Dear Mogen David Family:

On March 19, 2020, the State Public Health Officer and Director of the California Department of Public Health issued an order requiring most Californians to stay at home to disrupt the spread of COVID-19 among the population.

On May 25, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom released a framework for reopening religious institutions that were ordered closed to the public due to the coronavirus pandemic. The guidelines include distancing measures, limits on the number of people attending services, and protocols for disinfecting and cleaning.

As Kehilat Mogen David prepares to reopen, KMD will continue to provide services through alternative methods (such as via internet live and/or recorded streaming). To ensure the safety of our members, we are preparing guidelines to safely reopen our shul.

As stay-at-home orders are modified, it is essential that all possible steps be taken to ensure everyone's safety. Key prevention practices include:

- ✓ Physical distancing to the maximum extent possible.
- ✓ Use of face coverings.
- ✓ Frequent handwashing, regular cleaning and disinfection.
