A Message From Rabbi Weitzman

Finding the Light

Perhaps my favorite moment during our Chanukah celebration is when we invite the children of our synagogue to join with our Cantor and sing songs of the brave heroism of the Maccabees. The holiday of Chanukah celebrates the courageous defiance of the Jewish leaders keeping at bay the creep of Hellenism, the expunging of paganism from the Temple and rededication of the heart of Judaism. As a people we play dreidel and recall tales of Jews learning Torah in secrecy, remembering Jewish freedom fighters hiding in caves, and the tidal wave of the Assyrian Greeks threatening the future of Judaism.

Today it feels as though the tropes to help encourage Jewish pride and celebrate isolationism from majority culture as our historic redemptive path, are needed more than ever. As we bear witness to a new bloom of antisemitism in nearly every country around the world, we are reminded of the dark realities of Jewish belonging in a global landscape. And for many as we enter this Chanukah season, the narratives of Chanukah may encourage us to turn inward and away from the encroaching, and even threatening, darkness. But there is another story of Chanukah, perhaps the very story we need this year and at this season.

Hugo Gryn was a teenager when the Nazis invaded his Ukrainian hometown, rounded up the Jews and deported them to Auschwitz. On the first night of Chanukah, as Hugo shivered in the barracks, he saw his father pull out a small tin cup with a small lick of butter at the bottom of it. He pulled a thread from his camp uniform, inserted it into the butter and proceeded to light it while reciting the Chanukah blessings under his breath. Hugo was outraged. Not because his father was endangering his life by lighting the Chanukah candles, an offense for which he could be shot on the spot. He found it simply impractical and asked his father how he could possibly waste a lick of butter that could provide much needed nutrition for their bodies,



by lighting it for Chanukah for just a few minutes.

His father looked him in the eye and said. "Hugo, if Auschwitz taught us anything, it is that a person can live for days without food but one cannot live for one moment without light." Light has the unique quality of being beneficial to one and all. If one person is holding a lit candle, everyone in close proximity benefits as well. In Auschwitz they learned to live without food, but the ability to care for and benefit others is an essential human need that even the harshest conditions should never diminish.

Over the last two months, the Jewish community has been moved and shaken to our core. We have witnessed the Land of Israel under attack, rising antisemitism in our country and beyond, college campuses rife with protests and fear mongering. This is a time when it may feel as though the darkness is growing more and more with each passing day.

However, the holiday of Chanukah reminds us that even in our darkest moments, we seek the light. Each night as we light our menorah, we increase light in our homes and in our world.

For some of us, it may be difficult to find the light that does exist. So instead of simply commemorating distant history this Chanukah, let the lights inspire you to understand that you have the unique ability to transform the darkness into a place of brilliance. Each night, I want to invite you to think about one thing that you are grateful for. From the first night of Chanukah to the last, each night offers one moment of thanks and gratitude so that you too can see the lights in your world. As Maimonides famously declared, even one single good deed, spoken word or thought can tip the scales and usher in an era of global peace and tranquility.

For thousands of years, the Jewish people have survived against all odds. If the story of Chanukah has taught us anything, it is that the resiliency and strength of the Jewish people is as strong today as it was during the time of the Maccabees. During this holiday season, our festival of lights, may each of us celebrate the lights in our own lives. May we be proud of our Jewishness, showing the world that we will remain a light unto the nations now and forever. Ashley, Eden, Jonathan and I wish you a Happy Chanukah, and invite you to light your menorahs in your windows to show everyone that passes by that the strength of the Jewish people is in our resiliency and our ability to bring light even in the darkest of times.

A Message From Life Long Learning Finding Light When the news around the



world is frightening, overwhelming, and dark, where can we find light? Among the many webinars I have attended over the past few months, regular advice includes suggestions to turn off or limit the amount of television news exposure, limit social media usage, maintain regular routines, and offer and accept hugs since physical affection even from pets can help us regulate emotions. All sound advice, but for me, I tend to be drawn back to the wisdom shared with me, in my childhood, from one of my greatest teachers, Mr. Rogers.

In 1983, Fred Rogers, in his book Mister Rogers Talks With Parents, explained that his mother was prompted to remind him about helpers after seeing disasters reported in newspapers and newsreels. "When I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, 'Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping." It is a truly beautiful sentiment which Mr. Rogers repeated several times within his writings and television show throughout the years. This framing of focus is especially wonderful to use with children. One can always find helpers, police, firefighters, medical care workers, or anyone else that chooses to make a positive difference with their actions.

In adulthood, when there are disasters and scary events in our world, I try to take Mr. Rogers advice a

step further and seek to find the good, by expanding beyond the idea of just looking to the helpers. I look to the Jewish value of Hakarat Hatov, recognizing the good, joys and positivity, the light within darkness.

As we are bombarded with the horrors and negativity of the war in Israel, finding the good may feel difficult. I wanted to share just a few lights that inspire me:

- Two days after the October 7 attack in Israel, Magan David Adom (The Red Star of David) called for blood donations for which hundreds of Israelis from all backgrounds came to donate, waiting up to 11 hours for an opportunity to give blood. More sites were opened and collections are still exceeding expectations.
- With many men and women called up for military service in Israel, most Palestinians not permitted to work now, and most of the Thai and other foreign workers having left Israel after the war began, the farms are desperately short on labor. Thousands of Israeli citizens are volunteering daily to work the fields and preserve the agricultural bounty.
- Two days after the attacks, Tomer Oshri, a 48 yearold history teacher and principal from Jerusalem called the Israeli Ministry of Education to ask how he could help. He was told to pack a sleeping bag and head down to the Dead Sea. Now he operates 17 different makeshift schools for survivors and evacuees from the Gaza border communities.

As Chanukah, the Festival of Light approaches, I challenge each of us to find our own comfort and sparks of inspiration. Please share them.
