RABBI'S MESSAGE

Sefiras Haomer, the counting of the Omer,, begins on the second night of Pesach. This is derived from the words ממחרת השבת as mentioned in our Parsha. The Gemara in Menachos explains that the word Shabbos in the pasuk really means Yom Tov. Chazal conclude that the Omer is cut and the count begins on the night after the first day of Yom Tov. Why did the Torah not explicitly say חסם as opposed to ממחרת השבת? The Gelilei Zahav suggests that the sanctity of Shabbos is directly from Hashem. Shabbos was infused with sanctity when Hashem rested after creation. The sanctity of Yom Tov however, was placed in the hands of the Jewish people by Hashem, via the sanctification of the new moon each month by the Beis Din. Pesach however, obtained the same sanctity as Shabbos in this regard since it was given to Bnei Yisrael while still in Egypt through Hashem directly, without the need for the Beis Din. The pasuk therefore refers to Pesach as Shabbos. May we cherish Shabbos as a gift from Hashem to us each week. Good Shabbos!
