

Immigration

Rose Ashford and Jenny Kaupp went to Arizona to work with Arizona Jews for Justice in July 2019.

“We saw the “drop” of about 30 migrants at a local church. They were from Guatemala, Russia and, I think, Honduras. They were mostly women and children, with a few dads. They arrived looking overwhelmed and tired. They got snacks and an orientation in Spanish from Eddie. Then showers, toys for the kids, clothing as needed, lots more food and finally help to get them where they needed to go. All the migrants had relatives in the US, so this involved timetables and rides to train stations and airports, and most of all, money.

Jenny and I made signs saying ‘Bienvenidos Amigos’ which we held up as the migrants disembarked from the bus. We then helped serve food and play with the children.

The volunteers were amazing, and I listened to several stories. AZ Jews4Justice gets many donations in small backpacks. These backpacks are then repacked with child-suitable items and given to the children.”
