Jews, non-affiliated Jews, reform Jews, cultural Jews, progressive Jews, bu-Jews...the list continues.

If someone were to ask us how we define ourselves as Jews, we might add quite a few descriptions to describe our Jewish identities. It's complicated. When asked if they are Jewish I've even heard some people say that they are Jewish on their

parents' side.

In our synagogue we work hard to make room for everyone who wants to identify with us. We provide a wide range of opportunities for people to connect with Jewish education, spirituality and prayer, social justice pursuits grounded in our Jewish values and life cycle observance—just to name a few.

For the most part, our parents were raised by immigrants who came to this country and dealt with the tension between assimilation and preservation of their Jewish identities. But as time has passed we now find ourselves more comfortable and we have more choice about how we live as Jews in this pluralistic society. Because we now have the freedom to choose how we

identify as Jews, this identity can be auite fluid.

As we prepare for this year's Jewish Cultural Festival I encourage us all to think about how we can reflect the diversity of Jewish identity. Our Cultural Festival is an opportunity to celebrate our culture but it is also an opportunity to educate the larger Santa Cruz community about who we are. 

TEMPLE SCHOOL NEWS




Rabbi Shifra
