

Mishmash Parent Child Learning - 2/1 Parshat Bo - Mature Learners

1. Why did Hashem “harden Pharaoh’s heart” and cause Pharaoh to not listen to Moshe’s request to let Bnei Yisrael leave Egypt? What was Hashem’s purpose? (10:1-2)
2. What are the last three makot (plagues) that Hashem brings to the Egyptians in this parsha?

BONUS: Can you list all 10 makot in order?

3. Hashem tells Moshe that “this month” will be the first of all the months in the calendar. Which month is Hashem referring to? (12:2)
4. What did Moshe tell the people to take on the 10th day of the month? (12:3)
5. If your family was small and you could not finish the lamb, what did Moshe tell the people to do? (12:4)
6. What were the people instructed to do on the 14th day of the month? (12:6-7)
7. How were the people instructed to cook the lamb and how were they told to eat it? (12:8-11).
8. Why did the people need to put the blood of the lamb on their doorposts? (12:13)
9. Why does the Torah say several times that we must celebrate the holiday of Pesach “for generations”? Why is it SO important? (12:14-17)
10. What happens to someone who eats chametz on Pesach? (12:15)
11. What did Bnei Yisrael take with them when they left Egypt? (12:34-36)

12. How many people left Egypt? (12:37)

13. How many years did Bnei Yisrael spend in Egypt? (12:40)

14. Moshe repeats all of Hashem's instructions to the people at the end of this parsha. Besides eating matzah for seven days he tells the people that they must "tell your child" the story(13:8). When do we do this each year?

15. Moshe tells the people that the words should be a "sign on your hand, and a reminder between your eyes" (13:9). How do we do this today?

BONUS: What tefilah do we all say every day to remember this story and leaving Egypt?
