Dear Beth Radom Family and Friends,

I hope that this letter finds you and your families healthy and well. As we adapt to the restrictions related to the second wave of Covid-19, I am continuing to keep you updated on how we, the Beth Radom leadership, are working to ensure the very best for you, our congregational family.



As promised, we have been working through the process of returning to Shabbat Services. Due to Toronto being in the lockdown phase, we have decided to create an online Shabbat morning service that will bring us all 'together' once again. Thanks to the wonder of Zoom and our new camera system, our Saturday morning services will be just like being there live!

Starting next Shabbat (Dec 5th), full virtual Shabbat morning services will be offered live from our sanctuary and available for anyone.

There are two ways to be part of the service:

### 1. Participate via Zoom.

- Two-way communication.
- You WILL count in the minyan.
- You MUST have both video and microphone on at all times.
  - You will be a live participant in the service, just as if we were all in a room together. Please ensure that you participate from a quiet space and ensure that all electronics are turned off.
  - If your background becomes noisy, our technician may need to mute you but he will be unable to unmute you remotely. Please see the link below for instructions on how to handle this situation.

- One-way communication.
- You will NOT count in the minyan.
- You will NOT have video or microphone

In this week's e-mail Shabbat Sheet, links will be provided, and at 9:30am on Saturday morning, a non-Jewish technician will be monitoring the zoom link and admit everyone into the Zoom room for the service. The recording will be available on the Youtube channel to view at any time after the service is over.
