A Message From Cantor Short



Listen Closely

On the holiday of Passover, we ask ourselves - why is this night different from all other nights? We are encouraged to think deeper about our journey towards freedom and Jewish peoplehood. Now, as we head into the High Holy Days and the Jewish calendar year 5784, I ask myself a similar question. How might this upcoming year be different from the years before?

Here at Beth Emeth, our traditions are deeply rooted in legacy and history. As your new clergy team, Rabbi Weitzman and I are always looking to balance newness with the familiar. In my first month as cantor at Beth Emeth, I've already seen a glimpse of the beautiful heritage that you all take such pride in. Melodies that bring you comfort, prayers that touch your soul, and events that bring the whole community together as one Beth Emeth family. It is such a joy to witness this on a regular basis! Have no fear - the High Holy Days will be kept to the same standard of honoring tradition (yes, Avinu Malkeinu will absolutely be the one you know and love), while Rabbi Weitzman and I also add a little bit of newness. So, here's a little on what you can expect.

During Rabbi Emeritus Shpeen's wonderful tenure as Senior Rabbi of Beth Emeth, he read aloud the Rosh Hashanah Torah portion in both English and Hebrew. This year, we felt very strongly that all Torah read

during the High Holy Days be chanted with trope - more specifically, chanted with High Holy Day trope. *This means that the melodies you will hear while the Torah is being read will be different! The beauty and purpose of the Torah trope is to aid in the storytelling of our most ancient text.*

So, as you hear the new melody painting the picture of the Binding of Isaac, I invite you to close your eyes for a moment. Try following along with either Hebrew or English. How does the trope bring the text to life?

In addition to Torah being chanted in a new melody, we'll also hear some of our regular Shabbat prayers chanted differently. Just like there is a different trope melody for the High Holy Days, there are also different melodies for our common, everyday prayers. The music we use to sing these prayers is called *nusach* (pronounced new-sach). *Nusach* exists for every type of Jewish service, ranging from Shabbat morning to Shabbat evening, from weekday mornings to the High Holy Days. On both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur this year, you will hear the High Holy Day *nusach* and melodies used for prayers, such as the *Amidah*, the *Sh'ma*, *B'rosh Hashanah*. This is meant to call your attention to the question of "why is this time of year different from others" and "how might this new year be different from the ones before".

As we head into the most sacred time of our Jewish calendar, I invite you all to welcome newness, embrace tradition, and listen for moments that surprise you.

As Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel once said, "prayer is our humble answer to the inconceivable surprise of living."

A Message From Life Long Learning

The 18x18 Framework

Jewish Education is in a state of constant evolution. In every age we are faced with difficult questions such as, "how can we (best) prepare the rising generation of Jewish youth for effective adult citizenship and participation in our ever-changing North American Jewish community and civilization?" In an effort to address the changing needs of learners and Jewish Education, in 2022, the NYU Applied Research Collective (ARC) for American Jewry, released a guiding framework, to reconceptualize the aims and means of developing Jewish knowledge, sensibilities, values, and commitments among the rising generation of American Jews, ages 5-18. I have been studying this newly visioned framework, to update our own learning goals at the Einhorn Center for Jewish Education.

Using backwards planning, the ARC began with their ideal outcomes, what they deemed to be the "18 Jewish Things a Young Jew Should Know, Care About, and Be Able to Do by Age 18".

Among the 18 aspirational statements of desired outcomes for the Jewish education enterprise, these are the 10, that I believe, are most core to our Congregation Beth Emeth community.

Raised within our community, Young Jews Should Know, Care About, and Be Able to:

1. Feel connected to Jews around the world
2. Have Jewish friends
3. Engage with Jewish role models and personalities
4. Participate in the Kehillah (Jewish Community)
5. Appreciate Tikkun Olam (repairing the world) as a core Jewish value and perform acts of Gemilut Chasadim (giving of loving-kindness)
6. Care about and connect with Israel
7. Be able to identify critical issues facing American Jewry and be motivated to act on them
8. Understand the meanings and performance of Jewish Mitzvot (commandments)
9. Participate in various Jewish rituals, customs, holidays, and life cycle events, and appreciate their history and meaning
10. Comprehend and utilize Hebrew words and other Jewish terminology

What do you think about this list - what might you add or deprioritize? As a community, what experiences can we create to maximize the Jewish sparks we are igniting?

Rosh Hashanah is always a time of reflection, growth, and change. This year my thoughts are focused on the notion of the entire world being a campus of Jewish learning for our children, enhanced by, but not limited to, religious school hours or the synagogue building.

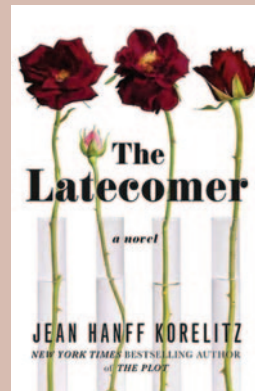

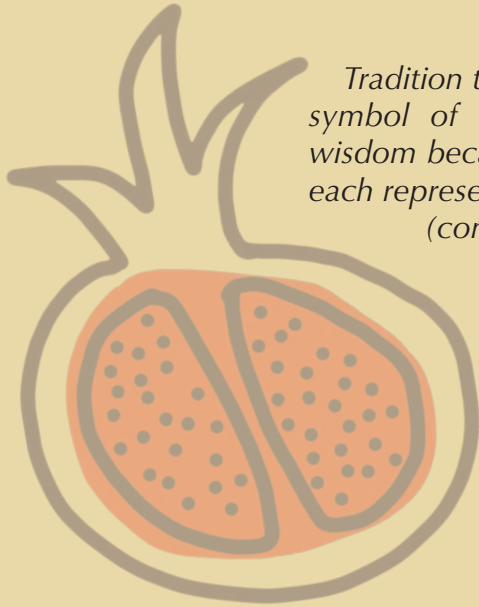

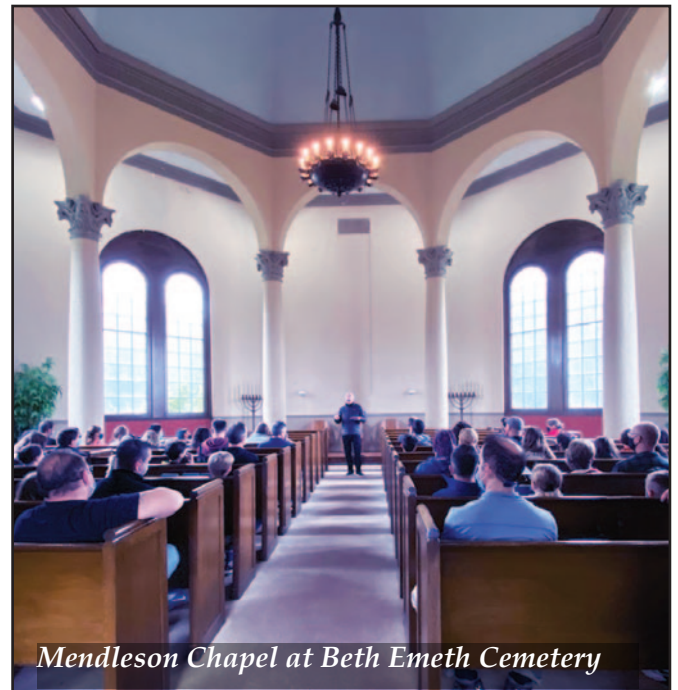
