Rosh Hashanah—A Time to Re-Member

As the High Holidays approach, we are invited into the sacred opportunity of reimagining who we want to be in the New Year. The

name "Rosh Hashanah" is not used in the Torah. Instead we find Rosh Hashanah called Yom Hazikkaron (the day of remembrance) and Yom Teruah (the day of the sounding of the shofar). In the Torah, the beginning of the New Year was set at the first of the month of Nisan, (which coincides with spring time) where we read a description of the first Passover. The first of Nisan celebrated the creation of the Jewish nation through the redemption of our people from Egypt.

It's simple enough to understand why Rosh Hashanah would be called Yom Teruah—because one of our most powerful rituals is hearing the blast of the shofar. But why Yom Hazikaron?

One image we find in the High

Holiday prayers is of God as the Judge of our past deeds. One could make the case that on Rosh Hashanah, God remembers what we have done and takes an account of our lives. And I think there is another possibility.

As the New Year approaches we are being asked to examine who we are and what we are. Maybe we are being invited into the process of letting go of the trivial details, the daily irritations and challenges of our lives, and remembering the essential nature of who we truly are and how we aspire to behave. Yom Hazikaron-Rosh Hashanah is a time to reflect upon the values, relationships and activities that are most important in our lives. If we take the word "remember" apart and understand that we can re-member, it's as if we are putting ourselves back together again, hitting the reset button and becoming more whole.

As we approach this New Year, 5778, may the shofar call us to remember who we truly are.
