#### A MESSAGE FROM RABBI DOV FOXBRUNNER

There is an old Yiddish saying that during the month of Elul, even the fish in the sea are trembling due to the coming Days of Judgement. The aphorisms of Jewish Bubbies are so often steeped in Torah truths. What does this one mean?

If we were to take a trip to the Georgia Aquarium, what would we see? Would we find the largest collection of fish in the United States trembling in fear? Are the dolphins shuddering in trepidation as they perform their famous feats of agility and grace? Is the whale-shark cowering in the corner of his massive habitat?



While it is true that our eyes give us vision, it is our mind and consciousness that inform what our eyes take in and how it is interpreted. Visitors who have entered our magnificent Shul often comment on different elements. Some look up and comment on the soaring dome and its warm, yellow glow; some look down and comment on the tasteful carpeting and carefully placed seats; some look ahead at expert millwork with its stately tones and shapes; others see the fine details as they pour over our professional advertising of various classes and events. The mind tells the eyes what to see. With this insight, we can understand that perhaps it isn't the fish who are trembling, rather, it is us. This time of year, the attuned Jewish mind is taken over by the Days of Awe that are fast approaching and all the awesome opportunity and meaning that fills them.

The fish analogy can also provide us with comfort and direction. The English language is rich with exact terminology. Every grouping of animals has a different name. A herd of cows, a clutch of chickens, a gaggle of geese, a convocation of eagles. Fish swim in schools. Why? Fish learn to swim together in full synchronization to protect themselves from predators. As we look at the concerned fish, we can learn a lesson. We can gain protection by synchronizing ourselves with our community. This time of year gives us more togetherness than any other. We increase in kindness, in acts of charity, in harmonized Tefillah, in communal Teshuva. Yes, our eyes take in all the above aesthetic enhancements, but above all, it is the special holy Jews, the convocation of the committed, synchronized in their earnest service of Hashem, that we are so thankful to behold.

May we find ourselves thankfully caught in Hashem's safety net together for a year full of blessings and spiritual growth as individuals and as a community.
