## A Message From <u>Cantor Short</u>

## Happy New Year!



January 1, 2024 marks six months of serving Congregation Beth Emeth as your cantor. As we celebrate the secular new year, I am filled with gratitude and wonder for all we have accomplished in the last six months. Our community celebrated our first High Holy Days together, and even learned how to correctly roll a Torah (oops!)! We witnessed six amazing B'nai Mitzvah students become young Jewish adults, welcomed a multitude of beautiful babies into the covenant and supported our loved ones through moments of joy and sorrow. We experienced one of the greatest humanitarian, Jewish tragedies to date and will come out the other side, stronger and more hopeful. We have grown by over 25 member families in this very short time and continue to grow each day!

Folks often say, "new year, new me!", but I invite us to go a little deeper than this commonplace phrase. In Judaism, one of the first prayers uttered upon waking up is *Modeh Ani*, a prayer about gratitude for waking up another day. Our soul is born anew each and every day. So, instead of "new year, new me!", I encourage us to shift our mindset to "new day, new me!" We shouldn't wait for a new year to actively try to better ourselves and the world around us. We can draw our first conscious moments of breath in the morning, welcoming in another opportunity to make our world a better place. It doesn't have to be anything big or substantial, but little actions of mitzvot every day will add up. *Modeh Ani L'fanecha* - thank you God for returning my soul to me so I can continue to become a better version of myself for our world.

2024 holds a lot of big dreams and projects for our amazing community at Beth Emeth. We're looking to rebuild our 20s & 30s program, introduce a Jewish Basics education course, and so much more. 




