A Message From our Clergy

The Times They Are a-Changin'



In 1964, I was seven years old when Bob Dylan first introduced his famous folk song, "The Times They Are a-Changin.'" It became a classic "camp song" that is indelibly etched in my summer experiences growing up at the URJ Camp Harlam in the Poconos.

Come gather 'round people
Wherever you roam
And admit you have grown
And accept it that soon
You'll be drenched to the bone
If your time to you is worth savin'
And you better start swimmin'
Or you'll sink like a stone
For the times they are a-changin'.....

Through those lyrics, Dylan wrote a song that defined a generation in his attempt to create an anthem of change for the times in which he was living, the turbulent 60's. His ultimate message was about embracing the changes we face in life, or we will "sink like a stone."

During my Rosh Hashanah Morning Sermon this year, I spoke about our coping with the many changes we face in our lives today. Not only the changes we encounter in our personal lives especially as they have been impacted by the COVID pandemic these past few years, but also the many changes we see happening in the world around us, not all of which are always positive. We have no control over the changes that occur. We DO have control over how we can best cope with them and how we can better work to make this world safer, kinder and more equitable for all.

This is, indeed, also a year of significant change within our Beth Emeth community. This past summer we welcomed Rabbi Weitzman and his beautiful family to our congregation and thus began the transition process in his becoming our new Senior Rabbi and my upcoming retirement in June as I bring my 38 year tenure at Beth Emeth to its conclusion. Rabbi Weitzman has already begun to make a mark in our community as I know that his warmth, his spirit, and his love for

Judaism will continue to touch those with whom his path crosses in every sphere of temple life. I have enjoyed our working together thus far to ease that transition and in supporting his rabbinate now at Beth Emeth.

As part of the agreed transition process, I am going to be finishing up my accrued sabbatical time and spending the next three months in Florida. During that time, I will once again be hosting our Annual Beth Emeth Shabbat in Boca on January 28, during which Rabbi Weitzman and Ashley will be joining us in celebration of the 30th anniversary of the Boca event and the 185th anniversary of our beloved Beth Emeth, as the "fourth oldest Reform congregation in America." The time that I will be away will enable Rabbi Weitzman to further "spread his wings" and truly begin to take over the day-to-day management of our congregational life.

I look forward to returning to Albany in the spring as we continue to celebrate our 185th anniversary with special services and programs and then wrapping up my rabbinic career in June. I feel so very fortunate that I will be retiring while we are marking this very significant anniversary in the life of our congregation.

Yes, the "times they are a-changin'." Although any type of change can be stressful, it is also an opportunity to look ahead with a renewed sense of hope, and a reinvigorated vision for the future and all that it promises to hold for us individually and as a community.

For the times they are a changin'

The summer warmth is but a faded memory. The magnificent autumn leaves have now all fallen as the air has become cooler and crisper. The days are getting darker as we will soon celebrate the joyous festival of Chanukah. It is my hope and my prayer that as our *Chanukiyah* illuminates the darkness of the winter season, that it brings joy and a sense of renewed faith to our lives especially as we navigate the many changes thrust upon us each and every day. May the lights of our Menorah burn brightly within our hearts fortifying us with the spirit to see those changes as opportunities and to look forward to all that is on the horizon.

From my home to yours, my family joins me in wishing you a *Chag Urim Samayach*, a very happy and healthy Chanukah celebration!



Kathy's Corner

Making a Difference ... after



Last month I reported at our Board of Trustees Meeting that we received a bequest from a member who had died last year.

I would like to share the story of the bequest's donor, Larry Segel. Larry joined Beth Emeth just a few years ago, just after he had turned 80 years old. Raymond Naar, a congregant, had met him at the Albany JCC, and thought Larry would enjoy our Lunch & Learn series, so he invited him. Larry attended Lunch & Learn several times and then came in to meet with me to discuss becoming a member. He explained that he had not belonged to a temple his entire adult life because the cost was always prohibitive. I empathized with Larry, as he had a strong Jewish identity and shared with him our Beth Emeth policy of never turning anyone away based on their ability to pay. We discussed what his modest Commitment would be and Larry was most appreciative to belong to a synagogue again, something he had not done since he was a teenager in Amsterdam, NY.

On our application form, we ask what two things are most important to you about becoming a Beth Emeth member. Larry's answer: 1. A Jewish Place of Worship and 2. Meeting People.

What Larry gained from his short time as a CBE member was a Jewish sense of belonging - a community, people who delivered things to him during COVID and clergy who checked in on him when he became ill.

Perhaps Larry noticed our LIFE & LEGACY sign when he entered the building about "ensuring Jewish futures." Larry never discussed with me that he had bequeathed a gift to Beth Emeth and, unfortunately, he never knew of our appreciation for it. CBE is entering our 5th year working with Jewish Federation of NENY as part of the Grinspoon Foundation's LIFE & LEGACY program. The Einhorn Center Sharing our Light

One reason I love December is because of the joyous holiday of Chanukah, the Festival of Lights. It is a beautiful holiday, a time when we come together in celebration as a family and as a community, sharing food and fun.

There is a lesser known Talmudic teaching about Chanukah which I have found inspiring and wish to share. Most often when we talk about Talmud discussions we reference Hillel and Shammai. This particular argument features another, zug, a pair of Rabbinic Sages who sharpened their wits against one another, Rav and Shmuel, two of the greatest sages of the third century.

As is customary, we light our Chanukah candles today using a *shamash*, a helper candle to light the others, so we are not lighting our candles in an ordinary manner. Rav and Shmuel ask the question, if one does not have a *shamash*, can you take one of the other Chanukah lights to light another?

Rav says, no! He felt it was as if one were to pour some of their beverage into a cup to give to another, the amount of the first would be diminished. Furthermore, inevitably one would spill some of the wax or oil in this act and therefore diminish the light of the first candle. We are not permitted to diminish holiness.

Shmuel disagreed and felt the lighting of one candle to another is absolutely permissible. Shmuel reasoned, if one has knowledge that they share with others, it in no way diminishes their knowledge, if anything the knowledge in spreading, increases. So too, is the case with the light of the candles.

In the hundreds of recorded discussions of Rav and Shmuel, there are only three cases in which the law follows Shmuel and this is one of them!

Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks took this teaching of Shmuel and extended it even further. He taught that we, as Jews, have a responsibility to use our flames of faith to light the candles of others. Sharing our faith creates more and greater Jewish light in the world around us. As he said, "when it comes to spiritual goods as opposed to material goods, the more I share, the more I have. Sharing our knowledge, faith, or love with others only extends and grows our own."

In this season, may we each find ways to share our spirit and extend the joy, hope, love and lights of Chanukah. Shara Siegfeld, Director of Life Long Learning
