- Our prayers, charity, and acts of kindness serve as a source of merit for our departed forbears and loved ones, even as their memory continues to inspire us.

THOSE CONGREGANTS WHOSE PARENTS ARE BOTH LIVING DO NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE YIZKOR SERVICE, BUT LEAVE THE SYNAGOGUE AND RETURN WHEN THE CONGREGATION BEGINS AV HARACHAMIM, AT THE END OF YIZKOR.

ALTHOUGH THE FOLLOWING VERSES ARE NOT PART OF THE TRADITIONAL YIZKOR SERVICE, SOME CONGREGATIONS HAVE ADOPTED THE CUSTOM OF RECITING THEM RESPONSIVELY BEFORE YIZKOR.

The ancient custom of remembering the souls of the departed and contributing to charity in their memory is rooted in the fundamental Jewish belief in the eternity of the soul. When physical life ends, only the body dies, but the soul ascends to the realm of the spirit where

it regularly attains higher levels of purity and holiness.

When this life is over, the soul can no longer perform good deeds; that method of attaining merit is the sole province of mortal man, who must struggle with the baseness and selfishness of his animal nature. But there is a way

that the disembodied soul can derive new sources of merit. History is a continuum. If we, the living, give charity or do good deeds due to the lasting influence or in memory of a departed parent or other loved one, the merit is truly that of the soul in its spiritual realm. Moreover, God in His mercy credits our deed to the departed one

because he or she too would have done the same – were it possible. But mere intentions do not suffice; only accomplishment can achieve this purpose. The intention to give and the fulfillment of that intention are both necessary.

The original custom was to recall the names of the departed and to pledge charity on their

Shalom Sofer (63) “Shalom was a warm-hearted person who helped everybody,” said one of the residents of the Kedumim settlement where Sofer lived. “He started a business in the settlement and employed quite a few at-risk youths and helped those who dropped out of school.”

November 15, 2022/21 Cheshvan 5783

Tamir Avihai (50), Michael Ladygin (36), Motti Ashkenazi (59)

Tamir Avihai, a father of six, was from Kiryat Netafim in Judea and Samaria. “He was an inseparable part of the community,” Samaria Regional Council head Yossi Dagan said. “Tamir was a bright person with a face full of goodness and a desire to help other people. A man of kindness, a Zionist in his entire being. Always, when I would meet him, he would greet me with his broad smile. Everyone he knew loved him. The bright and happy flower was picked by the malicious hand of barbarians.”

“We embrace Michael’s family, who immigrated to Israel five years ago. We are prepared to give his wife and two children full support also through the education system,” said Bat Yam’s Mayor Zvika Brot.

Motti Ashkenazi is survived by his wife, three children, and two grandchildren. “Motti was a loving person, full of joy, an exemplary husband, and a family man with a huge soul who always loved to help everyone,” his family said.

November 23/29 Cheshvan

Aryeh Schupak (16) mortally wounded in the bomb attack as he waited for the school bus to take him to class. Rabbi Naftali Schreiber, the principal of his school, said: "There were witnesses to his greatness. There is no one, in his whole year, his whole class, who can say that during the years he was with them that there was ever anger in Aryeh ... He would walk on the street helping every person he could."

November 27/3 Kislev

Tadesa Tashuma (50) Twenty-one years ago, Tadesa Tashuma z"l left Ethiopia to lead a better life in Israel. "He always strengthened and supported everyone, he received everyone with love and warmth. He always volunteered to help. It crushed the family," Jerusalem mayor Moshe Lion said. "He was such a special and rare human being whose life exemplified Zionism, love of country, a love for Jerusalem." Tashuma, who was in his 50s, leaves behind a wife and six children. He worked as a senior jeweler in a wonderful project for Ethiopian olim known as Megemeria, which empowers Ethiopian immigrants by equipping them with the skills needed to achieve financial independence.

January 27/ 5 Shevat Friday night shooting

Asher Natan z"l (14) "No one can describe the terrible pain of parents who have to bury their son." **Elyahu (Eli) Mizrahi** z"l, 48, and **Natalie Mizrahi** z"l, 45, a married couple, rushed to the scene of the attack to help after hearing gunshots. They were married just two years ago and lived in east Jerusalem.

Ilya Sosansky (25) "You're magic. You're all smiles. A kind soul who does good. My heart is crushed"

Irina Korolova z"l, 59, a citizen of Ukraine who worked in Israel as a caretaker.

Shaul Hai (68) Gabbai of his Shul. He was killed leaving Friday night dinner on his way to a shiur at his Shul.

Raphael Ben Eliyahu 56, a postal worker and the father of three.

February 2/11 Shevat

Shimon Maatuf had been employed as a security guard at an amusement park set up for celebrations on Independence Day when the attack took place on May 5, 2022. The terrorists killed Yonatan Havakuk, Boaz Gol and Oren Ben-Yiftach, and

left four people seriously wounded, including Maatuf. Maatuf is survived by six children and 13 grandchildren.

