Rabbi's Message

You Tube WEB DVAR with Rabbi Zwickler—CHECK IT OUT!

Shabbos Hagadol earned its name from the miracle that took place on this Shabbos, immediately before the Jewish people left Mitzrayim. The Midrash tells us that when the Jewish people tied a sheep to their bedpost on the tenth of Nissan, that year, as commanded by Hashem, the day they did so was on Shabbos. The sheep remained tied to the bedpost until the 14th of the month when it was slaughtered as the Korban Pesach. The sheep was considered the God of the Egyptians, therefore the fact that the Egyptians were powerless to stop the Bnei Yisrael from tying their "god" to the bedpost was a miracle. The Beis Yosef asks why the miracle is commemorated on the first day, Shabbos, if it was a miracle that lasted until Thursday of that week? He answers that the miracle was the reaction or lack thereof of the Mitzrim immediately when the act occurred. Once the first day went by and they could not do anything to stop the Bnei Yisrael, the Egyptians became accustomed to the new reality, and were not bothered as much. How often in our lives do we find ourselves desensitized to that which should bother us, and annoyed by petty things that should not bother us. Good Shabbos!

I try to pause regularly and marvel at the extraordinary times in which we live. Hashem has blessed our generation in many ways, we are fortunate to be living in a time of history where we are the beneficiaries of His kindness in many areas. One of these areas is the advancement of science and medicine, where Hashem has opened the door and allowed us to glance at His handiwork. He has gifted us with the ability to prevent disease. The recent Measles outbreak in NY and NJ is very concerning to us all. Many leading Rabbis have stated unequivocally that not vaccinating one's child is in violation of halacha as it puts the child's life as well as the lives of other children in danger. As such, Shul leadership has decided that in order to ensure the safety and comfort of our membership and visitors, those children and adults who are not vaccinated may not enter our Shul building at any time. This includes the Shul playground. May we continue to benefit from Hashem's benevolence and remain a healthy community. - Rabbi Eliezer Zwickler

LASHON CORNER

How does one approach rebuking another? An elongated lecture or angry tongue-lashing can be more painful than a physical blow. Nevertheless, sometimes a strong rebuke is in order. Where does rebuke end and ona'as devarim begin? The elements that separate the two include many concepts already discussed, such as the true emotion behind the words: Are they coming from a loving desire to help someone improve, or anger and frustration; and the choice of words: Do they show respect for the other person's dignity? Another key factor people often do not consider is the length of the rebuke. How much needs to be said to get the point across? If a simple sentence like, "I am very disappointed by what you did," will have the desired impact, then anything more than that is ona'as devarim. Additional words simply compound the other person's pain and embarrassment at having done wrong, and perhaps even anger him to the point where he rebels rather than reforms. All one is required to accomplish with reproach is to awaken the other person to his or her mistake and try to elicit a commitment to improve. If one does not stop to take a breath and let the other party speak, he or she will not even be able to ascertain if he or she is accomplishing these goals.
