Parsha Table Talk

Dvar Torah shared by Uri Schneider

The Torah tells us that when the angels come to Sdom to save Lot, "Vayitmahmah" (Genesis 19:16), Lot kept on delaying his exit from the city. Rashi explains that Lot wanted to save his money. The angels tell Lot that this is no time to be concerned about his wealth as it is enough that he gets to live. Was it wrong of Lot to try and save his wealth? We see many examples of our Avot caring about their wealth, such as Yitzchak with his wells and Yaakov risking his life for some measly vessels. So what did Lot do wrong? When Lot originally chose to dwell in Sdom he traveled "M'Kedem", which the Midrash explain as leaving "Kadmono Shel Olam," meaning G-d. Indeed, after Lot makes his decision to move to Sdom, the Torah then tells us that the citizens of Sdom were tremendously evil to people and God, "Raim Ve'Chataim La'Hashem Meod" (Genesis 13:13). Onkeles elaborates that this means they sinned with their money and with their bodies. Lot had made a poor decision, solely focused on the physical pleasure that comes with wealth. He disregarded utilizing his wealth for nobler causes. The Avot, however, utilized their money for spiritual gains or things that lead to spiritual growth. May we all be zocheh to a wealth that we utilize and allocate properly towards spiritual means.


