Rabbi's Message

You Tube WEB DVAR with Rabbi Zwickler—CHECK IT OUT!

Rashi tells us that it was the day after Yom Kippur, when Moshe descended from Har Sinai and gathered all of the people together to instruct them in detail about the construction of the Mishkan. The first thing Moshe said however was that the day of Shabbos is holy and should not be violated even for the building of the Mishkan. Why did Moshe need to give such an instruction and reminder? Was it not obvious to the people that Hashem had placed the observance of Shabbos as the fourth of the Aseres Hadibros that Moshe had descended from the mountain holding the tablets in his hands? Rashi answers that the people needed to understand that even though the construction of the Mishkan was of greatest importance, it did not supercede the observance of Shabbos. Perhaps we can elaborate on Rashi's suggestion through a reflection of human nature. When we become passionate about a task, many of us become so determined to accomplish the task that we do not let anything derail us from succeeding. As such, we may end up lacking clarity in other aspects of our lives because we are fixated on our goal. Perhaps Hashem was concerned that since the people wanted desperately to show Hashem that they were serious about his commandments, after the debacle of the Chet Haegel, that they took on the building of the Mishkan with such passion that He was concerned that they would lack the clarity of vision to stop building on Shabbos.

Lashon Corner

There are instances where one may listen to rechilus although the information is not at all pertinent to him.

When an individual is experiencing sadness or extreme anxiety and is in need of someone with whom to share his frustration, it is considered an act of kindness to lend a sympathetic ear and listen to his troubles. One must be certain, though, that the circumstances do, in fact, demand this. Also, such expression should not become a regular occurrence for the speaker. Finally, care must be taken that the speaker not wander from the matter at hand and offer negative remarks which are not relevant.

One may also listen to rechilus if his intention is to make the speaker understand that his perception of the situation, and of those of whom he speaks negatively, is mistaken. (Sefer Chofetz Chayim)
