I would also like to give a special thank you to Dr. Bill Cass, who puts in countless hours, phone calls, emails and correspondence to ensure that this service is such a success.

There is a wonderful song, written by the late Debbie Friedman z"l which talks about the experience of Miriam and the women after the Israelites crossed the Red Sea. It teaches us that Miriam, our first female prophet, was a true leader among the Israelites. She had a vision and a plan and she saw the potential in all human kind. May we all be inspired to be like Miriam and to be leaders within our own communities.

"And Miriam the Prophet took her timbrel in her hand, And all the women followed her just as she had planned.

And Miriam raised her voice with song. She sang with praise and might, We've just lived through a miracle, we're going to dance tonight."

And the women dancing with their timbrels Followed Miriam as she sang her song Sing a song to the One whom we've exalted. Miriam and the women danced and danced the whole night long."
