## Rabbi's Message

**You Tube** WEB DVAR with Rabbi Zwickler—CHECK IT OUT!

During the three weeks between Shiva Asar B'tamuz and Tisha B'av we read three Haftorahs that focus on the destruction that befell our people culminating in the churban of the Batei Mikdash. What message are we able to glean from these Haftorah's aside from sadness and mourning? Rabbi Tzadok Hakohein of Lublin zt"l suggests that a lesson can be learned from the first word of each Haftorah. This week's Haftorah begins with the word "Divrei" (these are the words). Next week's Haftorah begins with the word "Shimu"(listen). The third Haftorah begins with the word "Chazon"(observe, see). Chazal teach us that our mission during these three weeks is to focus, identify, and correct the mistake of ours and previous generations in regard to the root of destruction. While the first Beis Hamikdash was destroyed because of various sins, the second Beis Hamikdash was destroyed because of the baseless hatred that existed among our people at that time. Sadly, hatred still exists today, and we are challenged to counter its existence by focusing on loving our fellow Jews for no other reason than their genealogical connection to us. As we read the Haftorah each week, let's focus on how we may have used our speech, hearing, and sight to observe the negative traits in others. By doing so we will hopefully be able to correct our mistake by using the very same senses to observe positive traits in others, and solidify our love for them. Good Shabbos!

**Lashon Corner:** A nickname can be a benign, friendly name that causes the person no pain, in which case the nickname is not considered ona'as devarim. However, if he or she does not like the name, (for instance, there may be a man named Shimon who does not want to be called Shimmy), the Sages (Taanis 20b with Tosafos) teach that a person should not call him by that name. Simply because the person does not want to identify him or herself with that nickname, it causes pain to hear it. The pain might be minimal, but it is unnecessary, preventable and therefore prohibited. Certainly, a nickname that does have negative connotations is prohibited. The damage done by such a name can be far reaching, as it can become a self-fulfilling prophecy. (Positive Word Power)