February 10/19 Shevat

Yaakov Yisrael Paley (6), Asher Menachem Paley (8) The boys' 16-year-old brother, Tzvika, said: "Ushi, Yaakov, every week at this time, you come home with Father. It's a smile on your face, it's the happiness that you are thanking Gd for sanctifying his name. I was with you during your final moments, now you're in a high place. Gd will give us the strength to continue." Alter Shlomo Lederman, was a 20-year-old rabbinical student who had been married for two months. He and his wife were on their way to his parents' home for Shabbat.

Hillel Yaniv z"l, (21), and Yigal Yaniv z"l, (19) Hillel was set to start the recruitment process for combat service in the IDF soon. A friend of his said, "I didn't admire too many people in my life, but I admired Hillel. He always knew the right thing to do, transmitting confidence and peace to his friends. From the first moment, it was clear that this was a special guy, self-confident, eloquent, a leader and a good friend."

Yigal, who was to turn 20 in two weeks, was eulogized by Sagi Ben Lisha, director of his yeshiva, "Yigal was the salt of the earth, a beautiful boy inside and out and the first to volunteer when needed ... He was sweet and serious, a generous and beloved guy who was always happy to help with a kind eye and a willing soul."

February 27/ 6 Adar

Elan Ganeles (26) Lone soldier, saxophone player, honors student, volunteer, son, brother, friend. Raised in Connecticut, and a graduate of Columbia University, the dual American-Israeli citizen was described by so many as quiet and loyal, smart and talented, kind, and down to earth. "He was the kind of guy you could call, and you'd be sure he'd pick up and have a few minutes to talk if you needed something," said Rabbi Yehuda Drizin of Chabad at Columbia University.

March 9/16 Adar

Or Eshkar (32) "Eshkar showered nothing but goodness, love and giving on everyone who crossed his path," his mother said in a statement shared by the

hospital. She thanked medical staff, family, friends and “all the people of Israel who were with us, who strengthened us, supported us and prayed.”

March 12/19 Adar

Hadar Noga Lavi, z”l, 2-years-old, was buried a week after being critically wounded in a deliberate head-on crash.

April 7/16 Nisan and April 11/20 Nisan Chol Hamoad Pesach

Lucy (48), Rina (15), Maia (20) Dee Efrat Rabbi Yair Binstock eulogized Lucy, who was an English teacher, as “the first address for everything. An amazing educator. Everyone who came into contact with her family saw it right away — a benevolent woman who opened her home to all, simply an angel.”

Rabbi Leo Dee eulogized his two daughters, saying, “My beautiful perfect Maia, we named you ‘God’s water’ and you were so many people’s friend, flowing between so many different groups. You were always an angel, now you will always be our guardian angel.”

Addressing Rina, he described her as a dedicated student and friend, and a responsible person who others relied upon and trusted. “You would tidy the youth club for hours by yourself. People loved you and knew they could depend on you”.

Inga Avramyan Inga, 82, was killed by a rocket fired by Palestinian Islamic Jihad during a flareup in violence between Israel and Gaza known as Operation Shield and Arrow. She served as a caregiver to Sergei, who had limited mobility since a car accident left him partially paralyzed and with a leg amputated. Inga was killed as she was trying to help Sergei reach shelter after the air raid siren went off. Inga and Sergei immigrated from Yerevan in Armenia around 30 years ago.

May 30/10 Sivan

Meir Tamari (32) “You were supposed to be 32-years-old today. Instead of wishing you a happy birthday, I am now alone with the children,” said Tal Tamari as she fought back tears.

May 31/11 Sivan

Chana Finer Nachenberg, z”l, died two decades after a Palestinian suicide bomber detonated a nail bomb and destroyed the Sbarro restaurant in the heart of the

tourist area in Jerusalem, leaving Chana in a vegetative state at 31-years-old. The brutal act of terror that killed 15 and wounded 140 innocent civilians that day left Chana in a coma and her two-year-old daughter, Sarah, motherless. Sarah was one of the few to survive the attack unwounded. Chana was laid to rest in an incredibly emotional funeral that ended 22 years of extraordinary agony for her family. Chana's daughter, Sarah, said at the funeral: "Dear mother, I know how much you loved me and I love you too, and even though I've missed you for 22 years, now I feel as if everything is starting from the beginning."

June 3/14 Sivan

Staff Sgt. Ohad Dahan (20) Sgt. Lia Ben Nun (19) and Staff Sgt. Ori Yitzhak Iluz (20) Sgt. Ben Nun, and Staff Sgt. Ori Yitzhak Iluz. Iluz served as combat soldiers in the Bardelas Battalion. Dahan served in the Caracal Battalion.

Lia Ben Nun's former teacher characterized her as "a wonderful, sweet, funny, beautiful, eternally optimistic girl who was always with friends. She was the glue that held all the friends together."

St.-Sgt. Uri Itzhak Ilouz was from Safed. "A heavy and terrible sadness has befallen the city. There are no words that can comfort parents burying their child, no words that can explain the unimaginable pain," said Safed Mayor Shuki Ohana.

