NOT BY MIGHT, NOT BY POWER

The only thing I remember from my Bat Mitzvah--other than feeling incredibly self-conscious--is a line from my haftarah, which is read on Chanukah: "Not by might, not by power, but by My spirit--said the Lord of Hosts." Zechariah 4:6.

I don't remember the line's context, yet these words have stayed with me throughout my life

as a soothing whisper, reminding me that things are in G-d's control--not in anyone else's control, no matter how mighty some may seem. And, not in my control, no matter how hard I may fight to make it so.

This does not mean that we sit back and wait for the world to happen to us. Quite the opposite. We are G-d's partners, and we each need to do our part to manifest G-d's goodness here on

The relationship between G-d's power and human action is a big part of Jewish belief. Yet it is often extremely hard to feel this in the present tense, as we walk through our lives wondering which way to go, what not to say, who to be near.

G-d's involvement sometimes can only be seen after we pick up the pieces; only then are we shown the strength of G-d along our

The Chanukah story of the few overcoming the many, of the tiny amount of oil bringing such overpowering light, of the unexpected re-dedication of our Temple...the impossible becomes possible, with G-d's help.

Every year I am reminded of the great faith that was needed to take that first Chanukah step. To light the small amount of oil, knowing it would not be enough, yet lighting it anyway. Our human actions opening a crack in the door for G-d's miracle to shine through.



Chanukah was always my favorite holiday as a child. The excitement of eight nights of presents, each gift wrapped with a number taped to it by my aunt to let me know on which night it could be opened. Lighting the menorah with my parents, singing the prayers and songs against the backdrop of crisp dark nights at the beginnings of winter, are vivid

memories that remain with me to this day.

In college and then as a single adult in the Upper West Side Jewish community, I got used to spending Jewish holidays more with peers than with family. My memories of Chanukah during those years are of attending what felt like an infinite number of "singles" Chanukah parties, enjoying festive Chanukah Shabbat meals at my synagogue, and lighting candles alone in my apartment. My longings for latkes and miracles intermixed, as my journey continued.

In large part thanks to Rabbi Ephraim Buchwald and the Beginners Service, which I started attending during that time, I drew closer to Judaism and also became reacquainted with a classmate from college, who is now my husband.

As parents now, my husband and I see that it is not easy to convey the complex Chanukah story to our 2 and 1/2 year-old son. We start with the candles, increasing in number and glow night after night. We watch as an awareness of this mystery begins to take shape in his eyes, as he, my husband and I delight together in the light of the miracle. And we hope that, like ours, our son's experience of childhood Chanukah celebrations, as well as his Jewish life on a daily basis, will be filled with a feeling of warmth and wonder that will carry him through his life.
