Tzitzit-

A Reminder of What is Common to us All

For years, I used to watch my fellow hebrew school classmates drop their kippot on the ground after chasing each other or horsing around during class.. For whatever reason, when the kippa would fall to the ground, the student would stop whatever it was they were doing, pick it up and give it a kiss before putting it back on their head. There was an underlying understanding that a kippa was a 'holy' object, and by kissing it and putting it back on our heads, we were showing respect to God.

When I was a little older and began to learn about the origin of the talit, I learned that there was indeed, biblical reference for wearing this item of ritual clothing. In fact, the talit and the t'filin are really the only ritual items mentioned in the Torah. The kippa was merely a head covering (much like a hat) that particular Jewish communities encouraged everyone to wear to distinguish themselves from others in the community.

Regardless of which type of talit one choses to wear, what is most important is what the "tzitzit" or fringes represent. This is quite evident in this week's parsha. As Ellen Frankel teaches us in her book, "The Five Books of Miriam", "The eight strings and five knots [of the tzitzit] added together equal thirteen, the numerical value of the final word of the Sh'ma, ehad, meaning one. So when we look upon the fringes, we are reminded of the unity of God and all that is holy."
