# A Message From our Rabbinic Intern



## *The Rise in Antisemitism*

Adapting emotionally to the current climate of antisemitism in America has been an eye-opening experience for me as a third-year rabbinical student living in Brooklyn. As antisemitism spreads globally, including within the United States, I have consistently turned to Jewish wisdom, community, and Torah for guidance. Jewish tradition empowers me to find inner strength in combating hate and misinformation as a student of the Reform movement.

Understanding the history of antisemitism is crucial for anyone who cares about a Jewish person. Developing knowledge about antisemitic beliefs requires a personal, communal, national, and global historical perspective. Despite the pervasive and ancient nature of this hostility, Jewish tradition remains a source of safety and emotional grounding, for me, in a world rife with uncertainty and hate. Balancing personal hope for the future, with the harrowing realities of war, has now become a part of my learning as a rabbinical student.

The profound sadness stemming from the loss of human life in Israel also reminds Jewish communities worldwide of their sacred connection to the land. The increase in hate and antisemitism in my American homeland deepens my empathy for any family who is currently living in fear around the world.

*At its core, antisemitism is about hate, which manifests in different ways globally.*

Antisemitism is often described academically as a 'chimerical belief,' meaning it is a product of unchecked imagination. These beliefs lead those people with a limited understanding of Judaism or Israel to mistakenly believe they are championing a righteous cause through violence and destruction. The imaginary reality created by antisemitic beliefs is a stark distortion of the information and verifiable truth documented by our Jewish ancestors.

The Jewish people have long been afflicted by anti-semitism. The reminder of this enduring hate came sharply on October 7. In last month's Torah portion, Vayera; Exodus 12:49, states, 'There shall be one law for the native and the alien who dwells amongst you.' In Hebrew, 'law' is Torah תורה highlighting our scriptures' aim to unite people from diverse backgrounds through studying the Torah.

*As Jewish people and global citizens, we are all bound by the law. We must grapple with what it means to live Jewishly in America, both as natives and as those who now may feel alienated. Returning intentionally to Jewish tradition, with an open heart to learn has sustained our people for thousands of years.*

Responses to this resurgence of antisemitism will vary in every person. As a future leader of Reform Judaism, my work with Congregation Beth Emeth has helped me learn more about how a rabbinical voice steeped in Jewish knowledge is crucial for being present with people who are living in fear.

Whatever your proximity is to antisemitism today, I hope that you can feel free to come and speak with me about it the next time I see you around the synagogue. I remain committed to helping the people of this sacred American Jewish community continue to heal from the tremendous pain we have all suffered. I pray that in 2024, we can continue the enduring spiritual work of building peace in our hearts and our world.

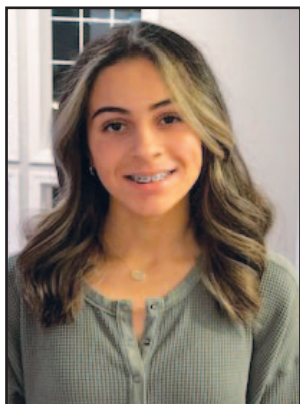

# URJ150 and The Israel Leadership Summit

In mid- December, I joined over 800 individuals from across North America in Washington, D.C. Originally planned as a celebration of our Reform Movement's storied 150 - year history, the barbaric October 7 Hamas attack on Israel, as well as the well-documented rise in world-wide acts of anti-semitism, necessitated both programmatic and tonal changes most appropriate to one of the most difficult times in Jewish history.

*Book-ended by beautiful, moving worship services, here are the highlights of the four days:*

- We learned about the shared values that undergird everything we do: Shared Humanity, Justice, Belonging, Learning, Evolving, Israel and Jewish Peoplehood. We were encouraged to practice creative thinking to put these values into action as well as how we can cultivate relationships and engage in constructive discussions that will help us move into the future.

- Second Gentleman, Douglas Emhoff, who is leading the Biden administration's fight against antisemitism, spoke. We also heard from students and staff on college campuses who talked about their experiences and responses to increased antisemitism. ADL and URJ staff talked about our partnership in *Kulanu: Synagogues in Action Against Antisemitism*. (We are so fortunate to have a Kulanu group, at CBE under the leadership of Jimmy Milstein and Andrea McNellis!) We were given guidance on how to listen and speak with others at this complicated moment.
- We were joined by the outstanding leaders of the Israeli Reform Movement. They shared how Israeli civic society, our Reform Movement and other denominations, are working to meet the unfathomable needs of the people at this unimaginable time. They reiterated their deep appreciation for how we, as the North American Reform Movement, and the USA, have been there for Israel and offered their understanding and support for us as we battle the devastating increase in antisemitism. We cemented our bonds with each other.
- We celebrated our Movement's history in story and song.
- We made new friends, strengthened on-going relationships and recommitted to the work ahead.

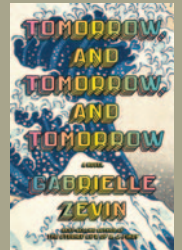

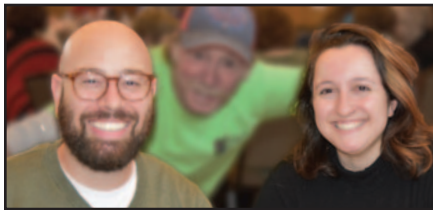
