

• A Message from Rabbi Etan Mintz:

This past week, I read a terribly disturbing article about an anti-Semitic attack at the Abravanel Synagogue in Paris. A mob of protesters tried to break in and harm those praying peacefully, injuring two members of the Jewish community and six police officers and keeping hundreds of hostages for hours. After reaching out to the community with my colleague Rabbi Shmuel Herzfeld to express our concerns, we were invited to speak to the community on Shabbat morning and to offer words of support and solidarity.

This is not the first time Jews in Paris have been terrified by antisemitism, which is escalating at an alarming rate in France. Especially troubling is that the protesters were coming from an anti-Israel rally.

There are those who argue that being anti-Zionist does not equal being anti-Jewish. Make no mistake, anti-Zionist attacks are attacks on all Jews, whether in Jerusalem, Paris, or Baltimore. It is also an attack on all good and peace-loving people. It is important to share with the Jewish community in Paris that we, their brothers and sisters, stand united with them. When someone is attacking your sibling, you don't stand idly by. Similarly, we will be there in solidarity for our brothers and sisters whether in France, Israel, or anywhere else in the world.

I would like to bring letters of solidarity from our community in Baltimore to the community in Paris. Please e-mail me atRabbiMintz@bnaiisraelcongregation.orgwith your words of support so that I can personally deliver them.

I look forward to sharing with you next Shabbat about the solidarity mission and greetings from our brothers and sisters in Paris.
