Rabbi Weinstock's Message

Some Thoughts on Celebrating Purim During An Eit Tzarah

his past Simchat Torah we were in shock at the news

of the tragedy that had just occurred (and was still occurring) in Israel; the worst massacre of Jews since the Holocaust. We were at a loss of how to react and how to respond. We didn't know how we could or should observe Simchat Torah. Do we cancel all festivities? Do we sit on the floor and recite Kinot. like we do on Tisha B'Av? Do we proceed as if nothing has happened? Do we double down on our singing and dancing specifically on this Simchat Torah as a response to those who seek to annihilate the Jewish People? In looking back, I am proud of the way we celebrated Simchat Torah with joy, meaning, unity and purpose.

As we approach Purim 5784 we are confronted with similar questions. The war is Gaza is ongoing. IDF soldiers continue to lose their lives in defense of the Jewish State and the Jewish People. The shock and trauma of October 7th remains. Just this week the IDF announced that Sgt. Itay Chen, age 19 and an American citizen, had been killed on October 7th and his remains are currently being held hostage in Gaza. Klal Yisrael remains in a moment of crisis and distress, an Eit *Tzarah*. It's impossible that such a moment would not impact and influence our Purim celebrations- the question is: how? Here are a few suggestions that have been made by some Rabbinic leaders, in Israel and America, to whom I turn for advice:

> Simcha is appropriate on Purimeven this year. One of Haman's- and Hamas'goals is to eradicate Jews and the Jewish holidays. We demonstrate our victory over

Haman by continuing to celebrate as an expression of Jewish pride and faith in Hashem. This is especially true for our children. Kids look forward to Purim and it is an opportunity to instill in them a sense of Simcha Shel Mitzvah ie joyful Jewish living. Our children's experience of Purim should be as joyful as ever, and adults are encouraged to demonstrate this type of joy as well, including through singing and dancing in honor of Purim.

- Holelut, frivolity, is never appropriate on Purim - and should avoided especially this year. Some examples of holelut include: excessive drinking, excessive costumes for adults, and general silliness.
- On Purim we should daven for our brothers and sisters in Israel and around the world who find ourselves in a precarious situation. On Saturday Night, each Megillah reading will be prefaced by the recitation of Tehillim, and we will recite the prayers for IDF and the hostages at each morning minyan on Puriim Day. We should also incorporate Tehillm and tefillot for Israel into our Purim Seudah and throughout our Purim day activities. The added rele-
- vance of Taanit Esther this year. In the Purim story, Esther demanded that the Jewish People gather together in a spirit of unity and engage in Teshuva, Tefilah and

Tzedaka (repentance, prayer and charity) in order to merit salvation. We should utilize Taanit Esther this year as an opportunity to focus on these responses to our modern Eit Tzarah.

Give expression to the feeling of Achdut. We have seen incredible expressions of Jewish Unity since October 7th. Some ways to incorporate this unity into our Purim celebrations are to emphasize inclusion by sending Mishloach Manot or inviting to Purim Seudah people in our community whom you might not normally include. We can also be more inclusive of Israel in our Purim celebrations by sending Mishloach Manot to friends or strangers in Israel or by purchasing Israeli products for your Mishloach Manot and Purim Seudah.

With a little planning and some intention we can celebrate Purim in a meaningful and joyous way that is appropriate for this moment and will, with God's help, enable us to experience "relief and salvation" (Revach V'Hatzalah) in our days, just as the Jews of Persia experienced in the Purim story.
