ברוך אתה בבאך וברוך אתה בצאתך -
"Blessed you should be in your coming and blessed
should you be when you depart."

The above blessing from this week's parsha is quite easy to understand on a superficial level. When traveling, whether coming or going, the hope is that we remain safe on our journey out as well as on the return home. However, Rashi, the classical commentary on the chumash, brings an explanation from the Talmud which adds a much broader and deeper application than one's simple adventures to and from.

שתהא יציאתך מן העולם בלא חטא כביאתך לעולם -
"May your departure from the world be as free of sin as
was your entry into the world."

Our goal in life is not merely to remain safe in our travels, but to remember that we come into this world with a pure soul, a white slate, and our hope is to strive to maintain that purity as we go through our days. As we face challenges, the blessing that the Torah shares is that we should not be swayed by the temptations that surround us, but rise above them and in so doing elevate those around us as well.

As we reach the end of the Jewish year, let's look towards the new one, replete with potential, in essence a white slate, to merit seeing the blessings of this week's Torah portion become a reality for each of us as individuals as well as for the Jewish people on a whole!
