RABBI'S MESSAGE

Chazal teach us that the period of Sefiras Haomer is considered to be the intermediate period, the Chol Hamoed that links the holiday of Pesach with Shavuos. Why is this connection between these chagim necessary? Rav Herschel Schachter shlit" a in his sefer "Mipninei Harav" explains that the essence of Pesach is for us to leave slavery and to become free. The Talmud teaches us that one is considered to be a free person only if they learn Torah. Hashem's purpose in taking the Jewish people out of Mitzrayim was to give them the Torah on Har Sinai. If we do not learn Torah then we are still considered to be slaves in Mitzrayim. Moshe is told by Hashem that the sign that He has sent him is that when the nation leaves Egypt they would worship Hashem at Har Sinai. There would be no point to leaving Mitzrayim if we never received the Torah at Har Sinai. The message of Shavuos is to re engage with Torah, thereby expressing our freedom that we obtained on Pesach. On a deeper level it is important for us to recognize that throughout the year we often become enslaved to many distractions that prevent us from making Torah learning part of our daily routine. Shavuos is the time to start our commitment to Torah learning anew. Please commit to learning on Shavuos at night, in the afternoons in shul, throughout the chag and during the year. We have numerous opportunities to join a Torah class in the shul and beyond. May this Shavuos reconnect us with the experience of our ancestors and the gift that they received at Har Sinai. Good Yom Tov and Good Shabbos!
