wendy Rudd stepped up and found an alternative way to implement the TEE Starfish Book Buddy program to keep our volun-

teers engaged and to get books in the hands of students. With support from Helene Davis and Julie Kupersmith, Wendy set up a drive-through drop-off hands free way for the adult Book Buddies to donate their books for the students. Lynn Friedman joined the effort to provide an alternative to our typical end-of-year Book Buddy party

through Zoom, including beautiful snack bags decorated with starfish for the students.

Wendy Barnet with the support from her husband, Larry found a creative way to continue her TEE Starfish Dramatic Storytelling program to the students via Zoom. And, once again, Elaine and Akiva Pipe gifted a copy of all five books Wendy presented to each Kindergarten student. For each story, Iris Falk modified the TEE Starfish Literacy-Linked Art Experiences program by preparing individualized materials kits for each student to lead them via Zoom.

Our TEE Starfish Thespian Troupe was not able to

perform this year, but Harriett Krasnoff and her troupe members are ready to return to acting as soon as the schools reopen to volunteers in the 2021-22 school year. Unfortunately, both "Dr. Al" Morris and Drs. Stephen and Janet Hiller were sidelined during the pandemic because their programs—Dr. Al's Music Experiences and the Hiller's Kaleidoscope & Symmetry Experience could be presented only when on campus. They all are ready to go as soon as the schools open; Dr. Hiller already has the student kaleidoscopes made to distribute to the students.

The TEE Starfish Rockin' Reader Volunteer Read-

Aloud program also was suspended, but the Rockin Readers will return next school year ready to be matched with a student as well as finding a new Family Engagement component added to the program.

Dr. Jill Halman, Judy Levy, and Judy and Fred Thibault worked to nurture the beautiful TEE Starfish

Sensory Garden during times that students and staff were not on campus. And it was during recent learning experiences in this garden that we were reminded of how appreciative the students are of the Starfish support and the little ways we can make a big difference in the children's learning and life experience.





For example, one class was in the sensory garden for a science lesson on living things compared to non-living things. They were assigned to sketch a living thing they could find in the garden. Excited about this experiential learning, one girl told the teacher, "This is so much better to see a flower in real life instead of on TV!" And when Judy Thibault provided a piece of sugarcane for each student to taste while they were observing the sugarcane plant in the sensory garden, in response to learning that sugar actually comes from a plant—one they could see and touch--one child excitedly exclaimed, "This is the best day ever!"

In August we will start the fifth year of the Temple Emanu-El Starfish Initiative! And we know that when the Starfish volunteers can finally return to the school, it will be the best day ever!

Passover marks the anniversary of the exodus from Egyptian bondage towards the promised land, dating back to the twelve or thirteen century BCE. Yom Haatzmaut celebrates a more current historical event, modern Israel's independence in 1948. Both holidays are commemorated yearly in the spring with gratitude, jubilation, and festivity.

Temple Emanu-El Religious School (TEERS) celebrated both holidays as a community – joyfully, meaningfully, safely, and outdoors. On April 4, TEERS observed Passover with Aviv Chaviv (Beloved Spring), an all-school tailgate celebration. Children and young families participated in a Passover singalong, "hunted" for the ten plagues, played Passover games, and created Passover reclining pillows and spring flowers. Each student received a Passover goodie bag to continue the learning and celebration at home.

On April 18, TEERS celebrated Yom Haatzmaut, Israel's Independence Day with Kachol V'Lavan (Blue and White)! Children and families enjoyed Israeli music, learned about Israel, and participated in an Israeli-themed singalong. Clement Hakim, a former Israel Defense Forces soldier and TEERS dad, demonstrated Krav Maga (IDF self-defense techniques) with his five-year-old daughter Eva. It was impressive and entertaining! The event also included made-in-Israel treats, Hebrew and Israeli learning games, and a variety of Israeli-themed craft projects. Both events were well-attended and well-received. 
