Rabbi's Message

You Tube WEB DVAR with Rabbi Zwickler—CHECK IT OUT!

The story is told that one year in the early twentieth century a visitor to the city of Vilna ended up stuck in the city for the first days of the Yom Tov of Succos. He was welcomed and housed by the great sage Rav Chaim Ozer Grodzinski zt"l. As Yom Tov arrived Rav Chaim Ozer welcomed his guest into the Succah to eat the first meal but stopped short of actually entering the Succah. Rav Chaim informed his guest that he had not been feeling well, and was therefore exempt from the mitzvah of Succah since he was "mitztaer". The guest of course understood, and wished the Rav a refuah sheleimah, but to his surprise within a few moments, Rav Chaim Ozer entered the Succah and joined his guest at the table. When the guest asked the Rav why he came in to the Succah if he was sick, the Rav responded that while he was exempt from the mitzvah of Succah he was not exempt from the mitzvah of hachnasas orchim (welcoming guests). As we welcome our guests to the Succah and to our Shul over this wonderful chag, let us be on the alert to try and make sure that our guests feel welcome, and that their presence enhances our simchas ha-chag.

LASHON CORNER

When physical danger is present, people know what to do. Act quickly. Save yourself and others. However, when the danger is spiritual, many people have a far more difficult time defending themselves. They worry about appearing overzealous or being rejected. Therefore, damaging situations often go unchecked. This is true with ona'as devarim. Even among those who adhere to Torah and mitzvos, the tenor of normal discourse can be brusque or outright insulting. Often, insulting comments come in the guise of a joke; in some circles, this comprises the entire definition of humor. It can be extremely difficult for one person, who wishes to raise the standard of speech, to turn the situation around. A well-known technique for encouraging change in others is the "I" message. When a person does not attack the other with a "you" accusation, but simply explains how "I" feel about something, the other person is often more receptive to the message: "I feel so bad when I hear harsh words between you and your brother." Negative words are a strong toxin, but sometimes, the cleanup is surprisingly simple. There's nothing to lose by trying. (Positive Word Power)
