

1. Kadesh – Blessing the 1st Cup of Grape Juice

2. Urchatz: Washing of the Hands

3. Karpas – Dip a Vegetable in Salt Water

*Don't forget to have the maror in mind when you make this blessing!



Why do we dip the vegetable in salt water?
Because salt water is salty, like tears, and we remember the tears that our ancestors cried in Egypt when they were slaves.

4. Yachatz – Break the Middle Matzah

There are three matzahs. 1...2...3


Break the middle one and put a piece in a bag- this will be the “Afikoman”. This will be your dessert later on!

5. Maggid: The Telling of the Passover Story

Ma Nishtana – The Four Questions

There are so many different things that happen on Seder night, here are 4 questions to ask!



Why is this night different from all other nights?

1. On all other nights we eat both leavened and unleavened bread; why on this night do we eat only unleavened bread?

2. On all other nights we may eat all kinds of herbs; why on this night do we eat especially bitter herbs?

3. On all other nights we do not usually dip our food in anything at all; why on this night do we dip food twice?

4. On all other nights we eat either simply or in festivity; why on this night do we celebrate with such special festivity?



And here is the answer:




Rabbi Gamliel reminds us that we have to discuss the three symbols of Passover as part of the Seder. What are they?

1. Pesach The Passover sacrifice represented by the shank bone (or our toasted coconut marshmallow). The Pesach sacrifice reminds us that God passed over the Israelite houses when the tenth plague was visited upon the Egyptians after the Israelites offered the Passover sacrifice.

2. Matzah The unleavened bread. The matzah represents the hurried Exodus from Egypt wherein the Israelites left so quickly that their dough did not have time to rise.

3. Maror The bitter herbs. The maror reminds us of the bitter pain and suffering the Israelites went through as slaves to the Egyptians.



After all this story telling, it is now time for the 2nd cup of grape juice.



6. Rachtzah – Ritual Handwashing


We pour water from a cup 2-3 times over each hand and this time we get to recite the blessing!



But shhhh..... we don't want to talk before we make the Hamotzi Beracha and eat some matzah!

7. Motzi Matzah

Hold up the matzahs and make two blessings.



8. Maror

We say the blessing and then eat some maror (usually lettuce)!

9. Korech

It's time to eat a sandwich of *matzah*, *maror* and *haroset*. This is done because the great sage Hillel, who lived in the time of the Second Temple, used to eat the Passover sacrifice together with *matzah* and *maror* in a sandwich.



10. Shulchan Orech – The Seder Meal!

Let's take a break and enjoy some good food and great company!



11. Tzafun – Dessert!

You can play Hide and Seek with the Afikoman!

12. Barech: Grace After Meals



After Birkat Hamazon, we drink the **3rd cup** of grape juice.

And we pour a cup for Eliyahu! Do you think he will come and drink it? Song:

Eliyahu Hagiladi, Bimheirah Yavo*

Eileinu Im Mashiach Ben David.



13. Hallel – Songs of Praise

At this point of the seder, we really want to praise and thank G-d for everything.