St.-Sgt. Ohad Dahan was from Ofakim. He was one of the three soldiers who engaged the terrorist in a firefight, ultimately killing him. "He was educated to love the country and care for the state. He was an outstanding student and always helped everyone. He will stay young forever," said Dahan's cousin Noam. Dahan's partner, Dana Salita, paid tribute to him: "Everyone who knows me knows how much I would talk about you everywhere, how proud I was of you ... I was waiting for you to call, to tell me about your heroism. You were my strength. I have no words. I came in uniform today, you always said that our uniform is a privilege."

June 20/1 Tammuz

Harel Massoud, Elisha Antman, Ofer Feirman, Nachman Shaul Mordoff (15)

Harel Masoud's mother, Yael, eulogized him and said, "This past Shabbat you came to visit, but actually you came to say goodbye without meaning to. You only just blossomed. Your eyes spoke quietly, humbly," she added, "everyone was dazzled by your beauty, inner and outer."

The head of the Binyamin Regional Council, Israel Ganz, paid tribute to Elisha,

"Elisha, I saw you today for the first time. On your face was a smile and a special glow. Your face told us to continue, to act, to grow despite the enormous pain. At the meeting with your parents, we saw your deep roots, roots of faith and power and they are the source of our strength."

Ofer Fairman moved with his family to the Eli yishuv several years ago. He was a neighbor and close friend of city council member Rabbi Yossi Goldhirsh, who said, "This was a really special man - he used to clean the area and pick up litter in the street, and in the parks. Ofer would always organize the refreshments at the street's Vaad meetings and was a kind of chairman of the street Vaad."

Ofer raised an exemplary family and was a man of kindness to the core, always giving with a smile and lots of love, regardless of your religious affiliation. I sat with him for many hours in his home and discovered a special man with a huge heart. When he left the neighborhood, the whole street felt like one of their family members had left. My heart aches for his passing.... It is a big loss for us all."

Nachman Mordoff was a resident of the town of Ahiya. His mother Ora Mordoff said, "My heart has been shattered to pieces ... He was not yet 16 years old. He was a child with a lot of energy and joy, a child who loved the Land of Israel and the People of Israel. He only wanted to do good. Before anything, for everyone, and not for himself. My heart is broken. He saw into the heart of a person and not just what was outside."

July 5/16 Tammuz

Chief Sgt. David Yehuda Yitzchak (23)

"Be good, just good, without bells and whistles, without making anyone crazy, just be a good person" From the writings of David Yehudah Yitzchak who was killed on July 6th, as the IDF was pulling out of Jenin. Thousands of family members, friends and other mourners accompanied the young soldier, who was a resident of the Beit El settlement, to his final resting place on Mount Herzl. He was described as having a heart of gold and even after joining the army he continued to volunteer with a young man with special needs.

His father, Moshe, mourned his son, saying, "You saw people's distress as if it were your own. You touched the hearts of everyone and always strived to say the truth." His brother Eitan cried as he eulogized his brother. "I learned what charity and giving meant from you. You were so modest and humble ... You taught all of us what dedication means."

July 6/17 Tammuz

Staff Sgt. Shiloh Yosef Amir (22) Hundreds of people attended his funeral on Mount Herzl today. His mother, Orly, mourned him, "My heart refuses to believe [the news] ... You taught us what love is. You understood your mission and you stuck with it. Nothing will ever be the same again." Amir's commander eulogized the fallen soldier, saying: "You were always the first to volunteer ... You were a man of truth, loved by your friends. You dealt with challenges with great humility ... I salute you for the final time."

Tel Aviv, August 5/18 Av

Chen Amir, 42-year-old municipal security guard, survived by his wife Vered and three daughters. "Chen is the most amazing person in the world. He is an amazing husband. He is a wonderful father to three daughters," Vered Assayag Amir told reporters outside the family's home in Bat Yam, the day after her husband was killed. "I always knew he'd be the first to [engage an assailant]," she added. "In all the previous terrorist attacks, he was always the first to run and search and help. He has a closet full of thank you certificates. He saved lives, he saved people."

19 August / 2 Elul

Shay Silas Nigreker, 60, and his 28-year-old son **Aviad Nir**, residents of Ashdod were shot and killed in a terror attack in the northern West Bank town of Huwara. "In life and death they did not part... Shay Silas was warm-hearted, happy, with a sense of humor and a huge heart, and his son Aviad inherited his personality traits and his values and was a good person who was always ready to help," said Ashdod Mayor Yehiel Lasry.

21 August/4 Elul

Batsheva Nigri (40) The Efrat local council said in a statement that it "lowers its head over the murder of Batsheva Nigri and turns to the home of the Ravid family from Efrat. Batsheva, who grew up in Efrat, is the mother of three daughters and was a kindergarten teacher appreciated and loved by the children and the parents." Efrat Mayor Oded Revivi said, "Our hearts go out together with the Ravid family, there are no words that can express our sorrow and how much the children who were expecting to see the kindergarten teacher they loved so much will also miss her."
